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Pregnant Women now eligible for COVID-19 Vaccination

Can register on CoWIN or walk-in to the nearest COVID Vaccination Centre to get themselves vaccinated

New Delhi, July 2 (PIB) decision has been communicated to all the States/ UTs to implement it under the ongoing National COVID Vaccination Program. India's National COVID Vaccination program incorporates the recommendations of the foremost experts in the field of immunization, public health, disease control and information technology. Based on scientific and epidemiological evidence, the programme gives priority to strengthening the country's healthcare system by protecting the professionals, health and frontline workers, manning it, as well as protecting the most vulnerable population groups. Till date, all groups except pregnant women were eligible for COVID-19 vaccination. Now, it is expanded to even pregnant women in the world's largest Immunization drive. Studies have shown that COVID-19 infection during pregnancy may result in rapid deterioration of health of pregnant women and they are at an increased risk of severe diseases and it might affect fetus too. The matter has been examined by domain knowledge experts based on the evidence that indicate that pregnant women are at an increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19 compared to non-pregnant women in case they get infected.

Vaccination- key to protect oneself from corona virus

1,82,765 beneficiaries vaccinated so far in A&N Islands

Port Blair, July 2 To shield its citizens from the corona virus, the vaccination of eligible beneficiaries has been initiated by the Administration in different parts of the Islands. The vaccination began in A&N Islands with administering of COVISHIELD vaccine for Health Care Workers followed by frontline workers and vulnerable population with co-morbidities. Subsequently, the vaccination for 45 and above was initiated followed by 18 to 44 years which is currently underway. As per data available, a total of 1,82,765 beneficiaries have been vaccinated so far in A&N Islands, out of the target beneficiaries of 2, 81, 603 (approx.). A total of 52,706 eligible people in the age group of 18 to 44 years have been vaccinated till date. A total of 2802 people were vaccinated today in A&N Islands. 1641 beneficiaries were vaccinated in South Andaman District, out of which, 394 were in the age group of 18-44 years. In North & Middle Andaman District, 589 beneficiaries were vaccinated. In Nicobar District, 572 beneficiaries were vaccinated, out of which, 207 were in the age group of 18-44 years, a press release from DHS said.

Media briefed on COVID-19 Administration giving thrust on testing facility with 2/3rd of test being conducted through RTPCR: Secretary (Health)

Port Blair, July 2 The Secretary, Health, Shri Ram Niwas Sharma while addressing the COVID-19 media briefing held in the conference hall of IP&T here today, said that the RTPCR test was conducted on 359 passengers who arrived here yesterday and four corona positive cases have been detected despite carrying the RTPCR negative report from mainland. He said, as per the directions of Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, the testing facility in Islands are given more thrust with two third of the tests being conducted through RTPCR while the remaining is being done through RAT. "We want to restrict the entry of the virus from mainland for which RTPCR tests on the incoming flight passengers are being done so that people residing in these Islands are safe and they do not contract corona virus", the Secretary said. The mobile testing team visited Tushnabad and its adjoining areas wherein 114 persons were tested, all were found negative. Similarly, RAT was conducted on 104 persons bound for N&M Andaman at Ferrargunj and no positive cases were detected. He said, today, 1 flight with 137 passengers arrived and their RTPCR reports are awaited. The Secretary further disclosed that as

Providing Insurance Coverage to farmers for crop loss arising out of natural calamities through Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana

