## ISRO successfully conducts reusable launch vehicle autonomous landing mission in Karnataka

Bengaluru, April 2

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has successfully carried out the Reusable Launch Vehicle Autonomous Landing Mission in Karnataka. The test of Reusable Launch Vehicle (RLV) LEX was conducted at the Aeronautical Test Range in Chitradurga in the early hours today. A Chinook Helicopter of the Indian Air Force carried the launch vehicle to a height of 4.5 kms and released it in mid-air. Based on 10 parameters like velocity, altitude and approach, the Reusable Launch Vehicle performed the landing maneuvers at 350 kilometers



per hour speed, using the integrated navigation, guidance and control system and completed autonomous landing on the air strip at 7.40 am today. This has successfully achieved the autonomous precise landing of the Space vehicle. The navigation systems, instrumentation and sensors were developed

by ISRO in-house. CEMILAC, ADE and ADRE contributed to the test along with ISRO and IAF. With this successful test, the dream of developing a Reusable Space Vehicle in India has taken ISRO one step closer to realising that dream. ISRO Chairman, Shri S Somnath along with Senior Scientists from ISRO, namely Dr S Unnikrishnan Nair, Shyam Mohan, Dr. Jayakumar, Ramakrishna and Muthupandian witnessed the test and congratulated the team. ## India's defence exports reach all-time high of Rs 16,000 crore

New Delhi, April 2

India has achieved a remarkable milestone as the country witnessed an all-time high level of defence export worth approx 16,000 crore rupees to over 85 countries. In only six years, defence export surged over 10 times amid number of reforms and policy initiatives taken by the Government. In a tweet, Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi described the achievement as a clear manifestation of India's talent and enthusiasm towards 'Make in India'. Shri Modi said, it also shows the reforms in this sector over the last few years are delivering good results. He said, Government will keep supporting efforts to make India a defence production hub. Defence Minister, Shri Rajnath Singh, in a tweet, described it as a remarkable achievement for the country. He said, under the inspiring leadership of Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, the Defence exports will continue to grow exponentially. 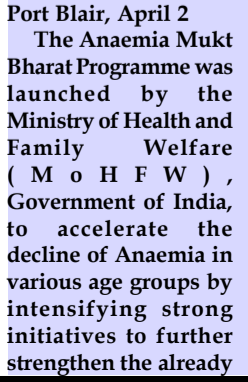

and is a significant step towards financial inclusion and empowerment of the women, including the girls.

The two year tenure scheme offers an attractive and fixed interest of 7.5 per cent interest compounded quarterly with flexible investment and partial withdrawal options with a maximum ceiling of rupees two lakh. The scheme is valid for a two-year period upto 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2025.

National Savings (Monthly Income Account) Scheme, 2019 has been amended through National Savings (Monthly Income Account) (Amendment) Scheme, 2023 and the maximum investment limit has been raised from rupees four lakh fifty thousand to rupees nine lakh for a single account and from rupees nine lakh to rupees 15 lakh for a joint account with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2023. Likewise, Senior Citizen Savings Scheme, 2019 has been amended through Senior Citizens Savings (Amendment) Scheme, 2023 and the maximum investment limit has been raised from rupees 15 lakh to rupees 30 lakh with effect from April 1, 2023.

Interest rates on all the small savings schemes, except Savings Deposit and PPF, have also been upwardly revised with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> April, 2023. These measures will immensely benefit the post office small savings customers and attract more investment in these schemes through Post Offices, especially in rural areas and amongst girls, women, farmers, artisans, senior citizens, factory workers, Government employees, small traders and other sections of the society. the means of six interventions and six institutional mechanisms to achieve its goal of reducing Anaemia under the POSHAN Abhiyan. These beneficiaries are Children (6-59 months), Children (5-9 years), adolescent boys and girls (10-19 years), women of reproductive age (20-49 years), pregnant women and lactating women.

Anaemia Mukht Bharat has 6 Strategic Interventions. They are Prophylactic Iron and Folic Acid (IFA) Supplementation; De-worming; Intensified Year-Round Behaviour Change Communication Campaign; Testing and Treatment of Anaemia with Focus on Pregnant Women and School going Adolescents; Mandatory Provision of Iron and Folic Acid Fortified Foods; Intensifying Awareness, Screening and treatment of Non-Nutritional causes of Anaemia in endemic pockets with special focus on Malaria, Haemoglobinopathies and Fluorosis.

Anaemia Mukht Bharat Programme is being implemented successfully in the Islands through Schools, Anganwadi Centres, Health & Wellness Centres and VHND platforms. It has significantly reduced the prevalence of Anaemia across various age groups, a press release from DHS said.

**Narcotics Cell of CID Unit seizes ganja; two arrested**

Acting on a specific intelligence input received from reliable source, Police team from Narcotics Cell, CID Unit consisting of Sub-Inspector M.A Rasheed, Constables K. Rajendran & Raja Rao intercepted one person namely Sukdeb Biswas, S/o Late. Harendra Nath Biswas (40) yrs, R/o Chaturiya, Noarpara, Dist North 24 Pargnas, West Bengal at VSI Airport near parking area, who had arrived at Port Blair from Kolkata on 28/03/2023 by flight. About 3.397 kgs of Ganja which was concealed in his bags was seized from him and the said person was arrested on the spot observing all codal formalities. **Green Hydrogen has emerged as promising pathway for meeting the decarbonisation goals: Secy. MNRE**

New Delhi, April 2

The Secretary, Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Shri Bhupinder Singh Bhalla on Sunday said that Green Hydrogen has emerged as the promising pathway for meeting the decarbonisation goals. He was delivering his address at a side event on Green Hydrogen Accelerating Net- Zero Pathways, organised as part of the Second Energy Transitions Working Group (ETWG) meeting under India's G20 Presidency. The three-day meeting which began today is being held at Gandhinagar in Gujarat. Shri Bhalla informed that India has announced its ambitious energy emission target under which there is a target of installing 500 Giga Watt of Non-fossils electricity capacity by 2030. He added that the country has decided to be energy independent by 2047 and Net Zero emissions by 2070. The Secretary, MNRE mentioned that the Government has launched the National Green Hydrogen Mission this year with an aim to position India as a leader in the global clean energy transition. Aero India-2023 are proof of the country's growing defence manufacturing capabilities.

To give a push to defence exports, Government has taken a number of policy initiatives and brought reforms over the last 5-6 years. Export procedures have been simplified and made industry-friendly with end-to-end online export authorisation curtailing delays and bringing Ease of Doing Business.

Government has notified three Open General Export License (OGEL) for export of Parts and Components, transfer of technology and major platforms and equipment. Today, India, which was known as an importer about eight years back, exports various defence products including Brahmos Missiles, Akash Missile System, Radars, PINAKA Rockets & Launchers, ICA-Tejas, Light Combat Helicopters and Aircraft Carriers.
