## PM Modi asks BJP MPs, MLAs to submit their bank details till 31st December

New Delhi, Nov 29 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi has asked BJP MPs and MLAs to submit details of their bank account transactions between 8th November and 31st December to party President Shri Amit Shah. Addressing BJP Parliamentary Party

meeting in New Delhi today, Shri Modi rejected the allegation that the Income-Tax Amendment Bill tabled in the Lok Sabha yesterday is for converting black money into white. The bill proposes to levy a total tax, penalty and surcharge of 50 percent on the amount deposited post

demonetisation while higher taxes and penalty of upto 85 per cent await those who don't disclose but are caught. Speaking to media, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Shri Ananth Kumar said the Prime Minister described the move as fight against black money. He said Shri Modi

also sought support from everyone to make India a digital and cashless economy. On Parliament impasse, Shri Kumar reiterated that the government is ready for discussion on the issue of demonetization. He said the Prime Minister will also express his views on the issue.

## CS urges banking fraternity to create awareness on alternate banking facilities in Isles

The Union Territory Level Bankers' Committee (UTLBC) meeting for A&N Islands for September quarter 2016 was held at the conference hall of Hotel Megapode Nest here this morning. The Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar was the guest of honour while the General Manager, State Bank of India, LHO, Kolkata, Shri Mahesh Goel chaired the meeting.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Secretary said, 95% of seeding of Aadhar number with bank account has been accomplished in the Islands, which is quite satisfactory, and lauded the banking fraternity for their relentless efforts in this regard and urged them for making more efforts to reach 100% target in the coming days. About demonetization, the Chief Secretary remarked that barring the 1st & 2nd day, everything was managed smoothly by the banking sector here in Isles and they rose up to the challenges exceptionally well. He said, people should be made aware of



migrating to digital world and banks should take the initiative in educating people about alternate banking facilities.

He also mentioned that an extensive meeting was held with senior officers of the Administration, ACCI and the banking fraternity wherein issues and concerns were highlighted

and all of them extended support in working a way out and this was reflected in the meeting held by the Home Secretary, GoI for all Union Territories yesterday. Certain issues of Isles have been conveyed to the Govt. during the cabinet secretariat meeting held recently which include poor connectivity, he said.

Port Blair, Nov. 29 The District Administration has taken strong action against the illegal sale of banned tobacco products. Accordingly, a surprise inspection was carried out in Port Blair area by the Revenue team which found that a number of gumities/

shops were selling banned tobacco products.

Approximate 18 gumities at Gandhi Statue, Premnagar junction, in front of State Library and near Head Post Office were evicted. These gumities had encroached on the Govt. land and were suspected to be selling the banned tobacco products.

This drive will continue over the coming week.

In addition to these, the Food Safety Officer has seized and detained 216 tins of tobacco from M/s Poonam Enterprises, Gurudwara Line, Aberdeen under sub section (1) of section 41 of Food Safety

# India beat England by 8 wickets, take 2-0 lead in series

Mohali, Nov 29  
India spinners once again held centre stage as the hosts produced a clinical performance to cruise to a comfortable eight-wicket victory on the fourth day of the third cricket Test and thereby take a 2-0 lead in the five-match series. The trio of Ravichandran Ashwin (3/81), Ravindra Jadeja (2/62) and Jayant Yadav (2/21) shared bulk of the spoils to dismiss the visitors for 236 in their second innings. Comeback man Parthiv Patel then made a mockery of the target of 103 runs, smashing his way to an unbeaten 67 off 53 balls studded with 11 fours and a six. Fittingly he finished the match with a boundary over extra cover in company of Virat Kohli. Parthiv and Cheteshwar Pujara (25) added 81 runs in only 15.2 overs in what turned out to be an easy chase completed



in 20.2 overs. Parthiv was in a mood to display his 'T20 skills' as he took on the pacers and spinners alike with minimum fuss. The 50 came off 39 balls with eight boundaries and a six. His prowess at the top of the order will give Kohli and coach Anil Kumble another option for opening slot. The only wicket that would have seriously bothered them was that of Joe Root. But post Root, Hameed did put up a fight but it was always for a losing cause. Root, who was standing between India and victory, was dismissed for 78 by Jadeja (2/39 in 23 overs), who got one to turn away sharply as the edge was taken by an alert Ajinkya Rahane, who reacted quickly to stretch his right hand. Root played 179 balls hitting six

## Hockey: Affan Yousuf scores twice in India's 3-2 win over Australia

New Delhi, Nov 29  
Talented youngster Affan Yousuf slotted two huge goals during the first half and skipper VR Raghunath struck just seconds after Australia equalised in the third quarter, as the Indian men's hockey team claimed a 3-2 win over the world No 1 in the first of two Tests in Bendigo, Victoria on Tuesday. The win came just days after the tourists claimed bronze in the Four Nations Invitational Tournament, and helped Raghunath's team exact revenge on hosts Australia who beat them 3-2 during that tournament. Overall, this was the 22nd time an Indian men's hockey team beat Australia, in 117 head-to-head matches. Australia's goals came from shots from the field by Matthew Willis and Trent Mitton in the 36th and 43rd minutes, but Raghunath's penalty corner in the 44th minute put India ahead for good. This was Affan's second stand-out performance this month, following on from his late goal during the nail-biting victory over Pakistan which won India the Men's Asian Champions Trophy in Malaysia. The 22-year-old struck twice in the 21st minute with two excellent field goals after the first quarter ended with the teams yet to score.

## Pankaj Advani claims bronze medal at IBSF World Snooker Championship



Doha, Nov 29  
Fifteen-time world champion Pankaj Advani suffered a 2-7 loss in the semifinals against Andrew Pagett of Wales to settle for a bronze medal at the IBSF World Snooker Championship here. After a hard-fought four-hour quarterfinal that went down to the wire, defending champion Advani had to return to the table for the crucial semifinal without much of a break. His opponent Andrew kept the pressure and reached the final after notching up a 14-74, 8-71, 0-87, 78-64, 0-81, 71, 0-87, 78-64, 0-81, 70-37, 7-80, 37-68, 19-74 win. Advani now heads back to Bangalore to switch to the 3-ball game in preparation for the World Billiards Championship that commences from December 5. The Indian is the only player in the world to compete at the world championship level in both sports and be successful in all the formats of both billiards and snooker.
