PM reviews progress in railways and road sector



New Delhi, May 30
Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on Monday reviewed the progress in the key infrastructure sectors of railways and roads. In Railways sector, the capital investment in 2015-16 was over Rs. 93,000 crore, which represents a massive increase of 65 per cent over the previous year, and is the highest-ever.

Similarly, 1780 km of lines have been commissioned, and 1730 kilometres electrified during 2015-16, which represent the best performance on these metrics in railway history. Prime Minister Shri Modi stressed upon the need to speed up the redevelopment of Railway Stations and emphasized the need for the Railways to upgrade and diversify the uses of its infrastructure. He reiterated that railway infrastructure in rural areas could be used for activities such as skill development, and this could also result in an increase in non-fare revenue for the railways. In the roads sector, Prime Minister Shri Modi was informed that over 6000 kilometres of highways were completed in 2015-16, while contracts for another 10,098 kilometres were awarded in the same period. Prime Minister Shri Modi stressed on the need to study various models of road development across the country, and adopt the best practices, so that more private investment can be brought into the highway construction sector. He also stressed the need to decongest critical stretches, and adopt latest technologies for toll collection.

Kidney patients belonging to BPL category to get free dialysis facilities: Minister

New Delhi, May 30
Government has decided to start dialysis centre in every district of the country to provide treatment to kidney patients. Launching an e-book which is a compilation of achievements of his Ministry during two years, Health Minister Shri J P Nadda said in New Delhi that the dialysis centres will be opened under Public Private Partnership model for which 900 crore rupees have been allocated. He said, the patients belonging to the BPL category will avail the facility free of cost. He said, for patient belonging to APL category, the government is working on the modalities to provide the dialysis facility on a very nominal rate. Shri Nadda also announced to double the strength of beds in AIIMS, Delhi in two years. At present the existing capacity of beds in the premiere hospital is around 2700.

Foundation Stone laid for 20MW Solar Power Project at Attam Pahad Mega Project to reduce dependency on diesel generated electric power supply: LG

All Govt. Depts. directed to install roof top solar power panel



Port Blair, May 30
The Lt. Governor, Lt. Gen AK Singh (Retd.), today laid the foundation stone for a 20 MW Solar Power Project which will come up at Attam Pahad. The Lt. Governor unveiled the plaque to mark the foundation stone laying in the presence of the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray, the Chief Secretary, Shri Anindo Majumdar, Chairman-cum-MD, NLC, Shri S. K. Acharya, PBMC Chairperson, Smti Sheela Singh, Shri V.K. Jain, Advisor, MNRE, New Delhi, Shri Selva Kumar, Director (Planning & Project) NLC, Principal Secretary (Power), Shri Arun Baroka, senior officers of the Administration and Councilors of PBMC. Expressing his deep satisfaction over the upcoming project, the Lt. Governor said that top priority is being given to make these Islands 'Green' by introducing new and renewable sources of energy to reduce dependency on diesel generated power. He stated that it is the vision of the Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi to transform A&N Islands into 'Green Islands' and in this direction the project has been sanctioned and will be established by Neyveli Lignite Corporation Ltd (NLC). The cost will be borne on 50-50 basis by the Central Government and NLC, the Lt. Governor said. Similar projects are also planned at other location through NLC and NTPC for a total of 100 MW solar power. The Lt. Governor further informed that the Ministry of Petroleum and Natural Gas is considering the introduction of LNG generated power in the Islands, as a replacement for diesel. Highlighting the achievements of the A&N Islands, the Lt. Governor said that during the last few days, the Islands had witnessed many notable developments. The accordance of permission by MCI for the second term of MBBS course without any observation, selection of Port Blair as Smart City and unveiling of Veer Savarkar Jyot by BJP National President, Shri Amit Shahji at National Memorial, Cellular Jail are some of the major developments of the UT. The Lt. Governor also lauded the performance of students in the class X CBSE exams. He expressed his happiness over increase in the pass percentage from 84.29% last year to 97.81% this year, which is above the National average. He complimented the Principal Secretary (Edn.) and his team, as also the teachers, parents and students for this remarkable achievement. The Lt. Governor also urged the Government establishments to install rooftop solar power panels in their respective office buildings. He opined that commercial establishments should also set up their own power generation and reduce the dependency on Government generated power. The Lt. Governor also appealed to the officials of the Neyveli Lignite Corporation Ltd (NLC) to launch few initiatives as part of their Corporate Social Responsibility such as construction of public toilets in schools as well as public places.

