25 declassified files related to Netaji released

New Delhi, Apr 29
Government today released third set of 25 files related to Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in New Delhi today. Culture Minister Dr Mahesh Sharma released the files at a programme in the National Archives. Speaking on the occasion, Dr Sharma said, Government will build a magnificent memorial in the honour of Netaji in the National Capital. He also said, the release of these files will further meet the continued public demand to access these files and this will also facilitate scholars to carry out further research on the doyen of the freedom movement.
First lot of 100 files relating to Netaji was put in the public domain by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on 23rd January this year on the 119th birth anniversary of Netaji. Last month, Dr Sharma had released 50 files.



In October last year, Shri Modi had met the family members of Netaji and announced that the government will declassify the files relating to the leader whose disappearance 70 years ago remains a mystery.
While two commissions of inquiry had concluded that Netaji had died in a plane crash in Taipei on August, 1945, a third probe panel, headed by Justice MK Mukherjee, had contested it and suggested that Bose was alive.

India, Papua New Guinea sign four agreements

Port Moresby, Apr 29
Giving a major boost to the bilateral relations between the two countries, India and Papua New Guinea today signed four MoUs in myriad sectors at capital Port Moresby.
The MoUs were signed in the presence of the visiting President Shri Pranab Mukherjee and the Papua New Guinea Prime Minister Mr Peter O'Neil. The MoUs relate to Agriculture, Health, Information Technology and Infrastructure. Under the first MoU, India will provide a Line of Credit of 100 million dollars for specific projects in

Transport and infrastructure sectors. The MoU on Health covers areas such as Public Health, Health Research, Human Resources and Training, Medical Services, Disease Control and Prevention, Drug and Health Care Technologies and Environmental Health. Yet another MoU envisages establishment of a Centre of Excellence in Information Technology in Papua New Guinea. The Fourth MoU delineates all round cooperation in agricultural research.

Govt raises EPF interest rate to 8.8% from 8.7%

New Delhi, Apr 29
The government today raised the interest rate on employees provident fund (EPF) contributions to 8.8 per cent for 2015-16 against 8.7 per cent approved by the Finance Ministry last week. Labour Minister Shri Bandaru Dattatreya announced the decision to raise interest rate.

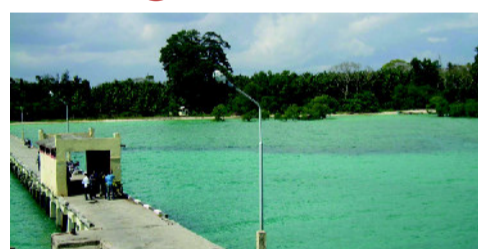

Neil jetty to be expanded to facilitate easy maneuvering of Inter Island vessels

Construction of additional approach, extension of berthing area and dredging in front of jetty at Neil Island will be taken up soon. This is being done to facilitate easy maneuvering of Inter Island vessels. Neil Islands is an upcoming and preferred tourist destination after the Havelock Island and the new jetty extension work will facilitate speedier implementation of various developmental schemes, generate employment and meet increased demands of tourism.

The fund amounting of Rs. 38.19 crore for the project has been provided by Ministry of Shipping under Central sector Plan Scheme and the project will be executed by the Andaman Lakshadweep Harbour Works (ALHW), its sources informed. The Daily Telegrams' here. The period of completion of project is



24 months from the date of commencement of the work, for which e-tendering process as well as obtaining environment clearance are in progress, sources added.

The project envisages components such as solid approach - 4.00X5.50 mtr, approach Jetty - 276 X 5.50 mtr, widening of existing berth - 40 X 5.50 mtr, extension of berthing jetty - 50.50 X 15.00 mtr and dredging- 38593 cum.

Anurag Thakur presents private member bill on sports in Lok Sabha, seeks to eliminate doping practices, match fixing

New Delhi, Apr 29
Bhartiya Janata Party MP Shri Anurag Thakur on Thursday introduced a private member bill in Lok Sabha proposing to shift sports from State list to Concurrent list. Shri Thakur, who is also the Secretary of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) introduced 3 Pvt Members Bills in Lok Sabha today: 1) National Sports Ethics Commission Bill, 2) Const. Amend. Bill (Amd. of article 72) 1/2. He said that bill proposes to set up a Central body to ensure ethical practices and fair play in sports including elimination of doping practices, match fixing, fraud of age



and sexual harassment of women in sports. He is seeking a coordinated and more focused approach towards sports. National Sports Ethics

Commission Bill proposes to set up a Central body to ensure ethical practices & fair play in sports. It's pertinent to mention that India, still an unknown entity in Olympics sports, has emerged as the third highest Anti-Doping Rule Violations (ADRVs) country in 2014. According to a report released by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) on Wednesday, there were as many as 96 cases of doping by Indian sportspersons in the year. Besides, sports governance in the country is facing issues with various bodies going through internal fighting. Cricket — most popular sports in India — is also going through a period of reforms following spate of match-fixing claims, which needed intervention from the Supreme Court.

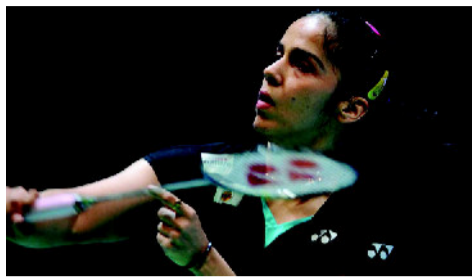

New Delhi, Apr 29
Serena Williams has withdrawn from the Madrid Open because of flu, the organisers said on Friday. "Unfortunately, I have to withdraw from Madrid because I've been battling the flu and I'm not at 100 percent. I look forward to returning soon," Williams said in a statement. Agnieszka Radwanska takes over as top seed for the tournament, which starts on Saturday, while Williams is now due to start her clay-court season in Rome. The 34-year-old world number one has only played four tournaments since August, failing to win any of them. She lost in the US Open semi-finals in September, before defeats this year in the Australian Open and Indian Wells finals and a round-four loss in Miami.

Asia Badminton Championship: Saina Nehwal enters semis, plays Wang Yihan of China



New Delhi, Apr 29
Indian badminton ace Saina Nehwal entered the semi-final of Asia Badminton Championship with a straight game win over Wang Shixian in Wuhan on Thursday. Seeded fifth in the tournament, Indian shuttler produced a controlled performance of aggression and caution to beat former World Champion Wang of China 21-16 21-19. In the semis, the 26-year-old Indian will play another Chinese, Wang Yihan, who defeated Japan's Nozomi Okuhara in three games later in the day. The sixth seeded Chinese girl won 8-21, 21-13, 21-19. Saina has a 9-4 career head-to-head lead over her semi-final opponent. Saina, who lost the Shixian in the last two meetings at Australia Open and Indonesia Open, started well to take a 3-0 lead. Then, from a close fight towards close of the

game, Saina won four straight points to win the first game 21-16. The second game followed the same script as Saina gained a 3-0 lead. But her Chinese opponent posed greater threat, and at one point, the score are 19-19. But Saina hold her nerves to complete a straight game win over the third seeded player.

Railway Protection Force (RPF) dealt with nearly 20 lakh cases relating to anti-social elements last year. The Railway Ministry said in a release that to strengthen passenger security, 22 commando companies of RPF are being raised over all the zonal railways. It said, modern weapons like AK-47 rifles and 9mm Pistol have been inducted in RPF.
