Impressive performances by bands of Army, Navy, and A & N Police, Colourful cultural programme, illumination of ships and spectacular fire power display formed part of the Beating Retreat ceremony that marked the grand finale of the Republic Day celebration- 2020 at the historic Netaji Stadium here this evening. The Lt Governor, A&N Islands & Vice Chairman, Islands Development Agency, Admiral DK Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) was the chief guest. The First Lady of these Islands, Smt. Chitra Joshi, Principal Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Vikram Dev Dutt, Chairperson, PBMC, Shri NK Udhaya Kumar, senior officers from defence & civil Administration and good number of general public witnessed the performance.

1200 Pax cum 1000 T cargo vessel for A&N Islands launched at CSL

Port Blair, Jan 29
The first of the two 1200 Pax capacity vessel cum 1000 T cargo vessel under construction in Cochin Shipyard Limited (CSL) for the Andaman and Nicobar Administration was launched yesterday at CSL's Kochi yard. After the ceremonial pooja, the vessel was launched by Smti. Rameetha K, Scientist 'G', NPOL (DRDO), wife of Shri Madhu S Nair, CMD, CSL, in the presence of the CMD. Shri Sureshababu N V, Director (Operations), CSL, Shri Bejoy Bhasker, Director (Technical), Shri Jose VJ, Director (Finance), owner's representatives, Senior Officials of CSL and Classification Societies.



The vessel is designed as a modern high-quality passenger vessel with electric propulsion suitable for carrying 1200 passengers and 1000 T cargo for 'all-weather' operation on the mainland to A&N Islands route. The ship is built to the highest standards of the Indian Register of Shipping and Lloyds Register of Shipping overseen by the DG Shipping of India and meets the requirements of 'Class III Special Trade Passenger Ship' as per Indian Merchant Shipping rules. The vessel is built in steel as a modern, safe and seaworthy vessel with aesthetic line and pleasant profile. The speciality of this vessel is that it comes with 'Safe Return to Port' (SRTp) compliance which is envisaged to be a 'first' in Asia. The ship would not only enable safe and comfortable passenger movement, but will also be a boost to the tourism sector. The vessel has modern cafeteria, and recreation rooms. Both Cabin Class (consisting of Deluxe Cabins, First Class Cabins & Second Class Cabins) and Bunk Class accommodation is available on board. With

Do not reveal information regarding identification of sexual abuse victim under POCSO Act: NCPCR

Port Blair, Jan 29
The National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (hereinafter "NCPCR") is constituted under Section 3 of Commissions for Protection of Child Rights Act 2005 to safeguard the child rights. As per Section 44 of Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act r/w Rule 6 of POCSO Rules 2012, the Commission is also

empowered to monitor the implementation of the POCSO Act 2019. On careful examination of various media reports covering cases of child sexual abuse, it has been noticed by the NCPCR that investigating officers/district police in charge while addressing media about such cases, are divulging such key information associated

with the victim which is required to be kept confidential. Such act of police of revealing information connected with the identification of sexual abuse victim may lead to identity disclosure as established under Section 23 of the POCSO Act 2012. It is pertinent to mention that disclosure of identity of a minor sexual abuse

victim including his name, address, photograph, family details, school, neighborhood or any other particulars is restricted under Section 23 of POCSO Act 2012. It is mentioned under Section 23 of the POCSO Act 2012 that, 1. No person shall make any report or present comments on any child from any form of media or

Rohit Sharma's twin Super Over sixes seal maiden T20I series win in NZ

Hamilton, Jan 29
Hitman Rohit Sharma hit a brilliant unbeaten 15 (including two sixes) in the Super Over as India chased down New Zealand's score of 17 to win the third T20I at Seddon Park and take an unassailable 3-0 lead in the five-match T20I series on Wednesday. New Zealand skipper Kane Williamson followed up his excellent 95 with an unbeaten 11 in the Super Over, but it just wasn't enough as Rohit and K.L. Rahul (5*) took Tim Southee to the cleaners. This after the game was tied as India pacer Mohammed Shami came up with a classic last over just when it looked like Williamson would take the Kiwis home with a batting master-class. It is for a reason that the Indian bowling attack is considered one of the best in the world and with Jasprit Bumrah having a one-off bad day, Shami rose to the



challenge and bowled a brilliant last over as New Zealand failed to score the 9 runs required despite Ross Taylor starting the over with a six. While Shami dismissed Williamson off the third ball of the over, he cleaned up Taylor (17) off the last ball with the Kiwis needing one run to win. Earlier, Williamson single-handedly took the game away from the Indians in the 17th of the innings - Bumrah's third. The Kiwi skipper picked 14 from the over to bring the required rate below the 10-run mark. Going into the 17th, New Zealand needed 43 off 24 balls. But at the end of the over, the Kiwis needed 29 from the last three overs. With Ross Taylor giving Williamson company, it was all about not doing anything reckless for the hosts. For the Indians, their failure to grab the opportunity with the bat was followed by some poor show on the field as even someone like Ravindra Jadeja dropped a catch, not to mention quite a few misfields.

