Moscow, Nov 29  
Home Minister Shri Rajnath Singh has said terrorism and radicalisation are the two greatest threats facing the world and India is making efforts to eliminate the menace. Shri Singh said this while addressing the Indian diaspora in Moscow. He is on a three-day visit to Russia.

## Clean Sea-2017 Coast Guard conducts regional level marine oil pollution response exercise



Port Blair, Nov.29  
The Regional Level Marine Oil Pollution Response Exercise titled 'Clean Sea - 2017', was conducted at sea off Port Blair today. The exercise was preceded by a table top exercise yesterday. The objective of the exercise was to ascertain preparedness of the Indian Coast Guard, resource agencies and other stakeholders in responding to a major oil spill in line with the provisions of NOS-DCP (National Oil Spill Disaster Contingency Plan). The highlight of the exercise

was participation of one ICG Pollution Control Vessel (PCV) and integration of Indian Coast Guard Dornier/Chetak aircraft into the Oil Spill Disaster Management System for aerial assessment/ delivery of Oil Spill Dispersant (OSD) for mitigation of the spilled oil. Representatives from various stake holders also participated in the exercise as observers. The preparedness of all agencies during the exercise was conducted

under observation of Coast Guard Regional Commander Inspector General KR Suresh, TM and was overseen by Shri Anindo Majumdar, Chief Secretary, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, who embarked onboard Coast Guard Ship Vishwast along with Ms Nuzhat Hassan, DGP, Smt Nabanita Ganguly, Director, Pollution Control Committee and Dr. RD Tripathy, Chief Port Administrator, PMB.

The exercise was therefore responsible for marine environment protection in the maritime zones of India and is the coordinating authority for response to oil spills in Indian waters. The Force has drawn up a National Oil Spill Disaster Contingency Plan (NOSDCP) and has established three pollution response centres at Mumbai, Chennai and Port Blair. A robust National system for oil spill response is critical.

## Alternators of two DG sets develop technical faults Rotational load shedding to be exercised; general public urged to consume power judiciously

Port Blair, Nov. 29  
The Alternators of two DG sets at IPP have developed technical faults, due to which the sets have become non-functional with effect from 25.11.2017. This has created severe paucity of power demand of the order of 7-8 MW in Port Blair and South Andaman. To cope up with the untoward situation, a rotational load shedding for 1 hour is being exercised during evening peak hours

from 5 pm to 11 pm and as and when required basis during day hours. The Electricity Department has appealed to all the residents of Port Blair and South Andaman to consume power judiciously by rationalizing their power requirements by using minimal lights, fans and other electrical gadgets and switch off all non-required lights, fans and other electrical gadgets etc.

All the hoteliers and big consumers who are having their own standby DG Sets have been strictly advised to run their DG Sets during evening peak hours, 5 PM to 11 PM and help in mitigating the power crisis by Electricity Department and also to minimise the load shedding. By doing so, the peak demand during evening peak hours will be reduced which may certainly help the

Tokyo, Nov 29  
Sumo grand champion Harumafuji announced he would retire on Wednesday to take responsibility for injuring a junior wrestler in an incident that has threatened to taint the image of Japan's national sport just as it was regaining popularity. The 33-year-old Mongolian-born "yokozuna" (grand champion) had already apologised earlier this month after media reported he had beaten junior wrestler Takanoiwa while drinking at a restaurant-bar with other wrestlers. "As yokozuka, I feel responsible for injuring



Takanoiwa and so will retire from today," a stern-faced Harumafuji told a news conference carried live by several Japanese broadcasters in Fukuoka, southern Japan, site of the most

recent tournament. "I apologise from my heart to the people, sumo fans, the Japan Sumo Association, to supporters of my 'stable' (gym) and my 'oyakata' (coach) and his wife for causing such trouble", he said.

**Rangana Herath ruled out  
of third Test against India**

Colombo, Nov 29  
Veteran Sri Lanka spinner Rangana Herath was on Tuesday ruled out of the third Test against India due to a sore back, compounding the visiting team's problems in the ongoing series. Leg-break bowler Jeffrey Vandersay has been added to the touring squad as Herath's replacement. Sri Lanka, who were handed an innings and 239-run defeat by the hosts in the second Test in Nagpur, trail the three-match series 0-1. The third game is scheduled to be held in the national capital from December 2 to 6.

**Perera replaces Tharanga  
as Sri Lanka's ODI captain**

Colombo, Nov 29  
Sri Lanka on Wednesday ousted Upul Tharanga as one-day captain and brought in Thisara Perera to lead the team for an upcoming ODI and T20 series in India. The move comes after a series of defeats while Tharanga and senior Sri Lankan players refused to play a 20-over international against Pakistan in Lahore. "We have appointed Thisara the ODI and T20 captain," a top Sri Lanka Cricket official told AFP ahead of a formal announcement later Wednesday.

**FIFA unveils Yashin-themed poster  
for Russia's 2018 World Cup**

Moscow, Nov 29  
FIFA presented the official poster for next year's World Cup finals in Moscow on Tuesday, unveiling a vintage design of Soviet goalkeeping great Lev Yashin in flight. Inspired by the constructivist art movement, the poster shows Yashin, wearing a knee brace and his signature cap, leaping across to get a hand on an oversized ball featuring Russia's landmass seen from space.

Orange rays emanate from the ball and the circle of green in the middle of the poster represents the pitches of the 12 tournament venues, FIFA said. The poster's presentation comes three days before the World Cup draw takes place to determine the match ups for the group stage. "We are very proud of this beautiful landmark asset that portrays such an important icon and celebrates the coming



tournament on Russian soil," goalkeeper to have won the FIFA Secretary General Fatma Samoura said of the poster. Yashin, who died in 1990, competed in four World Cups — 1958, 1962, 1966 and 1970. He is the only Petersburg and Sochi.

The Community Football Club of India has been launched here with a view to play in the Youth I-League in the coming years. planned to evaluate the preparedness for Response Operations for any such oil pollution incident in this highly sensitive area. The support and cooperation provided by all stakeholders, is indicative of the resolve and firmness in combating oil spills in such sensitive areas. The exercise was conducted in two phases. A table top exercise was conducted on Nov 28. Subsequently, a real time exercise of oil spill scenario was conducted off Port Blair today. The exercise evolutions included mobilisation of pollution response resources by various stakeholders in Andaman Region, exercising reporting procedures, testing of communication links and threat assessment, recovery of distressed crew from sea, fire fighting assistance by OPVs to disabled merchant tanker, deployment of pollution



response equipment for containment and recovery of spilled oil, transfer of recovered oil to barges for transportation to port/ shore reception facility coordinated by Pollution Control Board and demonstration of Dispersant Spray capabilities by the Coast Guard Interceptor Boats, Fast Patrol Vessels, Pollution Control Vessels, Chetak Helicopter and Dornier. Seven ICG ships and two aircraft including one PCV, OPV, Chetak helicopter and Dornier aircraft each, Merchant Vessel Manav Star and one Tug from PMB participated in the exercise. 31 Representatives from the resource agencies, stakeholders and A&N Administration as observers embarked Coast Guard Ship Vishwast for witnessing the exercise at sea. Exercise 'Clean Sea' validated and reinforced response mechanism for Oil Pollution incidents and enabled Indian Coast Guard to fine tune the actions required in such eventualities by improving coordination and communication with different agencies. All out efforts are being made with the synergy of stakeholders through such exercises to extend GoI policy of 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' to Maritime Zones of India through 'Swachh Sagar Abhiyan' also, as 64% of world oil trade pass through the Andaman Sea. Representatives from electronic and print media also witnessed the exercise.
