Cabinet approves recommendations of 7th Pay Commission

The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has approved the implementation of the recommendations of 7th Central Pay Commission (CPC) on pay and pensionary benefits. It will come into effect from 01.01.2016.

In the past, the employees had to wait for 19 months for the implementation of the Commission's recommendations at the time of 5th CPC, and for 32 months at the time of implementation of 6th CPC. However, this time, 7th CPC recommendations are being implemented within 6 months from the due date. The Cabinet has also decided that arrears of pay and pensionary benefits will be paid during the current financial year (2016-17) itself, unlike in the past when parts of arrears were paid in the next financial year. The recommendations will benefit over 1 crore employees. This includes over 47 lakh central government employees and 53 lakh pensioners, of which 14 lakh employees and 18 lakh pensioners are from the defence forces.



HIGHLIGHTS:

1. The present system of Pay Bands and Grade Pay has been dispensed with and a new Pay Matrix as recommended by the Commission has been approved. The status of the employee, hitherto determined by grade pay, will now be determined by the level in the Pay Matrix. Separate Pay Matrices have been drawn up for Civilians, Defence Personnel and for Military Nursing Service. The principle and rationale behind these matrices are the same.

Cabinet clears model law; malls, cinemas can stay open 24x7

New Delhi, June 29

The Union Cabinet today approved proposal for a model law that allows shops, malls and other establishments to operate 24x7 and throughout the year.

The proposed law covers establishments employing 10 or more workers except manufacturing units and will provide freedom to operate 365 days with flexibility on timing to open and close.

It also provides for women to be employed on night shifts with adequate security and calls for better working conditions for employees such as drinking water, canteen, first aid, lavatory and crèche.

"The Model Shops and Establishment (Regulation of Employment and



Condition of Services) Bill 2016 has been cleared by the Cabinet," a source said. The model law will not require Parliament's approval.

It will help in generating additional employment as shops and establishments

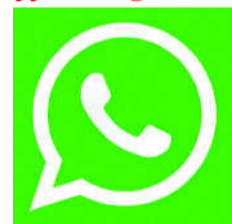

Supreme Court rejects petition seeking ban on Whatsapp messenger

New Delhi, June 29

The Supreme Court today dismissed a petition seeking a complete ban on online messaging platform WhatsApp. An RTI activist had filed a case in the Apex Court, seeking ban on Whatsapp and other messenger services, which have end to end encryption. 256 bit encryption means that government as well as Whatsapp itself would have no means of accessing these

messages. Citing this as a National Security concern the petitioner wanted the messaging platform to provide a key for the government.

The Secretary (Education) A & N Administration has conveyed the approval for re-engagement of Part time Pre-Primary Teachers (PPT), Part time Pre-Primary Ayah/ Safai Karamachari (PPA/SK), Part time Craft Instructors and part time Attendants for the current academic session 2016-17.

It has been approved by the Competent Authority that the PPTs, PPA/SKs, Part time CIs and Part time Attendants who worked during the session 2015-16 upto closure of the school for Summer Vacation 2016, may be re-engaged for this

current Academic Session 2016-17 with effect from July 1, 2016, in their respective schools to which they have worked during the last academic session 2015-16, subject to satisfactory performance of each Part time workers during the last academic session. Their salary will be released subject to renewal of temporary Plan Posts from the Administration.

In case of PPT & PPA, those who do not join for any reasons what so ever, the SMC of the respective school, who are empowered to recommend for appointment of PPT and PPA/SK, may like to

select and recommend names of fresh candidates of PPT or PPA/SK, after observing necessary formalities in terms of the guidelines issued by this Directorate of Education, Port Blair. Such proposals must be submitted to the Directorate of Education by 15th July, 2016.