The Lt. Governor also mentioned that people of the Islands are facing difficulty in getting refilled LPG Cylinder owing to shortage of distribution centres. He informed that proposal has been sent to the concerned Ministry for introducing more distribution centres and the issue was also taken up with Hon'ble Minister of Petroleum. The Lt. Governor said that everyone acknowledges that A&N Islands is moving at a fast pace of development. He attributed the successful implementation of various projects in the Islands due to the vision and guidance of the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi and the support of the people of A&N Islands. In his introductory address, the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray said that with the commencement of establishing the 20 WM Solar Power Project in the Islands, the vision of Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi is being materialized. Sandhu becomes first Indian to play in European top league

New Delhi, May 30
National football team goalkeeper Gurpreet Singh Sandhu has achieved a historic feat as he became the first Indian to feature in a top-tier league match in Europe by turning out for his Norwegian side Stabaek FC.

The 24-year-old Indian kept a clean sheet in his first Tippeligaen (Norwegian Premier League) start for Stabaek FC, helping them claim a dominant 5-0 triumph over IK Start in an away league match last night.

Sandhu, who signed for Stabaek FC in 2014, has not played in the Tippeligaen till yesterday though he has already featured in five matches in the Norwegian Cup. He has thus far played second fiddle to

Ivorian goalkeeper Sayouba Mande who is the first choice Stabaek FC goalkeeper. The Punjab lad took to Twitter to share his excitement after the match.

"Proud to become the First Indian ever to start in a Top Division League game in Europe!!!!," Sandhu tweeted. "Facing @ikstart tonight before the International break kicks in, need to finish on a good note @Stabaek #Tippeligaen," he wrote.

In many parts of Europe, league matches are over by this time of the year but the Norwegian top-tier league is held from March to November due to climatic reasons. Sandhu has been the number one goalkeeper in the Indian team since Stephen

Constantine took over last year, with the English coach preferring him to veteran Subrata Paul.

Sandhu will directly join the national football team in Laos where India are playing their play-off match of the 2019 Asian Cup Qualifiers on June 2.

Bengal footballer Mohammed Salim played for Scottish top-tier side Celtic FC in 1936, but most probably he did not feature in the premier division. Records about Salim's two-month sojourn in Scotland are sketchy. After India's Independence, former captain Bhaichung Bhutia played for English third division side Bury FC in 1999-2000 and current national skipper Sunil Chhetri played for the 'B' team of Sporting Lisbon in 2012. Bengaluru, May 30
Riding on brilliant all-round performance, Sunrisers Hyderabad, defeated Royal Challengers Bangalore by eight runs to clinch their maiden Indian Premier League title in a high-octane summit clash at the Chinnaswamy stadium in Bangalore last night.

Chasing the target of 209 runs, Bangalore got off to a flying start as Chris Gayle (76) and Skipper Virat Kohli (54) laid a perfect platform and forged 114 run partnership.

But after the fall of the openers, no other batsman could contribute much, as a result they only managed to score 200 runs for seven in 20 overs. Earlier, propelled by skipper

Novak Djokovic poised to become first man to win \$100 million in prize money

Paris, May 30
World number one Novak Djokovic is poised to become the first man to win \$100 million in prize money on Monday when he targets a place in the French Open quarter-finals for the 10th time.

Djokovic, chasing a first Roland Garros title to complete a career Grand Slam, tackles Spain's 14th seed Roberto Bautista Agut.

The top seeded Serb has a 4-0 career lead over the 28-year-old Bautista Agut including a victory on clay in Madrid this season where the Spaniard won just three games.

Djokovic is also bidding to reach the quarter-finals for the 28th straight Grand Slam and



take sole occupancy of second place ahead of Jimmy Connors for the most consecutive last-eight appearances at the majors. With \$99,673,404 banked in prize money at the start of Roland Garros, the 29-year-old Djokovic can cross the \$100 million barrier by making the last-eight.

A place in the quarter-finals is worth 294,000 euros (\$326,722) and that will just take the Serb into the \$100,000,000 bracket.

Roger Federer is Djokovic's closest rival in the prize money stakes on \$98,011,727 but the Swiss is sitting out Roland Garros through injury.

The Modus Operandi of such commens is to accept money from some gullible candidates on the pretext that they shall be able to use their influence to get them selected. But, in reality they are in no position to exert any such influence. All through, all the candidates get finally selected on their merit but out of the final list whosoever is selected these commens keep the money taken from such gullible candidate. Thus, the candidates who have

been rightfully selected are duped to pay money. And the rest who did not make the final list, their money is returned after retaining a portion of it as 'expenses already incurred' and at times also excuses are made such as that they were late in joining the scheme, etc.

All members of the public and all candidates are warned not to be misled and cheated by such cheats.

The A&N Police will always go strictly by merit. Strict legal action shall be initiated against any such cheats.

The public as well as the candidates are advised that if they have any such information about such cheats they may give this information to SP (CID) on

03192- 233307 or SP(Anti-Corruption) on 03192-240840 or SP(HQ) on 03192-230841. The information shall be kept strictly confidential and the informant shall also be suitably rewarded.
