India always vouched for world peace, unity & harmony: PM

New Delhi, Oct 29

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today said India has always vouched for world peace, unity and harmony and its armed forces have contributed in this direction through UN missions across the globe. He said that currently around 7,000 Indian security personnel are deployed on peacekeeping missions, making it the third highest contributor. In his 37th edition of monthly radio programme 'Mann Ki Baat', the Prime Minister said besides, Indian forces have provided peacekeeping training to their counterparts from 85 countries and have been providing medical services



to people from a number of countries.

Shri Modi said Indians believe that everyone should live in peace and harmony and move towards a better and peaceful tomorrow. Shri Modi said, jawans of Indian security forces play an important role not only on

Indian borders but they play a very vital role in establishing peace the world over.

The Prime Minister said, everybody recalls the efforts and constructive role of the United Nations in establishing peace throughout the world and with the belief in

'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam', India has been cooperating very actively in various important initiatives taken by the UN.

Shri Modi said, both the preface of the Indian Constitution and the UN Charter starts with the words 'We the People'. He said, more than 18

thousand Indian security personnel have lent their services in UN Peacekeeping Operations and presently, about seven thousand Indian soldiers are associated with UN Peacekeeping initiatives which is the third highest number of soldiers from any country.

He said, till August this year, Indian soldiers had lent their services in about 50 of the total of 71 Peacekeeping operations undertaken by the UN the world over.

Shri Modi said, in Congo and Southern Sudan more than twenty thousand patients were treated in hospitals of the Indian Army and countless lives

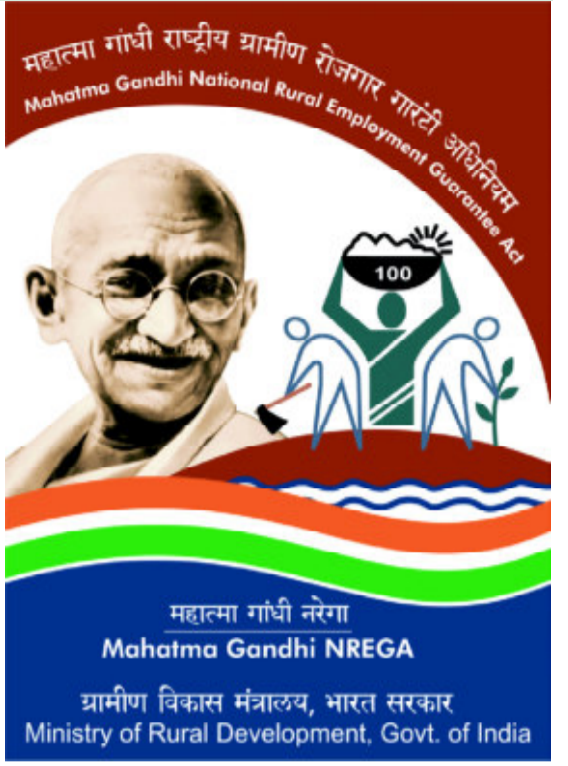

Centre to ensure adequate fund flow to States & UTs under MGNREGS

New Delhi, Oct 29

Government is making all efforts to ensure adequate fund flow to the States and UTs under MGNREGS. It has released 40,480 crore rupees so far in this Financial Year which is around 4,500 crore rupees more than the release during the corresponding period of the last financial year. As per the financial norms, after 30th September of every year, the States/UTs are required to submit Audited Reports and Utilization Certificates of the previous financial year along with other required information for the release of the second tranche of funds. The Ministry of Rural Development, GoI, has been scrutinizing the complete proposals with promptness and has been releasing funds.

Immediate action has been taken on proposals submitted so far by Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh and Jammu and Kashmir and proposals have been processed. The Ministry has been constantly engaging with the rest of the States / UTs for submission of proposals without delay. The current Financial Year is marked by the highest ever budget allocation of 48,000 crore rupees.



Mobile Aadhar can now be used as ID proof to enter airports, says BCAS

New Delhi, Oct 29

Mobile Aadhaar can be used as an identity proof to enter airports. According to a circular issued by aviation security agency, BCAS, identification documents will not be required for minors accompanied by parents. Passengers entering airport premises need to produce any one of the ten identity proofs listed by the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security (BCAS). These include passport, voter ID card, Aadhaar or m-Aadhaar, PAN card and driving licence. The BCAS circular issued on 26th October said, a passbook issued by a nationalised bank, pension card, disability photo identification and service photo ID card of central/state government, PSU, local bodies and

NASA spots 'interstellar object' passing through solar system

Washington, Oct 29

In a first, NASA scientists have discovered an interstellar object - a small asteroid or comet that appears to have originated from outside the solar system, coming from somewhere else in our galaxy.

The object - designated A-2017 U1 - is less than a 400 metres in diameter and is moving remarkably fast. A-2017 U1 was discovered by the University of Hawaii's Pan-STARRS 1 telescope during the course of its nightly search for near-Earth objects for NASA. Astronomers are working to point telescopes around the world and in space at this notable object. Once these data are obtained and analysed, astronomers may know more about the origin and possibly composition of the object.