All the Zonal Officers/DDOs/Head of Institutions have been directed to re-engage the Part time PPT, PPA, Part time Craft Instructors and Part time Attendants to their respective schools with effect from July 1, 2016, subject to their performance and send

Bolt gears up for Olympic trials

Jamaica, June 29
Usain Bolt will embark on the first major test of what he plans to be a triumphant swansong here Thursday as the Jamaican Olympic athletics trials get under way. With less than 40 days to go before the Olympics, the sprint superstar will aim to seal his ticket to Rio as he targets a defence of his 100 metres, 200m and 4x100m crowns. Bolt, who completed an unprecedented second consecutive set of victories in all three events at the London 2012 Games, is hoping to complete a remarkable "Triple Triple." So far this season, the signs have been encouraging that Bolt is firmly on track, with the 29-year-old clocking a blistering 9.88 seconds at a meeting in Kingston on June 11, the second-fastest time in the world this year. Only France's Jimmy Vicaut, who clocked a wind-assisted 9.86sec earlier in June, has run faster this season. Unlike the IAAF world



Championships, there are no byes to the Olympics and under the rules of the Jamaica Athletics Administrative Association (JAAA) rules every athlete seeking to be chosen for Rio Games must compete at the trials. Bolt's main challenge is likely to come from Yohan Blake and

Indian men's team register 2-1 victory over Ireland in six nations invitational Hockey tournament

Spain, June 29
In Hockey, Indian men's team registered a 2-1 victory over Ireland in the Six nations invitational tournament being held in Valencia, Spain. A valiant India rallied from a goal deficit to register a 2-1 win last evening. Ireland took the lead as early as in the fourth minute through Kyle Good's goal. India equalized the score in the 22nd minute with Talwinder Singh's goal from a rebound. Later in 32nd minute,



India took lead with skipper Sardar Singh's goal from a fine deflection. The win gave India their first success in the tournament after they had lost

India's Rajput wins silver in ISSF World Cup

New Delhi, June 29
Ace shooter Sanjeev Rajput clinched the silver medal for India in men's 50-metre rifle 3 position event of the ISSF World Cup in Baku, Azerbaijan. Rajput shot 456.9 to win the silver medal in the last World Cup before the Rio Olympic Games. Croatia's Petar Gorsa won the gold medal with 457.5, while Hyeonjun Kim of Korea bagged the bronze after he shot 445.5.

Rio Olympics 2016: World No.1 golfer Jason Day withdraws over Zika virus fears

New Delhi, June 29
The world's top-ranked golfer Jason Day on Tuesday withdrew from August's Rio de Janeiro Olympics, citing fears over the Zika virus. "The reason for my decision is my concerns about the possible transmission of the Zika virus and the potential risks that it may present to my wife's future pregnancies and to future members of our family," the Australian said in a statement posted on Twitter. "While it has always been a major goal to compete in the Olympics on behalf of my country, playing golf cannot take precedent over the safety of our family. I will not place them at risk," the 28-year-old Day added. Golf is returning to the Olympics for the first time since 1904, but a number of big names, including four-times major champion Rory Mclroy, Fiji's Vijay Singh and Charl Schwartzel of South Africa, have pulled out due to Zika concerns.

2. All existing levels have been subsumed in the new structure; no new levels have been introduced nor has any level been dispensed with. Index of Rationalisation has been approved for arriving at minimum pay in each Level of the Pay Matrix depending upon the increasing role, responsibility and accountability at each step in the hierarchy.

3. The minimum pay has been increased from Rs. 7000 to 18000 p.m. Starting salary of a newly recruited employee at lowest level will now be Rs. 18000 whereas for a freshly recruited Class I officer, it will be Rs. 56100. This reflects a compression ratio of 1:3.12 signifying that pay of a Class I officer on direct recruitment will be three times the pay of an entrant at lowest level.

4. For the purpose of revision of pay and pension, a fitment factor of 2.57 will be applied across all Levels in the Pay Matrices.

5. Rate of increment has been retained at 3%. This will benefit the employees in future on account of higher basic pay as the annual increments that they earn in future will be 2.57 times than at present.

6. The Cabinet approved further improvements in the Defence Pay Matrix by enhancing Index of Rationalisation for Level 13A (Brigadier) and providing for additional stages in Level 12A (Lieutenant Colonel), 13 (Colonel) and 13A (Brigadier) in order to bring parity with Combined Armed Police Forces (CAPF) counterparts at the maximum of the respective Levels.

