India, Italy ink six pacts to bolster bilateral cooperation

New Delhi, Oct 30
India and Italy signed six agreements today in various fields including trade and investment, railways and energy. The agreements were exchanged in the presence of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and visiting Italy Prime Minister Mr Paolo Gentiloni in New Delhi. Both leaders held delegation-level talks and reviewed the entire gamut of bilateral strategic partnership. In a joint statement after exchange of MoUs, Prime Minister Shri Modi said, several aspects of



cooperation between India and Italy were discussed in the meeting. Shri Modi said, regional and world affairs were discussed and India and Italy are on the same page in the fight against terrorism. He said, both countries are committed to fight unitedly against terror. The Prime Minister also said that India and Italy are committed to enhance tourism and people-to-

people ties and there is enough space to expand bilateral relations in many areas.

Saying that there is much scope for increase in commercial cooperation, Shri Modi encouraged Italian participation in his government's flagship programmes like Smart Cities, and sectors like infrastructure and food processing.

The Italian Prime Minister, in his media interaction, said, India and Italy have a common approach on climate change, counter-terrorism and democracy. Mr Gentiloni said, the

Coast Guard apprehends Indonesian fishing boat; 39 crew for illegal fishing

Port Blair, Oct 30

In a sea - air coordinated operation, the Indian Coast Guard today apprehended an Indonesian fishing vessel with 39 crew, which was illegally fishing in Indian waters 140 Kms South-East of Indra Point, Great Nicobar Island. The fishing boat 'SaudaraBahagia' was first sighted by Coast Guard Dornier aircraft on patrol on Oct 29, and Coast Guard Ship Rajshree was diverted to the area for investigation. The ship upon arrival in area sighted the Indonesian boat engaged in fishing activity in the Indian Exclusive Economic Zone which was in clear violation to the Maritime Zones of India



on patrol 24x7, monitoring activities in the Indian EEZ and protecting the sovereign rights of our country within the Maritime Zones. In case of any violations of the Indian laws and regulations,

A meeting on Special Summary Revision of Electoral Rolls for the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Parliamentary Constituency, with the 1st January, 2018 as the qualifying date, was held in the conference hall of Secretariat here today. The Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), A & N Islands Parliamentary Constituency, Ms Tanvi Garg presided over the meeting.

Briefing the Assistant Electoral Registration Officers and other officials present in the meeting, who are involved in the process of Special Summary Revision works, the CEO exhorted them to diligently take up the work, so that



no qualified voter is left out. They may seek the help of public representatives in identifying eligible voters. Special campaigns will be conducted on November 11 & 25, 2017 after which all eligible voters will be enrolled in the Electoral Rolls, she said. The CEO advised the officials to submit the revised Electoral Rolls in time to the CEO office so

that timely publicity of the same can be made and eligible voters can file claims and objections. She also informed them that the duty is of statutory nature and need to be performed with seriousness and dedication. The final publication of Electoral rolls will be done on Jan 13, 2018.

Not just Virat Kohli, Mithali Raj too climbs to No. 1 in ODI rankings

Dubai, Oct 30
After a series-winning weekend, Monday brought more smiles for Indian cricket as captains Virat Kohli and Mithali Raj climbed to No. 1 spots in the ODI rankings released by the International Cricket Council (ICC).
While Kohli reclaimed the numero uno spot he lost to South Africa's AB de Villiers ten days ago, the Indian women's team captain, Mithali, led the ODI rankings for batswomen ahead of Ellyse Perry of Australia and Amy Satterthwaite of New Zealand. However, Meg Lanning of Australia dropped from first to fourth position after missing the series against England due to injury. Kohli's 32nd ODI century on Sunday not only helped India win the series against New Zealand 2-1 but also perched him back on top as the best batsman in ODIs, with career-high rating points of 889, which broke the Indian record that



previously stood in the name of Kohli and Sachin Tendulkar jointly at 887 points. Mithali topped the charts with 753 points, while Perry and Satterthwaite stood at 725 and 720 points respectively. Among women bowlers, Jhulan Goswami remained at second spot with 652 rating points, behind Marizanne Kapp (656) of South Africa. In the men's ICC Rankings for ODI batsmen, behind Kohli at No. 1 and De Villiers (872 points) at No. 2 is Australia's vice-captain David Warner with 865 points. The 28-year-old Kohli scored

263 runs in the series against New Zealand, including knocks of 121 in the first ODI in Mumbai and 113 in the final ODI in Kanpur. Former India captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni is up one place to 11th, while New Zealand batsman Tom Latham's good show in the series has seen him jump 15 places to a career-best 23rd. India's 2-1 win over New Zealand, however, was not enough for them to overtake South Africa, who continue to hold the top ranking in the ICC ODI Team Rankings at 121 points, ahead of India by two points.

Kidambi Srikanth is fast court king with his fourth Super Series title of 2017

Paris, Oct 30
Indians might still be putting together the jigsaw of getting the fastest tearaway in cricket, but in the meantime, badminton is offering the country some pure, unbridled rush of blood. On Sunday, Kidambi Srikanth beat Japan's Kenta Nishimoto 21-14, 21-13 in Paris to win the French Open Super Series crown, his fourth Super Series title of the year, further cementing his status as badminton's King of Pace.



"In conditions like where he has won, on fast courts, Srikanth is clearly the best player in the world right now," coach Pulela Gopichand declared. Srikanth is now only the fourth men's singles player to win four or more Super Series titles in a calendar year. The 24-year-old's 2017 titles include two back-to-back wins (that's 20 matches; 10 unbeaten each time).

But it's his utter dominance in fast courts, playing at an intimidating speed, that has been the feature of his tremendous run this year. There's no top player Srikanth hasn't sent packing in the course of the last six months, all on fast courts.

Indian women's hockey team beat China 4-1 in Asia Cup



Singapur, Oct 30
Indian eves dished out an all-round performance to stun China 4-1 and register their second consecutive victory at the women's Asia Cup hockey tournament. Goals from Gurjit Kaur (19th minute), Navjot Kaur (32nd), Neha Goyal (49th) and skipper Rani Rampal (58th) enabled the Indians to keep their winning momentum in Pool A at Kakamigahara Kawasaki Stadium. India had earlier defeated

Singapore 10-0 in their tournament opener. The Indians were quick to get off the blocks as they won a penalty corner in the first 15 minutes of the match to put China on the back foot. The first quarter ended in a stalemate after India wasted the chance. But four minutes into the second quarter dragflick specialist Gurjit Kaur convert a splendid goal to give India a 1-the lead. Two minutes after the change

of ends, India doubled their through Navjot Kaur's field strike. But a defensive error in the circle saw India concede a penalty corner in the 38th minute and the Chinese were quick to capitalise on the opportunity and pulled one goal back through Qiuxia Cui's successful conversion. Down by a goal, China pushed hard in search of the equaliser in the final quarter but failed to break the resolute Indian defence.

Hamilton wins fourth F1 championship, Verstappen wins Mexican Grand Prix

Mexico City, Oct 30
Lewis Hamilton became Britain's first four-times Formula One world champion at the Mexican Grand Prix on Sunday despite enduring his worst race of the season. In a race won by Red Bull's Dutch 20-year-old Max Verstappen, the 32-year-old Mercedes driver fought back from last place to ninth after a first lap collision with Ferrari rival Sebastian Vettel. Vettel, the only man who could



have denied him the championship, started on pole position and finished fourth after having to pit for a new front wing at the end of the

first lap and dropping to 19th. Hamilton now has an unassailable lead of 56 points with two races, worth a total of 50, remaining.
