account, maintained by the contesting candidates in the prescribed register together with the supporting documents shall be made available for inspection during the campaign period. The inspection shall be done by the Expenditure Officer (EO) appointed by

the Election Commission of India (ECI) at the Conference Hall of DC Office, South Andaman as per the schedule given below. All contesting candidates should ensure that they make their records available for inspection at the designated place before the EO.

**Manu Bhaker, Saurabh Chaudhary
triumph as India continue domination in
Asian Airgun Championships**

Taoyuan, Mar 29
Young pistol shooters Manu Bhaker and Saurabh Chaudhary on Friday clinched a gold medal each, their second in the competition, as India continued their domination at the 12th Asian Airgun Championships in Taoyuan, Chinese Taipei.



Manu won the women's 10m Air Pistol on day three of the competition while Saurabh bagged a team gold in the men's event. Abhishek Verma also won an individual silver in the men's 10m Air Pistol, rounding off a profitable day for himself after the disappointments in the mixed events. The women's pistol team also won a bronze to further bolster India's tally to five gold, three silver and one bronze medals with half the competition still to go.

Manu shot 575 out of 600 to qualify in second place and then was involved in a pitched battle with Shing Ho Ching of Hong Kong for most parts of the 24-shot final, before finishing stronger in the end stages. She shot a score of 239 against Shing's 237.9 while UAE's Wafa Alali bagged the bronze. Shri Nivetha of India, who had also reached the final, finished sixth. In the men's event, all three Indians made the finals. Saurabh topped with 587, while Ravinder was fourth to qualify with 578. Abhishek, in fact, was the lowest ranked Indian among the eight qualifiers, fifth with 577, but was the only one to land a medal. Abhishek shot 240.7 and lost out to Korea's Mose Kim by 0.2 points to settle for silver. Saurabh (198.8) went down to bronze medalist Taehwan Lee of Korea in a shoot-off to finish fourth while Ravinder was seventh with 136.3 points. The trio though picked up the team gold over the Koreans with a total of 1742, a clear 12 points ahead of their nearest rival.

**Sultan Azlan Shah Cup: India
thrash Poland 10-0**

Ipoh, Mar 29
Striker Mandeep Singh continued his prolific form by scoring a brace as India mauled a hapless Poland 10-0 in their final league match of Sultan Azlan Shah Cup hockey tournament in Ipoh on Friday. Already assured of a summit clash against Korea - to be played on Saturday - before this match, the Indians scored goals almost at will which left the Polish players in daze. The second quarter was the most productive with the Indians finding the target four times. They were 6-0 up at the half time, before adding four more in the remaining 30 minutes to wallop the Polish team in the inconsequential



match. Five-time India thus maintained their unbeaten streak in the tournament, collecting 13 points from five league matches with the help of four wins and a draw. Mandeep struck back-to-back goals in the 50th and 51st minutes to take his goal tally to seven in the tournament. The 24-year-old striker had scored a hat-trick in India's 7-3 win over Canada on Wednesday. Varun Kumar (18th and 25th) also struck twice while Vivek Prasad (1st), Sumit Kumar (7th), Surender Kumar (19th), Simranjeet Singh (29th), Nilankanta Sharma (36th) and Amit Rohitdas (55th) were the other goal-scorers for India.

under Section 171-I of IPC shall be filed. Besides this, if the candidate does not produce the register after three days of serving of the notice, the permission given to the candidate for use of vehicles during elections will be withdrawn.

PRESS NOTE

Restriction on the printing on pamphlets, posters etc.

It is brought to the notice of all concerned that :-
Section 127A of the RP Act, 1951 imposes restrictions on the printing of pamphlets, posters etc. ;

- No person shall print or publish, or cause to be printed or published, any election pamphlet or poster which does not bear on its face the names and addresses of the printer and the publisher thereof.
- No person shall print or cause to be printed any election pamphlet or poster:
 - Unless a declaration as to the identity of the publisher thereof, signed by him and attested by two persons to whom he is personally known, is delivered by him to the printer in duplicate; and
 - Unless within a reasonable time after printing of the document, one copy of the declaration is sent by the printer, together with one copy of the document;
 - Where it is printed in the capital of the State, to the Chief Electoral Officer; and
 - In any other case, to the district magistrate of the district in which it is printed.
 - For the purposes of this section: -
 - Any process for multiplying copies of a document, other than copying it by hand, shall be deemed to be printing and the expression "printer" shall be construed accordingly, and
 - "election pamphlet or poster" means any printed pamphlet, and bill or other document distributed for the purpose of promoting or prejudicing the election of a candidate or group of candidates or any placard or poster having reference to an election, but does not include any handbill, placard or poster merely announcing the date, time, place and other particular of an election meeting or routine instructions to election agents or workers.
- Before undertaking the printing of any election pamphlets or posters, etc., printer shall obtain from the publisher a declaration in terms of Section 127A (2) in the pro-forma prescribed by the Commission. This declaration shall be duly signed by the publisher and attested by two persons to whom the publisher is personally known. It should also be authenticated by the printer when it is forwarded to the Chief Electoral Officer or the District Magistrate, as the case may be.
- The printing presses shall send the copies of the printed material (along with three extra copies of each such printed material) and the declaration obtained from the publisher as required under Section 127A (2) within three days of its printing.
- It is also informed that any violation of the provisions of Section 127A and the above directions of the Commission would be very seriously viewed and stern action, which may in appropriate cases include even the revocation of the license of the printing press under the relevant laws of the State, would be taken.
- The printer shall furnish four (4) copies of the printed material, along with the declaration of the publisher, within three (3) days of the printing thereof. Along with such printed material and the declaration, the printer shall also furnish the information regarding number of copies of document printed and the price charged for such printing job. Such information shall be furnished by the printer, not collectively but separately, in respect of each election pamphlets, posters, etc., printed by him within three (3) days of the printing of each such document.
- It should be brought to the notice of all concerned that hoardings, flex boards etc. containing any election related advertisement shall be treated as coming within the purview of "poster" as defined under Section 127A. The requirement for giving the name and address of the publisher should be followed in the case of hoarding, flex board including on hoardings of photos of party leaders.
- In terms of directions of the Commission in the case of hoarding, flex board etc, prior permission is required to be obtained from the owner of the property before displaying them. In case of such materials whether in public place or private premises, the party/candidate concerned has to give information to the Returning Officer as per format attached with the Commission's letter no. 3/7/2008/J.S. II dated 7th October, 2008 along with two photographs of such hoardings/flex boards.
- It is further brought to the notice of all Candidates and Political Parties that in respect of surrogate advertisements that appear in print media, especially newspapers for and against particular political parties and candidates during election period. In many cases such advertisements are for the prospects of election of particular candidate. As per section 77 (1) of the Representation of People Act, 1951, expenditure involved in such advertisements in connection with the election of any candidate has to be added to the account of election expenses of the candidate, required to be maintained under that Section.
 - In the case of advertisements, the source which is not traceable, the following action shall be taken: -
 - If the advertisement is with the consent or knowledge of the candidate, it will be treated to have been authorized by the candidate (s) concerned and will be accounted for in the election expenses account of the candidate (s);
 - If the advertisement is not with the authority from the candidate, then action will be taken for prosecution of the publisher for violation of Section 171H of IPC-(incurring expenditure in advertisement without written authority from the candidate (s) concerned.
 - Identity of the publisher should be indicated in the advertisement.