7. Some other decisions impacting the employees including Defence & Combined Armed Police Forces (CAPF) personnel include:
* Gratuity ceiling enhanced from Rs. 10 to 20 lakh. The ceiling on gratuity will increase by 25% whenever DA rises by 50%.
* A common regime for payment of Ex-gratia lump sum compensation for civil and defence forces personnel payable to Next of Kin with the existing rates enhanced from Rs. 10-20 lakh to 25-45 lakh for different categories.
* Rates of Military Service Pay revised from Rs. 1000, 2000, 4200 & 6000 to 3600, 5200, 10800 & 15500 respectively for various categories of Defence Forces personnel.
* Terminal gratuity equivalent of 10.5 months of reckonable emoluments for Short Service Commissioned Officers who will be allowed to exit Armed Forces any time between 7 and 10 years of service.
* Hospital Leave, Special Disability Leave and Sick Leave subsumed into a composite new Leave named 'Work Related Illness and Injury Leave' (WRILL). Full pay and allowances will be granted to all employees during the entire period of hospitalization on account of WRILL.

8. The Cabinet also approved the recommendation of the Commission to enhance the ceiling of House Building Advance from Rs. 7.50 lakh to 25 lakh. In order to ensure that no hardship is caused to employees, four interest free advances namely Advances for Medical Treatment, TA on tour/transfer, TA for family of deceased employees and LTC have been retained. All other interest free advances have been abolished.

9. The Cabinet also decided not to accept the steep hike in monthly contribution towards Central Government Employees Group Insurance Scheme (CGEGIS) recommended by the Commission. The existing rates of monthly contribution will continue. This will increase the take home salary of employees at lower levels by Rs. 1470. However, considering the need for social security of employees, the Cabinet has asked Ministry of Finance to work out a customized group insurance scheme for Central Government Employees with low premium and high risk cover.

10. The general recommendations of the Commission on pension and related benefits have been approved by the Cabinet. Both the options recommended by the Commission as regards pension revision have been accepted subject to feasibility of their implementation. Revision of pension using the second option based on fitment factor of 2.57 shall be implemented immediately. A Committee is being constituted to address the implementation issues anticipated in the first formulation. The first formulation may be made applicable if its implementation is found feasible after examination by proposed Committee which is to submit its Report within 4 months.

11. The Commission examined a total of 196 existing Allowances and, by way of rationalization, recommended abolition of 51 Allowances and subsuming of 37 Allowances. Given the significant changes in the existing provisions for Allowances which may have wide ranging implications, the Cabinet decided to constitute a Committee headed by Finance Secretary for further examination of the recommendations of 7th CPC on Allowances. The Committee will complete its work in a time bound manner and submit its reports within a period of 4 months. Till a final decision, all existing Allowances will continue to be paid at the existing rates.

12. The Cabinet also decided to constitute two separate Committees (i) to suggest measures for streamlining the implementation of National Pension System (NPS) and (ii) to look into anomalies likely to arise out of implementation of the Commission's Report.

13. Apart from the pay, pension and other recommendations approved by the Cabinet, it was decided that the concerned Ministries may examine the issues that are administrative in nature, individual post/ cadre specific and issues in which the Commission has not been able to arrive at a consensus.

14. As estimated by the 7th CPC, the additional financial impact on account of implementation of all its recommendations in 2016-17 will be Rs. 1,02,100 crore. There will be an additional implication of Rs. 12,133 crore on account of payments of arrears of pay and pension for two months of 2015-16.

will have freedom to operate for longer hours round the year, thus requiring more manpower. As per the proposal mooted by the Labour Ministry, the model law can be adopted by states with a provision of modifying it as per their requirements. The law also provides exemption to highly-skilled workers like those in IT and bio-technology from daily working hours (9 hours) and weekly working hours (48 hours). This is designed to bring in uniformity in legislative provisions, making it easier for all the states to adopt it and ensure uniform working conditions across the country. The Centre has been receiving suggestions from time to time to enact the model law, which the states could consider for enforcement either by adopting the central law or necessary modification by the state law.
