## India seeks US help for missing AN-32 aircraft

New Delhi, Jul 30 Union Defence Minister Shri Manohar Parrikar has told Parliament that India has sought help from US to check if their satellites captured any signals from the missing AN-32 aircraft, while noting there was very little possibility that sabotage played any role. Giving clarifications on the missing aircraft in the Rajya Sabha, the minister said he was disturbed at the aircraft's sudden

disappearance, and even experts are puzzled. Assuring the house that the aircraft had "adequate lifetime", Shri Parrikar also said that maximum efforts are being made to reduce accidents and also that any aircraft not fit for flying was not flown. He also said that the aircraft had undergone its first overhaul, and had already flown for 179 hours after that. The pilot had flown

Port Blair, July 30 Nicobar - Campbell Bay. Accordingly, IAF will operate weekly two flights for the civilian passengers on every Monday and Friday from the Inter-Island helicopter terminal at Port Blair. The services will commence on 5th August, 2016. As per the schedule, the IAF Dornier will depart from Port Blair at 8 am and reach Car Nicobar at 9 am. From Car Nicobar it will depart at 9.45 am and will reach Campbell Bay at 10.45 am. On its return flight the aircraft will depart from Campbell Bay at 11.30 am and reach Car Nicobar at 12.30 pm. **IWF bans Russian team from Rio Olympics**

London, Jul 30 International Weightlifting Federation (IWF) has formally suspended an 8-member Russian team from next month's Rio Olympics due to doping offences. IWF said in a statement that Russian competitors had been named in the McLaren Report commissioned by the World Anti-Doping Agency that exposed evidence of state-backed cheating. Last month, IWF Executive Board had decided to suspend for a year national federations that



produced three or more doping violations in re-tests from the 2008 and 2012 Olympic Games - made possible by improved detection techniques. It named Russia, along with Kazakhstan and Belarus, but said it would await confirmation of the positive tests from the International Olympic Committee before implementing the suspension.

The Lt. Governor also informed that the foundation stone for Medical College building will be laid shortly.

He further stated that the existing School of Nursing will be upgraded to College of Nursing under ANIIMS and the new college will start from August-September 2016 with an intake of 40 students.

He further said that a 'Trauma Care Centre' will be created this year with facilities of super specialists to treat accident cases. The Lt Governor said that a Cancer Care Centre will also be established with Oncology (Medicine and Surgery) and radiation and a Heart Care Centre by next year. He said courses for paramedical staff will be planned to commence next year. The Lt Governor informed about the scheme of 'Maternal and Child Care' under which a 100 bed hospital can be created. He asked the Chief Secretary and the Principal Secretary Health to look into it and take immediate steps to assess the feasibility.

Exhorting the students on the occasion, the Lt. Governor urged them to look beyond themselves and strive towards giving their best in all their endeavours. He said, "You are the hope and future of our country and you have to reach your right destination". He urged the students to work hard and ensure to live up to the expectations of their parents and the society at large. He exhorted them to be dedicated and remain optimistic with the motto "I can, I shall, I will".

Keeping in view the requirements of the students, the Lt. Governor directed the Transport Department to ensure that regular bus services are made available coinciding with the timing of the college for the convenience of students. He directed the APWD to carry out the left out work and ensure that the entire college building is completed by next year.

The Lt. Governor concluded his speech by reiterating his commitment to the well being and welfare of the Islanders and stated that he would always remain a stakeholder in the development of these Islands.

Addressing the gathering on the occasion, the Member of Parliament, Shri Bishnu Pada Ray firstly thanked the Lt. Governor for his vision and great efforts in opening the college. The Member of Parliament also emphasised the need for including professional courses in the Islands and urged the Lt. Governor to open one Polytechnic each in Nicobar District and Diglipur. Further, the MP informed the gathering that during a meeting held on July 4, the Ministry of Road Transport & Highway has accorded approval for construction of two lane National Highway on Andaman Trunk Road (ATR) by NHIDCL, which will start working on this from October 2016 onwards. He also mentioned the CRZ clearance will also be granted by August 2016 and the work for the construction of the bridges in the Islands will begin soon.

The MP also informed that a 50 MW LNG Petronet Power House will be installed at Shore Point soon for the benefit of the Islanders. Regarding Sainik School the MP informed that the Defence Ministry will recommend the same during the next budget while funds for constructing Navodaya Vidyalaya in A&N Islands will be provided by Central Govt. The Member of Parliament also complimented the girls of Music Department of ANCOL, who presented the welcome song, on the occasion.

Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Anindo Majumdar stated that the inauguration of the ANCOL building today is a big and important milestone in the history of the Isles, particularly in the education sector. While the JNRM was established in 1967 in the Islands, the ANCOL was established in 2014 here under RUSA Scheme. The Chief Secretary hailed the team of APWD and others for construction of the building within the specified time. He also complimented the Lt. Governor for choosing such a picturesque location for the College and called upon the faculty to provide quality education to the students, to motivate them in reaching highest level of education. The Chief Secretary also emphasized the need for providing Science education, basic and pure Science, to students, which he said is the need of the country at present.