New selection committee to pick squad for South Africa ODIs: Sourav Ganguly

Kolkata, Jan 29
The revamped selection committee with a new chairman at the helm will pick the Indian squad for the three ODIs at home in March, BCCI president Sourav Ganguly said on Monday. Laxman Sivaramakrishnan, Ajit Agarkar, Rajesh Chauhan and Venkatesh Prasad are some of the key contenders to replace outgoing chairman MSK Prasad (South zone) and Gagan Khoda (Central zone) in the five-member panel. "The Test squad for New Zealand has already been picked by the old committee and new committee's first meeting will be held before home ODI series against South Africa. The



interviews for short-listed candidates will happen soon," Ganguly said. The BCCI President also informed that while Madan Lal and Sulakshana Naik are the members of Cricket Advisory Committee (CAC), Gautam Gambhir is being replaced as he can not hold any position being a Member of Parliament. "We have decided on Gautam's replacement and the announcement will be made soon. Madan Lal and Sulakshana are there," he said. Meanwhile, Ganguly also informed that all-rounder Hardik Pandya has still not attained match fitness after his back surgery. "He can't play right now. It will take some time before he gets fit," the BCCI president said.

Alexander Zverev sweeps past Stan Wawrinka to make first Grand Slam semifinal

Melbourne, Jan 29
German young gun Alexander Zverev stormed into his first Grand Slam semi-final on Wednesday, rallying from a set down to shatter the dreams of veteran Stan Wawrinka at the Australian Open. The seventh seed was thumped in the first set but recovered to grind down the 2014 champion 1-6, 6-3, 6-4, 6-2 in hot sun on Rod Laver Arena. He will face either world number one Rafael Nadal or Austrian fifth seed Dominic Thiem in the last four, with a final beckoning against Novak Djokovic or Roger Federer. "It feels awesome," said



Zverev who has been donating \$10,000 for each win at Melbourne Park to Australian bushfire relief, and will even hand over the Aus\$4.12 million (\$2.78 million) winner's cheque if he clinches the title. "I've done well at other tournaments and in other matches but could never break that barrier in Grand Slams. You can't imagine what this means to me. "It hope it will be the first of many." Big things have been tipped for Zverev since he burst into the top 10 in 2017, but until now the 22-year-old has not fully delivered, slipping down the rankings last year to seven from four at the start of the season.

Javeline thrower Neeraj Chopra qualifies for Tokyo Olympics 2020

New Delhi, Jan 29
After recovering from an elbow injury, ace India javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra has qualified for the Tokyo 2020 Olympics with a throw of 87.86m at the Athletics Central North East meeting in South Africa. This was the Olympic medal hopeful's first competitive event after recovering from the injury. The Athletics Federation of India (AFI) also said that they've confirmed with their South African counterparts that it was a 'recognised international meet', and hence the Olympic cut has been made.



Neeraj's last major international competition was the 2018 Jakarta Asian Games last August where he won gold with a national record of 88.06m. The elbow injury had forced Neeraj to miss competitive action for the most part of 2019. He was expected to participate in the National Open Athletics Championship late last year, but the AFI decided to allow Neeraj more time to get competition ready.

studio or photographic facilities without having complete and authentic information, which may have the effect of lowering his reputation or infringing upon his privacy. 2. No reports in any media shall disclose, the identity of a child including his name, address, photograph, family details, school, neighborhood or any other particulars which may lead to disclosure of identity of the child: Provided that for reasons to be recorded in writing, the Special Court, competent to try the case under the Act, may permit such disclosure, if in its opinion such disclosure is in the interest of the child. 3. The publisher or owner of the media or studio or photographic facilities shall be jointly and severally liable for the acts and omissions of his employee. 4. Any person who contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1) or Sub-section (2) shall be liable to be punished with imprisonment of either description for a period which shall not be less than six months but which may extend to one year or with fine or with both. In view of the above, the Commission in accordance with its powers vested under Section 13 (i) (ii) of Commissions for Protection of Children Rights Act 2005 recommends, that specific and clear directions must be issued from your end to all competent officers including officer in charge of district police and local police stations for strict compliance of above mentioned child friendly provision of the Act. Further, it is also requested that if any media entity is found violating above provision of the Act, then action must be initiated against them without fail, a communication from Assistant Secretary (Home) said quoting the direction issued by the NCPCR.

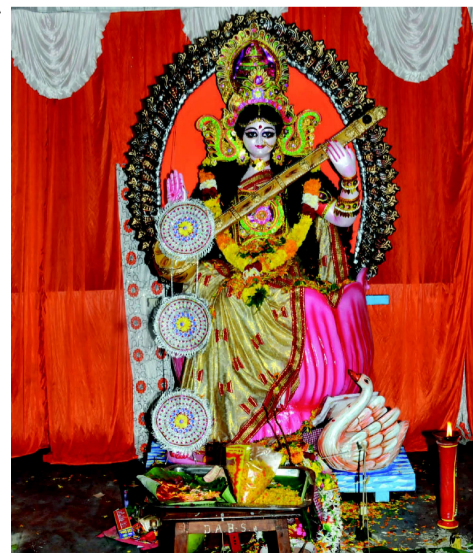
