## Ministry of Health releases operational guidelines for planning, implementation of Family Participatory Care

New Delhi, July 29  
Health and Family Welfare Ministry has released operational guidelines for planning and implementation of Family Participatory Care (FPC) for improving newborn health. The guidelines will serve as a guiding document for those intending to introduce FPC in their facility as an integral part of facility based

newborn care. In an official release, the Ministry said, the document also provides details of infrastructure, training, role of health care providers and steps in the operationalization of family participatory care in the newborn care unit. The operational guidelines of FPC are for all stakeholders involved in the process of

planning and delivering newborn care. Under FPC, the staff at newborn care unit will provide continuous supervision and support. The Ministry said, sick and newborn are highly vulnerable and require careful nurturing in order to survive the neonatal period and first year of life.

## Supreme Court puts end to immediate arrests in dowry cases

New Delhi, Jul 29

The Supreme Court has put an end to immediate arrest of the husband and his family members in the dowry harassment case. The division bench of the Apex Court, headed by Justice Adarsh Kumar Goel and comprising UU Lalit said yesterday that complaints under Section 498A should now be referred to Family Welfare Committees- to be constituted at every district and no arrest shall be effected till the committee's report is received. The Bench said such report may be then considered by the investigating officer or the magistrate on its own merit. However, these directions will not apply to the offences involving tangible physical



injuries or death. The court also ruled that there will be no routine impounding of passports or issuance of Red Corner Notice for the accused NRI. The apex court also ruled Personal appearance of all family members and particularly outstanding members may not be required. The court passed the order keeping in

## India win Galle Test after beating Sri Lanka by 304 runs

Galle, Jul 29  
India today outclassed Sri Lanka by 304 runs in their opening Test at Galle, biggest overseas win in terms of runs, surpassing 279 run-victory against England at Leeds in 1986. For Sri Lanka, it was their biggest defeat in terms of runs, surpassing their 301-



run loss against Pakistan in 1994. Earlier, the hosts finished their second innings at 245 in 76.5 overs. This was after

India captain Virat Kohli struck his 17th Test hundred with India declaring their second innings at 240 for three.

India took a huge first innings lead of 309 runs when the hosts were all out for 291 in reply to India's 600 yesterday.

## Lovepreet Singh wins bronze in Asian Youth & Junior Weightlifting C'ships

Kathmandu, Jul 29  
India's Lovepreet Singh has won bronze medal in Asian Youth and Junior Weightlifting Championships at Kathmandu. He got third place in 105 kg men junior category a short while ago. Lovepreet lifted 151 kgs in snatch and 180 kgs in clean and jerk to get the bronze. He lifted total 331 kgs. This is India's fourth medal in the championships.
