## Prof. Ram Kapse passes away, LG condoles death



Port Blair, Sept 29

**The Lt Governor, Lt Gen A K Singh (Retd), has condoled the death of former Lt Governor Prof. Ram Kapse. He has conveyed his deepest sympathy, sorrow and heartfelt condolences to the members of the bereaved family.**

In a brief message, he said that Prof Kapse was committed to the welfare of the people of the Islands and during his stint as Lt Governor of the A&N Islands, the Islands witnessed accelerated growth and progress. He personally supervised the relief and rehabilitation works during the December 26, 2004 tsunami disaster. The people of the Islands will always remember Prof Kapse for his contribution to the growth and development of the Islands, as also

his affection for the Islanders.

Prof. Ram Kapse-the former Lt Governor of the A&N Islands died at Mumbai (Maharashtra) at the age of 82. He served the A&N Islands as the 8th Lt Governor from 05.01.2004 to 11.02.2006. During his tenure, the tsunami of 26th December 2004 caused extensive damages to the Islands and he took upon himself the massive relief & rehabilitation work.

**BCCI to elect new chief on October 4**

New Delhi, Sept 29  
The BCCI has called a Special General Meeting (SGM) on October 4 to elect its new president with Nagpur lawyer Shashank Manohar emerging as a "consensus" candidate. Apprising media of the development, BCCI secretary Anurag Thakur said the meeting will be held in Mumbai and scrutiny of the nominations will be done on October 3.

"Shashank Manohar is our consensus candidate," Mr. Thakur told media, adding that if an election happens, "N Srinivasan can come and vote at the SGM." The Supreme Court hearing on

Mr. Srinivasan's eligibility on attending BCCI meeting is slated for October 5. Mr. Thakur said Mr. Srinivasan cannot attend the meeting but he was not barred from casting his vote. Mr. Manohar, who has served as BCCI president from 2008 to 2011, has agreed for a second innings as BCCI chief after initially refusing to come into picture. Jagmohan Dalmiya's demise left

the post vacant and most likely the new CAB president and former Indian skipper Sourav Ganguly is likely to propose Mr. Manohar's name for the post. Mr. Manohar is unlikely to face any rival since the Mr. Srinivasan faction hardly has numbers to counter the former's candidature. Mr. Manohar has backing from Sharad Pawar-Thakur factions, who control about 20 votes out of 29.

**Lewis Hamilton wins Japanese Grand Prix**

Singapore, Sept 29  
In Japan, Mercedes driver Lewis Hamilton pulled off an aggressive passing move on teammate Nico Rosberg and went on to win the Japanese Grand Prix yesterday, moving a step closer to claiming his second straight Formula One title. Hamilton, who had his first retirement of the season at last weekend's Singapore GP, capitalized on a strong start and surged ahead of Rosberg at the

first corner. He led the rest of the way, crossing the finish line a comfortable 18.9 seconds ahead. Ferrari driver Sebastian Vettel was third, 1.8 seconds behind Rosberg, who started from pole. With five races left, Hamilton has a 48 point lead over Rosberg. Hamilton claimed his eighth win of the season. It was his 41st career win, tying him with his childhood hero Ayrton Senna.

**Harjeet to lead junior team**

New Delhi, Sept 29  
Midfielder Harjeet Singh will continue to lead as the junior Indian men's hockey team aims to defend its title at the 5th Sultan of Johor Cup later this month. The 18-member squad for the tournament, to be played from October 11-18, was announced on Monday and the two-time defending champion is keen to make it a hat-trick this time around. India beat Great Britain 2-1 in the final last year with a winner in the dying minutes. The tournament also saw young drag-flicker Harmanpreet Singh, come of age as the top-scorer for India. This time around, India would open its campaign in the competition, played in round-robin format, against Pakistan, whom it

thrashed 6-0 in the previous edition. Australia, Great Britain, Argentina and host Malaysia are the other teams in the fray. The Indian side recently finished fourth at the Volvo Invitational Tournament. "We are not allowing the pressure of being defending champion overwhelm us. The team is in a very good shape and we are undergoing strenuous training. There is a huge improvement in our passing and scoring," Harjeet said. "The boys are confident and aim to retain the title. Our opening match is against Pakistan and the boys are excited about their clash against them. We have understood our past mistakes and the team is geared up for the challenge," coach Harendra Singh said.

**Gurpreet wins silver and Jitu gets bronze in 10m Air Pistol**

New Delhi, Sept 29  
Ace Indian marksmen Gurpreet Singh and Jitu Rai once again brought laurels to the country as they won silver and bronze respectively in the men's 10m Air Pistol event at the Asian AirGun Championship on Tuesday. Iran's Sepehr Safari Boroujeni surprised everyone as he clinched the gold medal after shooting a final score of 198.7. Jitu led the eight-shooter field right from the start but lost the plot somewhere in between while on the contrary Gurpreet rose to the occasion and slowly built the lead midway through the

competition at the Dr Karni Singh Shooting Range. Gurpreet shot a final score of 197.6 while Jitu's final score was 177.6. Third Indian shooter Omkar Singh was the first one to be eliminated as he finished a dismal eighth with a final score of 77.5. Earlier on Monday, India's Ayonika Paul wobbled a bit towards the end but still managed to bag the bronze medal while Apurvi Chandela missed out on the podium finish after a disappointing outing in the final of women's 10m air rifle event.

**India A pummel Bangladesh A by an innings and 32 runs**

Bengaluru, Sept 29  
India A bowlers ripped through the Bangladesh A line-up in a superb combined effort as the home team thrashed the visitors by an innings and 36 runs to win the only unofficial cricket Test here today. Resuming at overnight 36 for 2 on day 3, Bangladesh A were bowled out for 151 in 39.3 overs with Ishwar Pandey (3/28), Jayant Yadav (3/48) and Abhimanyu Mithun (2/23) doing the bulk of damage at the M Chinnaswamy Stadium. After India A posted 411 for 5 declared against Bangladesh's 228, the visiting batsmen faced the tall task of not just wiping off a significant lead but also post a good target for the hosts.

However, Bangladesh A failed to erase even the first innings deficit as only five of their batsmen could reach doubles scores with skipper Mominul Haque (54) and wicket-keeper batsman Liton Das (38) emerging as the highest runscore. Resuming their innings, Mominul and Liton shared 61 runs for the third wicket but their partnership lasted only a little over eight overs today as Pandey cleaned bowled the latter in the 20th over. Two balls later, Pandey struck again trapping first innings centurion Sabbir Rahman in front of wicket for his third wicket. He had got rid of opener Anamul Haque for naught yesterday.