Not far when India play World Cup on their own, says Sports Minister



Kolkata, Oct 29 Union Sports Minister Col Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore said on Sunday, a day after FIFA U-17 World Cup 2017 came to a close, that if things continue like this, the day is not far when India play a World Cup on their own. "We have got the start. We should not stop here. I hope we get the U-20 World Cup, so that the start gets even bigger momentum. I believe if things go like this, it's not far when India will play in a World Cup on their own," Col Rathore said. "It's a matter of pride that the U-17 World Cup came to India. It has taken India's importance at the world

level to greater heights. Now the big competitions and sports which were earlier non-existent in India are feeling the need to come to this country. The fans response has been fantastic, we broke all records of the most attended World Cup ever," said Col Rathore, who has been an Olympic silver medalist. He even thanked Kolkata for their brilliant support in the tournament. The city came out in large numbers and last night broke the record of the highest attendance at the event. "Kolkata has sports lovers. They understand the sport better. They waited for the ceremony to get over even after the match was over. They

showed respect to both the teams. My heartfelt thanks to all the fans of Kolkata." "Football is popular only in a few regions like West Bengal, Goa and NorthEast. It's a nice opportunity to make the sport popular all over. We must make full use of this. We will take full responsibility from the Centre by bringing up more infrastructure and prepare elite athletes by looking after their funding and resources. You have seen the overall infrastructure and the modifications that have come in place have been very satisfying. We now need to be prepared for the upcoming competitions," he said.

PM Modi lauds Srikanth, Hockey team; says U-17 WC was huge success

New Delhi, Oct 29 While addressing the nation via 'Mann ki Baat', Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi lauded India's performance in sports this month that saw the Indian hockey team win the Asia Cup for the first time in 10 years and shuttler Kidambi Srikanth claim the Denmark Open Superseries - to make his third Superseries title this year. PM Shri Modi also spoke about the recently concluded FIFA Under-17 World Cup and said that the event was a huge success. "Young Indian players won hearts of fans during the FIFA Under-17 World Cup. Future of football is

bright in India," said Shri Modi and added, "After 10 years India won Asia Cup. I congratulate entire team and the support staff and in badminton Kidambi Srikanth won." Among the highlights this month was Srikanth's Denmark Open triumph and the men's hockey team's stellar show in Dhaka. Srikanth, who now has three titles under his belt this year, is aiming for his fourth after reaching the final of the French Open badminton after beating H S Prannoy yesterday in an all-Indian semifinal. While India remained a novice on the football field, it won the

bragging rights of conducting a FIFA Under-17 World Cup for the first time, which was declared a "resounding success" by the world body's boss - Gianni Infantino. It was hardly a surprise given that the hosts managed to break attendance records for an age group world cup. It was a very expected first-round exit from the under-17 World Cup but it was nonetheless made unforgettable for the nation by Jeakson Singh, a 16-year-old son of a street vendor in Manipur, who became the first Indian to score a goal in a FIFA World Cup.

Virat Kohli scores 32nd ODI century, fastest to 9000 runs in ODIs

Kanpur, Oct 29 Virat Kohli is on century scoring spree and there is no stopping him. After reaching his 31st ODI century - second best in ODIs - in the ODI series against Australia earlier this month, the Indian captain notched up his 32nd ODI hundred against New Zealand in the third ODI in Kanpur on Sunday. Kohli reached the three-figure mark off just 95 balls and with the help of 8 fours and a six. The right-handed batsman also brought up 9000 ODI runs on Sunday. He is the fastest to reach the milestone as he left AB de Villiers behind. Kohli scored his 9000th ODI run in his 194th innings while De Villiers has achieved the same feat in 205 innings. In 2017,



Kohli is the leading run scorer in both ODIs and international cricket. He is the first player to score 2000 international runs this year and only Hashim Amla is close to achieving the feat as the South African has 1988 runs. Kohli shared a 230-run stand with Rohit Sharma for the second wicket after India lost the earlu wicket of Shikhar Dhawan.

Sharma was dismissed for 147 - his 15th century in ODIs. The Indian captain has the most runs in ODI cricket this year. He is followed by Rohit who also has 1000th run this year on Sunday. England captain Joe Root is third on the list but he has only 938 run to his name with no more ODIs scheduled for England this year.

Sports Ministry asks NADA to conduct dope test on cricketers

New Delhi, Oct 29 In a pathbreaking move, the Col Rajyavardhan Singh Rathore-led Sports Ministry has directed the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) to conduct dope test on cricketers during domestic and

international tournaments held in India, The Times of India has reported. The move will allow NADA to enforce World Anti-Doping Agency's (WADA) Code in all its "fairness and entirety" on the BCCI.

According to TOI, NADA has been given "full authority and powers" to send 'dope control officers' (DCOs) to tournaments conducted by the BCCI to collect in-competition blood and urine samples.

FIFA U-17 World Cup in India becomes most attended in event's history

Kolkata, Oct 29 The 17th edition of the FIFA U-17 World Cup in India on Saturday turned out to be a milestone event as it became the most attended in the history of the tournament. After the third-place match between Brazil and Mali in Kolkata on Saturday, the total number of spectators who turned up at the six host venues across the country went past the earlier record attendance of 1,230,976 set in the first edition of the tournament in China in 1985. With 56432 spectators turning up at the Salt Lake Stadium to watch the Brazil versus Mali match, the total attendance of the FIFA U-17 World Cup reached 1280459. Before this match, a mere 6949

attendance was needed to break the record. The 2011 edition in Mexico had also attracted a total of 1,002,314 spectators, becoming the third one to have more than one million attendance. The attendance for matches had breached the million mark in the

last Round of 16 match on October 18. In terms of the number of spectators per match, this edition is second behind the inaugural edition in China (which was 38,469) as the number of participating teams and matches were lesser at that time.

South Andaman Police seize 5.94 kg ganja; two arrested

Port Blair, Oct 29 On receiving credible information on Oct 20 by SHO PS Aberdeen that a deal in illicit ganja is likely to be struck at Corbyn's Cove parking area, a raiding team led by Insp. Students also have the option to furnish a photo identity card issued by a government institute. The order, however, exempts a minor accompanied by a parent or a guardian from producing an identity proof. If a passenger is not able to furnish one of the ten documents, then there is also an option to provide an identity certificate issued by a group A gazetted officer of central/state government.
