ANIPMT-2016 to be conducted for selection of students

Port Blair, May 29
 In a short span of an year, ANIMS has crossed yet another milestone, when MCI accorded renewal of permission for admission of 2nd batch of 100 students for the academic year 2016-2017. This was communicated to the Director, ANIMS through a letter from the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India dated May 25, 2016. This is a big achievement and has been possible as a result of whole hearted encouragement by the Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of A & N Islands, Lt. General

Ajay Kumar Singh, PVSM, AVSM, SM & VSM (Retd.), full cooperation of the A & N Administration, blessings of the residents of A & N Islands and hard work of the Consultant, Director and all the staff of ANIMS and GB Pant Hospital, Port Blair. It may be recalled that a team of MCI inspectors comprising of Dr. Parthapratim Pradhan, Dr. Hansa Goswami, and Dr. Sankardar Chattopadhyay had inspected the College on 21st April 2016 and submitted their report to MCI. During their visit, they had verbally complimented the facilities

available at the college and even rated them better than most of the established colleges of the country. A meeting was conducted at MCI, HQ, New Delhi, which then submitted a positive recommendation to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. Decks have also been cleared on 24th May 2016 for exempting State Govt. Medical Colleges from the Supreme Court mandated single All India entrance exam (NEET) for an year with President Pranab Mukherjee giving his assent to the NEET

ordinance. ANIMS in consultation with A&N Administration has therefore decided to go ahead with ANIPMT-2016 as the entrance exam for selection of candidates to 1st year MBBS-2016-17 at ANIMS, as was done for its very first batch. The entrance exam, ANIPMT-2016 will be conducted as per the schedule given in the prospectus. However, certain changes have been made in the date line to permit students to fill up the forms & submit the same so as to be able to write

Commendable pass percentage in Class X CBSE examination

Port Blair, May 29
 The results of CBSE Secondary School Examination 2016 (Class-X) have been announced on 28th May, 2016. As per the official website of CBSE, out of 5890 students who appeared in Class-X from 106 Schools of Govt./Govt. Aided and Un-Aided in A & N Islands, 5761 students have QUALIFIED and 129 students have been placed

in EIOP (Eligible for Improvement of Performance). There is a huge jump in the overall pass percentage of A & N Islands from 84.29% last year to 97.81% this year. Similarly there is vast improvement in the overall pass percentage of Administration schools from 79.53% last year to 97.31% this year. A total of 107 students

have been awarded with 10.0 CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) as compared to 29 students last year. 79 Schools have 100% results of which 63 schools are Administration Schools. The overall pass percentage of A&N Islands is more than All India CBSE Pass percentage which is 96.21%.

The Principal Secretary (Education) & Secretary (Education), A&N Administration have congratulated the students and their parents, Heads of Institutions and Teachers for the meritorious achievements. 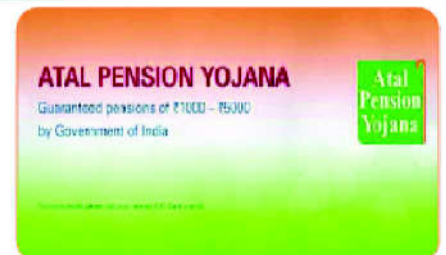

Indian discus thrower Seema Punia qualifies for 2016 Rio Olympics

New Delhi: Asian Games discus throw gold medal winner Seema Punia on Sunday qualified for the Rio Olympics with a 62.62m effort at the Pat Young's Throwers Classic 2016 at Salinas (California) in the United States.

The 32-year-old Seema crossed the Rio Games qualification standard of 61.00m at the Hartnell College Throwers Complex with her season's best effort of 62.62m. She won the gold in the event and in the process topped 2008 Olympic discus throw champion Stephanie Brown-Trafton of United States of America for the gold.

This will be Seema's third Olympic Games appearance having taken part in 2004 and 2012 where she failed to get past the qualification round on both the occasions. She is the 19th Indian track and field athlete to have qualified for Rio Olympics.



Seema, now training in the United States with funds provided by the Sports Ministry under the Target Olympic Podium Scheme, had won a gold in the 2014 Asian Games in Guangzhou, China with a throw of 61.03m. She had also won a silver in the 2014 Glasgow CWG Commonwealth Games with an effort of 61.61m. The Haryana-based athlete has a personal best of 64.84m which she did way back in 2004. She had also won a silver in 2006 Melbourne Commonwealth Games and a bronze in the 2010 Delhi CWG.

