PM Modi urges nation to work relentlessly towards making a new India

New Delhi, Jul 30

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi today urged the nation to come together and work relentlessly towards making a new India. In his 'Mann Ki Baat' programme on All India Radio, Shri Modi said, in this month of August, the people should resolve to eradicate social evils like filth, poverty, corruption, terrorism, casteism and communalism. He called for launching a mega campaign 'Sankalp Se Siddhi - Attainment through Resolve' from 9th of August to be fulfilled in the next five years.

The Prime Minister said, just as the five years from 1942 to 1947 were decisive for the country's independence, five years from now till 2022 can and must play a decisive role for the future of India. He said, this year's 15th August should be celebrated as 'Sankalp Parv' or the day of resolve and in 2022 marking 75 years of freedom, the nation will certainly transform into 'Siddhi'.

On the Goods and Services Tax (GST), Shri Modi expressed happiness and satisfaction that its benefits are reaching the poor. Referring to current floods in certain parts of the country particularly in Assam, Gujarat, Rajasthan and West Bengal, Shri Modi said, the Central government, armed forces and personnel, NDRF and para military personnel are doing their best in providing relief to the



disaster-stricken people. He said, government has formulated a scheme, especially crop insurance, to ensure quick settlements of farmers' claims. The Prime Minister also said, Indian festivals and its celebrations are not merely occasions of joy and merriment but are campaigns of social reform. He said, the poor get an opportunity to earn an

income during Rakshabandhan, Janmashtami, Ganesh Utsav, Chauth Chandra, Durga Pooja and Diwali and this adds a spontaneous joy to the festivities. Shri Modi said, this year marks the 125th anniversary of community Ganesh Festival which was started by Lokmanya Tilak to inculcate the spirit of unity, enhance awareness in society and promote the

culture of togetherness. Stating that Indian daughters are bringing laurels to the country in all fields, the Prime Minister said, Indian women cricket team performed brilliantly in the recently held women cricket world cup. The Prime Minister also invited people to send their views either on mygov platform or on Narendra Modi app for this year's Independence Day speech.

Research not be mandatory for college teachers' promotions: HRD Minister

New Delhi, Jul 30

Union HRD Minister Shri Prakash Javadekar has said, his Ministry is going to do away with the mandatory clause of research for college teachers to get their promotions. Speaking at a function in New Delhi yesterday, he said, an official announcement in this regard will follow soon.

Shri Javadekar said, College teachers will no longer be mandated to conduct research to be eligible for promotions but would be required to be engaged more in community activities with students. The Minister was speaking at a two-day national conference on higher education perspective in India.

Shri Javadekar said, making changes in the Academic Performance Index (API), a criterion on which teachers get their promotions, the HRD Ministry is working on a plan to make research optional for college teachers. He said, University teachers who are supposed to teach the post graduate students or guide M Phil and PhD scholars will be required to engage in research.

K. Sahu, quashing such rumors while speaking to 'The Daily Telegrams' recently, stated that RBI has not issued any such instruction and as on date Rs. 10 coin is a legal tender. He further stated that a person cannot refuse to take the Rs. 10 coin and if they do so, they must give in writing and will be held responsible.

When asked about the rumour of fake Rs.10 coin in circulation in the market, the Regional Manager said banks have not received any such complaint, and all bank branches are accepting Rs.10 coin, adding that such rumour should be quashed and people should be made aware of the reality.

Mann Ki Baat: Don't feel burdened by World Cup defeat: PM Modi to Women's team

New Delhi, July 30
 Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said he had advised the Indian women's cricket team not to feel burdened by the World Cup final defeat since they had backing of the nation. Indian team ended runner-up at the prestigious ICC event after losing the final to England narrowly by nine runs. Their unexpected performance in the World Cup followed a host of felicitations after the team's arrival and Shri Modi too hosted the entire squad at his residence here. "I felt happy talking to them, but I had a feeling that they felt burdened by the fact that they could not win the World Cup. This stress, this tension was evident on their faces also," Shri Modi recalled during his



"Mann Ki Baat" address today. I said, Look, this is the age of the media. So expectations get hyped up to such an extent that if corresponding success is not achieved, these turn into despair and even resentment." Shri Modi said India chose to

praise the women cricketers instead of criticising them for their defeat in the final. "But it happened for the first time that when our daughters did not succeed in winning the World Cup, the hundred and twenty-five million people took this defeat on their own shoulders, never letting the burden weigh down these daughters of ours. "Not only this, they lauded them and showered them with high praise for their brilliant performance. I view this as a healthy and pleasant change and I told these daughters that only they were blessed with such good fortune, and hence they should banish any thought of not having been successful. You may not have won the final match but you have won the hearts of 1.25 billion Indians," he said.

India beat Kazakhstan to win Division B of FIBA Women's Asia Cup



Bengaluru, Jul 30
 The Indian women's basketball team defeated Kazakhstan 75-73 in a thrilling contest of the FIBA Asia Cup 2017 held at Sree Kanteerava Stadium in Bengaluru. In the Division B Final yesterday between two undefeated league teams, India and Kazakhstan, it was the home team that came out victorious. In a cliffhanger, trailing at 31-39 at one stage, India rallied back brilliantly to

clinch the trophy. Kazakhstan held the size advantage over the Indian team and this was punctuated by the play of Kazakh centre Nadezhda Kondrakova. She was able to score from inside and outside to begin the game. For India, the scoring came from a balanced team effort. Shireen was the aggressive one and held her drives to the basket, while guards Paul Durai and Raspreet created

space to knock down their jumpers. Delighted with the victory, Basketball Federation of India president K Govindaraj has announced a cash prize of 10 lakh rupees for the Indian squad. India are now promoted to Division A for the next edition of the FIBA Women's Asia Cup. In Division A Final, Japan won 74-73 against fancied Australia.

India bags 24 medals at Jordan Open TT

 India have bagged a rich haul of 24 medals at the Jordan Junior and Cadet Open table tennis tournament. The tally includes seven Gold, seven Silver and 10 Bronze medals. In the event held at Amman, India ended as the second best finishers. In the cadet singles final, Payas Jain had to be satisfied with the silver after going down to Taipei boy Hsu p-Hsuan 4-11, 6-11, 6-11. The team title was denied to India in the cadet section when Payas, Yashansh Malik and Chinmaya Somaiya found the going tough against Hsu Po-Hsuan, Lin



Yen-Cun and Peng Chih who claimed the gold. Payas, however, overcame Iran's Mohammad Amin Samadi to win the boys singles title with a 11-5, 11-9, 12-10

He told reporters in Indore yesterday, that a fillip is going to be provided to the search for uranium deposits to enhance nuclear fuel production in the country. At present, India has 2.70 lakh tonnes of uranium deposits. Shri Basu said, that even half of its excavate is enough to run the existing nuclear projects.
