Second batch of 50 declassified files relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose released Online



New Delhi, Mar 29
Second Set of 50 declassified files relating to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was released Online on Web Portal www.netajipapers.gov.in by Dr. Mahesh Sharma,

Minister of State (I/C) for Culture and Tourism here today. The present batch of 50 files consists of 10 files from the Prime Minister's Office (PMO), 10 files from Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA), and

30 files from Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) pertaining to the period 1956 to 2009. It may be recalled that First lot of 100 files relating to Netaji, after their preliminary conservation treatment and digitization, was put in the public domain by the Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi

on 23 January 2016, on the occasion of the 119th birth anniversary of Netaji. The present release of 50 files will further meet the continued public demand to access these files and this will also facilitate scholars to carry out further research on the doyen of the freedom movement.

LG to inaugurate Japanese language course in JNRM today

A basic course in Japanese language will be started in JNRM, Port Blair. The Lt. Governor, A&N Islands, Lt. The courses will be conducted on Fridays and Saturdays from 5.30 pm to 7.30 pm by Prof. Jayanta Kr. Mishra, HoD, Marine Biology, Pondicherry University, Campus, Brookshabad, Port Blair. Admission to the classes

is free and open to students as well as outsiders, subject to class room capacity. The duration of course will be three months, on completion of which, the learners will be equipped to take an on line certificate examination conducted by the Japanese Consulate.

112 to soon become single number for all emergency services

New Delhi, Mar 29
Department of Telecom and India is in process to adopt '112' as the national emergency number, with the inter-ministerial telecom commission giving a go-ahead to the move. Once effected, people will have to dial just a single number '112' for help during any type of emergency situations. The Telecom Commission has accepted Telecom Regulatory Authority TRAI's recommendation on a single number for various emergency services. It will now be drafted by the

Department of Telecom and will require the Telecom Minister's approval. All existing emergency numbers will be phased out within a year of rolling out 112, depending upon the awareness about this new facility. The move would be similar to the '911' all-in-one emergency service in the US. In India, different emergency communication and response systems are in place, like 100 for police, 101 for fire brigade, and 102 for ambulance among other numbers.

He was identified as Swapan Biswas, R/o Doctors Colony, Nayagaon, Ward No. 11, Shadipur, South Andaman and disclosed that the owner of CT Travel, Bhatu Basti had given him a group ticket booked in the name of Probash Mondal vide PNR No. SG-TF5V7R of 28-03-2016 in low fare and a fake ID proof of Aadhar Card to travel, impersonating as Probash Mondal.

Upon this a case, vide crime No. FIR No. 211/2016 U/S. 419/468/471/34 IPC has been registered at PS Aberdeen and the proprietor CT Travels, Bhatu Basti, Sita Ram Yadav, 28, R/o New Pahargaon was also arrested for making and altering fake Aadhar card. Both the accused persons were produced in the Hon'ble Court at Port Blair from where they have been sent to JC Remand. Further investigation of the case is continuing.

Kohli zooms to top in ICC T20 rankings, India also No.1

Dubai, Mar 29
Powered by his magnificent knocks in the World Twenty20 so far, Indian batsman Virat Kohli became the top-ranked batsman in the ICC rankings on Tuesday, while India remained static at the No.1 spot in the team list. Kohli, whose average is 92 after scoring 184 runs in four matches at a strike-rate of over 132, had entered the tournament 24 points behind Aaron Finch, but has now opened up a 68-point advantage over the Australian, the ICC said in a statement. In the bowlers' table, West Indies' Samuel Badree has displaced Indian off-spinner Ravichandran Ashwin to return to the number-one position. Badree has taken six wickets in four matches to date, while Ashwin has dropped to third after managing just four wickets in as many matches. Four of the top five sides will feature in the semi-finals of the ICC World Twenty20, which will be played in Delhi and Mumbai on Wednesday and Thursday, respectively.



Number-one ranked India will go head to head with third-ranked West Indies in Mumbai on Thursday, while in the first semi-final in Delhi on Wednesday, second-ranked New Zealand will square-off against fifth-ranked England. India has retained their pre-tournament ranking as well as points, while the West Indies have gained two points to move to 120. This means both the former champions, who each won three

Manish Pandey called up as standby for injured Yuvraj

Mumbai, Mar 29
Manish Pandey has been added to the Indian squad as cover for the injured Yuvraj Singh ahead of the 2016 ICC World Twenty20 semifinal clash against West Indies. The 34-year-old left-hander hurt his ankle on Sunday during India's win over Australia and might not get fit in time for the next clash. Yuvraj went for an MRI scan in Mumbai and the team management is anxiously waiting for the results. Pandey's addition is just a precautionary measure and he will be replacing the left-hander in the 15-member squad only if Yuvraj is ruled out for the rest of the tournament. India did something similar earlier by drafting in

Simmons included in West Indies World Twenty20 squad

New Delhi, Mar 29
Lendl Simmons will replace Andre Fletcher, who injured his hamstring in the last Super 10 clash against Afghanistan, it was announced on Tuesday (March 29). Phillip Spooner, the West Indies media manager, confirmed that the team has asked the International Cricket Council to replace Fletcher with Simmons in the 15-member squad. Simmons was earlier ruled out of the tournament because of his back injury but has recovered well since then. He was replaced by Evin Lewis, who made his T20 debut against Afghanistan in Nagpur.

Azlan Shah Cup will be a good preparation for Rio: Oltmans

New Delhi, Mar 29
With their eyes firmly focussed on 2016 Olympics, Indian men hockey team's chief coach Roelant Oltmans feels the upcoming Sultan Azlan Shah Cup will be an ideal preparation for team ahead of the Rio Games. The team, currently training at the SAI Centre in Bengaluru, will face New Zealand, Australia, Pakistan, Japan, Canada and hosts Malaysia in the 25th edition of the Azlan Shah Cup to be held in Ipoh, Malaysia starting on April 6. With a good mix of youth and experience players up his ranks, the Dutchman feels the squad has what it takes to go all the way. Oltmans has been laying emphasis on having specialists in the team and the implementation of the same has paid rich dividends in the previous season. "We have specialists in each department now and that is helping the boys understand their role better. Hockey India League has definitely helped us tap some good talent but now it's all about



showcasing their mettle in the international stage," Oltmans told reporters here. India has had a good run in the Sultan Azlan Shah Cup, winning the annual event five times in 1985, 1991, 1995, 2009 and 2010, earning bronze on six occasions and finishing runners-up once in 2008. Children in Yemen bearing brunt of brutal war: UNICEF

New York, Mar 29
Hundreds of thousands of children in Yemen face life-threatening malnutrition and millions lack access to health care or clean water due to the year-old war there, the U.N. Children's Fund said today. The report "Childhood on the Brink" said, on average, at least six children have been killed or injured every day. UNICEF has confirmed 934 children directly killed and 1,356 injured, but says they are only a tip of the iceberg. Nearly half of Yemen's 22 provinces are on the verge of famine and over 13 million people need food aid, the U.N.'s World Food Programme said.
