Mortal remains of Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam taken to Rameswaram; funeral today

New Delhi, July 29 The mortal remains of former President Dr APJ Abdul Kalam has reached Rameswaram, his birth place this afternoon. From Delhi, his body was carried to Madurai in a special aircraft where it was received by Tamil Nadu Governor Shri K. Rosiah and Chief Secretary Shri Gnanadesikan. Central Ministers Shri Manohar Parrikar, Shri Venkiah Naidu and Shri Pon Radha Krishnan and many others paid their respects there. Later, it was brought to the Mandapam Camp in Rameswaram by helicopter at 1.50 pm, where the Ramnad District Collector Shri K. Nandakumar and Superintendent of Police Shri



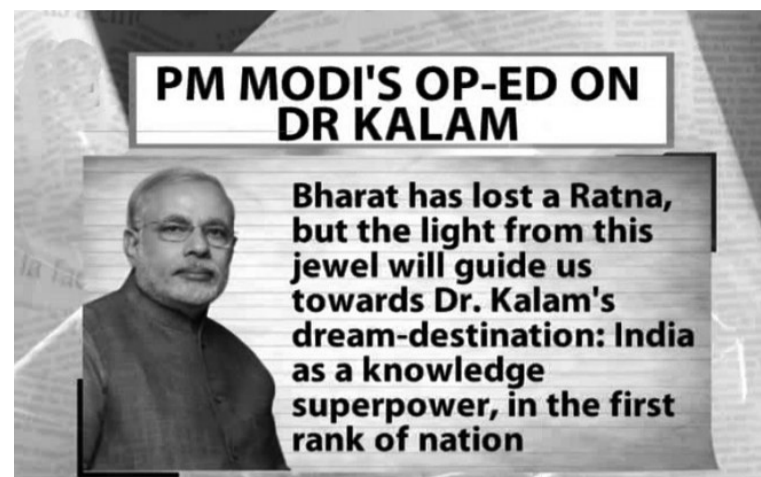
N. Mayilvahanan and Dr. Kalam's family members received it. Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi will be attending the last rites of Former President Dr. A P J Abdul Kalam in Rameswaram tomorrow. Shri Modi will arrive at Rameswaram early in the morning and attend the

rituals at around 11 in the morning. Penning his tribute to the 'missile man' and who was felicitated with the highest civilian honour, the Bharat Ratna, Shri Modi in his blog, said Bharat has lost a Ratna. The mortal remains of ex-President Dr Kalam reached Rameswaram this afternoon, where tens of

hundreds of people are gathered to pay homage to the leader who was close to the hearts of many. Braving scorching heat, people have thronged the pandal that has been erected for them to pay respect to the man who strived hard till his last breath to instill confidence in them for nation building. The District Administration has identified 1.8 acre land at Pei Karumpu in the Island for his burial tomorrow morning at 11 am with full state honours. The police have arranged heavy security arrangements as national leaders and several chief ministers are expected to arrive Rameswaram to pay homage to the departed leader who continued to ignite young minds.

Bharat has indeed lost its Ratna: PM

New Delhi, July 29 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi paid a glowing tribute to former President APJ Abdul Kalam in an op-ed article shared with leading dailies including Hindustan Times, Times of India and Dainik Jagran calling him his 'marg darshak' or guide who epitomised the values of self-restraint, sacrifice and compassion. The Prime Minister in his article said Bharat has lost a Ratna, but the light from this jewel will guide us towards APJ Abdul Kalam's dream-destination: India as a knowledge superpower, in the first rank of nations. He writes the scientist-President never measured success by material possessions. "As a hero of our defence programme, he shifted horizons; and as a seer



of the spirit, he sought to liberate doctrine from the narrow confines of partisan tension to the transcendental space of harmony".

The Prime Minister writes, Dr. Kalam's vision for the nation was anchored in freedom, development and strength.

He wanted India to leap out of the under-developed trough, and eliminate the curse of poverty through inclusive economic growth.

Inform voters before deleting their names from list: CIC to EC

New Delhi The Central Information Commission has directed the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of Delhi to prepare a set of guidelines that needs to be followed before deleting names from the voters' list and inform the electors of the proposed deletion giving opportunity to present their case. The Commission directed the CEO to pay a compensation of Rs 10,000 to one Sumit

whose name was deleted from the voters' list without him being informed even though he did not change his residential address. He could not vote in 2015 Assembly election here. "The voter has a right to know, first that his name was deleted, then the reasons for the decision to delete his name from the voters' list. "Such an arbitrary decision and denial of information even after deletion, followed

by non-response to RTI request for that deletion would certainly amount to denial of very significant constitutional and statutory right to vote and right to information under the RTI Act." Information Commissioner Sridhar Acharyulu said. Issuing a show cause notice to the CPIO of the CEO's office asking why a penalty should not be imposed for failure to furnish the information, Acharyulu also directed it to inform the appellant reasons for deleting his name from the voters' list and if any inquiry was (Contd. on last page)

New Delhi, July 29
The BCCI on Wednesday made it very clear that it was not having second thoughts on revoking the ban on former India pacer S Sreesanth, Mumbai spinner Ankeet Chavan, and Rajasthan off-spinner in the wake of a Delhi Court dropping all charges against them in the IPL 2013 spot-fixing case. All the 36 accused persons including Sreesanth, Chavan and Ajit Chandila were discharged in the IPL 6 spot-fixing case by the Patiala House Court last week but the Indian board had refused to lift their ongoing ban. The Kerala Cricket Association had made a plea to the BCCI for allowing Sreesanth to play again but Thakur said there will be no rethink on the life ban of the two cricketers. Earlier on Wednesday, it was reported that Chavan had written a letter to the Mumbai Cricket

Serena Williams, Sania Mirza top WTA rankings

New Delhi, July 29
21-time Grand Slam winner Serena Williams continue to rule the roost in women's tennis. The 33-year-old retained her top spot in the WTA singles' ranking released on Monday. In the doubles' Indo-Swiss pair of Sania Mirza and Martina Hingis tops the billing. Serena, who recently won the 2015 Wimbledon singles title defeating Garbine Muguruza, has 13191 ranking points to top lead the list despite pulling out of the Swedish Open an elbow injury earlier this month. She is followed by Russian star Maria Sharapova at second spot with 6490 points. Simona Halep, Petra Kvitova, Caroline Wozniacki, Ana Ivanovic, Agnieszka Radwanska, Lucie Safarova, Muguruza and Carla Suarez Navarro complete the top-ten in the singles.

Diego Maradona plans bid for FIFA presidency

Buenos Aires, July 29
Argentine football icon Diego Maradona has denied feeling depressed after the death of his father, saying that he will go "for FIFA" in a video he posted on Facebook. "I know that they're saying lots of things. Nobody can know what I'm feeling inside over the death of my father. They cut off a love from me that I thought was eternal and that can't be forgotten so easily," Maradona said, reports Efe. In the cellphone video, Maradona, who led Argentina to victory in the 1986 World Cup and later coached the national squad, is seen on a football pitch wearing sports clothes and holding a ball under his left arm.

"Not only the appellant, each voter whose valid voting right is violated by arbitrary decision of the officer without communicating reasons and giving an opportunity to represent why his name should be removed, is entitled to such compensation if he was not allowed to vote on that ground, and restoration of voting rights within reasonable time," he said.