Saina Nehwal Hopes to Clinch First Title of Season at Indonesia Open

Jakarta, May 29 Saina Nehwal will continue her quest for a maiden title this season to boost her confidence ahead of the 2016 Rio Olympics when she begins her campaign at the USD 900,000 Indonesia Open Super Series Premier starting with the qualifiers on Monday. After missing a few tournaments due to a nagging ankle injury, Saina recovered well to notch a consistent run of form, reaching the semifinals in a slew of events, including the India Open, Malaysia Open and Asian Championship.

En route to Indian women's team's bronze medal winning feat at the Uber Cup, Saina won all the matches in the league stage but lost to Thailand's

Ratchanok Intanon and China's Li Xuerui in the knockouts. Saina, who had won the Indonesia Open title in 2009, 2010 and 2012, will hope to come up with a better show against the top shuttlers and grab her fourth crown when she opens her campaign against Chinese Taipei's Pai Yu Po on Tuesday.

However, P.V Sindhu, has decided to give the tournament a miss as she will be recuperating after a hectic schedule last month.

In men's singles too, K Srikanth and Ajay Jayaram decided to skip the event, while P Kashyap is undergoing physiotherapy after being

operated for an injury. H.S Prannoy too will miss the event as he is still recovering from a toe injury.

In qualifiers, B Sai Praneeth and RMV Gurusaidutt too will miss out and national champion Sameer Verma will be the only Indian competing in men's singles after he was promoted to the main draw.

Rio-bound shuttlers, including 2010 Commonwealth Games gold medalist Jwala Gutta and Ashwini Ponnappa will be up against the Indonesian pair of Febriana Dwi Putri Kusuma and Ribka Sugianto, while Manu Attri and B Sumeeth Reddy will face Philippines' Peter Gabriel Magnay and Alvin Morada in men's doubles.

Real Madrid wins Champions League in penalty shootout

Milan, May 29 Cristiano Ronaldo did it again for Real Madrid, stepping forward to score a penalty and inflict another devastating loss in a Champions League final on rival Atletico Madrid.

For the second time in three finals, the biggest game in club soccer ended with Ronaldo sealing the victory. Ronaldo's decisive spot kick in the shootout gave Real Madrid a 5-3 victory on penalties, following a 1-1 draw after extra time in Saturday's final.

Two years ago, the Portuguese superstar's penalty

had sealed a 4-1 extra-time win over Atletico and prompted the first of his provocative celebrations.

"I knew I was going to score the winning penalty. I was confident," said Ronaldo, who won his third Champions League title. "I asked [coach Zinedine] Zidane to let me take the last penalty."

Rising to the dramatic moment after a quiet game for him, Ronaldo sent goalkeeper Jan Oblak the wrong way seconds after Atletico defender Juanfran had struck a post with his team's fourth kick.

Real Madrid got its record-extending 11th European title and left Atletico with a bitter third loss in the continent's biggest game. In its two previous finals, Atletico gave up last-minute equalising goals.

"I don't believe in injustices," Atletico coach Diego Simeone said in Spanish. "In football, the team that wins deserves to win. They were better during the shootout."

Simeone said he will consider his future at Atletico, where the combative Argentine has coached for five years.

Tennis: Muguruza into last eight at French Open

Paris, May 29 Garbine Muguruza of Spain blazed into the French Open quarter-finals for the third straight year on Sunday, defeating former champion Svetlana Kuznetsova 6-3, 6-4.

The 22-year-old Venezuelan-born fourth seed will next play the winner of the tie between Shelby Rogers of the United States and Irina-Camelia Begu of Romania for a place in the semi-finals.

"At the end it is always very tough. She is a player with a lot of experience and I just had to be there," she said.

Quarter-finals is a great run

and I am looking forward to improving my result here." Muguruza is seen as one of the new stars of the women's game after a breakthrough season in 2015 when she was runner-up to Serena Williams at Wimbledon and made the semis at the WTA Finals.

But in 30-year-old Kuznetsova she was up against one of the wildest and experienced players on the women's circuit with two Grand Slam titles to her name -- the 2004 US Open and the 2009 French Open.

Both players had early break points on a sparsely-filled Philippe Chatrier centre court in a match of high quality.

And it was the Spaniard who struck first in the eighth game powering in a fine backhand return past the Russian to move 5-3 up.

She then served out comfortably for the set in 46 minutes.

Muguruza kept up the pressure and broke Kuznetsova's serve twice at the start of the second set, although she dropped her own in between.

The Russian pulled back to level at 4-4, but it was Muguruza who rose to the occasion taking the next two games and clinching the win on her fifth match point.