Isles farmers urged to take maximum benefit of the scheme

Port Blair, July 2 The Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) is one of the Flagship Schemes of the Govt. of India. The scheme is being implemented in these Islands since 2016. The scheme envisages providing Insurance Coverage to the farmers for crop loss arising out of natural calamities. The PMFBY supports sustainable income in Agriculture Sector by providing financial support to the farmers who suffer crop loss due to unforeseen events. The scheme ensures flow of credit for the agriculture sector and stabilizes the income of farmers. The PMFBY has been presently notified for implementation throughout A&N Islands for Kharif Season 2021. Under the scheme, paddy crop is presently notified for insurance. Maximum scale of finance fixed for paddy is Rs. 69506.00 per ha (for high yielding variety) and Rs.65676.00 per ha (for Traditional variety). Total sum that can be insured against possible losses is arrived at, by multiplying the scale of finance with the area covered. As per the guidelines of PMFBY, 2% of the sum insured is to be paid by the farmers as Insurance premium for availing subsidy under the scheme. However, in case of Andaman and Nicobar, farmers need to pay only 0.5% of the sum insured while the remaining amount is additionally borne as subsidy. PMFBY covers risks of losses arising from either of the possibilities of prevented sowing, sowing to harvesting (due to drought, dry spell, flood, inundation, pest, diseases, landslide, natural fire, lightning, storm,

Individuals/institutions/organizations may also nominate themselves. State Governments, Union Territory Administrations and Ministries of the Government of India may also send nominations for the award.

Govt. announces inclusion of Retail and Wholesale trades as MSMEs

New Delhi, July 2 (PIB) Minister of MSME and Road Transport and Highways, Shri Nitin Gadkari today announced revised guidelines for MSMEs with inclusion of Retail and Wholesale trades as MSMEs. In a Tweet, he said under the leadership of PM Shri Narendra Modi Ji, we are committed to strengthening of MSME and make them engines for economic growth. Shri Gadkari said the revised guidelines will benefit 2.5 Crore Retail and Wholesale Traders. He said Retail and wholesale trade were left out of the ambit of MSME, now under the revised guidelines, retail and wholesale trade will also get benefit of priority sector lending under RBI guidelines.

With the revised guidelines the Retail and wholesale trades will be now be allowed to register on Udyam Registration Portal.

COVID-19 2nd wave is not over; people should not lower their guard against this disease: NITI Aayog Member Health

New Delhi, July 2 NITI Aayog Member Health Dr. V.K. Paul has cautioned that the second wave of Covid-19 pandemic is not over and the people should not lower their guard against this deadly disease. He has urged the people to get vaccinated and follow Covid appropriate behaviour for better protection from corona virus disease.

While briefing the media in New Delhi today, Dr. Paul has said, some districts are still witnessing case positivity rate over 10 per cent in the country. He said, Government of India has sent teams to several States like Chhattisgarh, Kerala, Odisha, Tripura, Manipur and Arunachal Pradesh. He said, it has also been observed that corona virus cases are rising in the European countries, hence, the challenge still remains.

Referring to a study conducted by the PGI Chandigarh on the vaccine effectiveness, Dr. Paul has said, Covid vaccines provide immunity against the corona virus disease. He said, it has been found that two doses of Covid vaccine have provided 98 per cent protection from the disease and one dose has provided 92 per cent protection. He stressed that Covid vaccines are effective and it protects from the serious illness.

On the availability of the vaccine, Dr. Paul has said that continuous efforts have been made to ensure the sufficient doses of Covid-19 vaccines in the country. He said India is in talks with Johnson & Johnson for their single-dose vaccine and this vaccine will also be produced by Bio E. He expressed hope that this vaccine will be available in the country. About the total number of Delta plus variant cases in the country, Dr. Paul said that there are 56 Delta AY.1 cases in 12 States. (Source: india.gov.in)

Further, pregnant women with COVID-19 infection are at an increased risk for preterm birth and other adverse pregnancy outcomes including higher chances of neonatal morbidity. Additionally, the experts have also highlighted pre-existing co-morbidities, advanced maternal age, and high body mass Index as factors for severe COVID-19 in pregnancy.

The National Technical Advisory Group on Immunization (NTAGI) has recommended vaccination for pregnant women. The National Expert Group on Vaccine Administration for COVID-19 (NEGVAC) too has unanimously recommended it. Further, a national level Consultation on COVID-19 vaccination for pregnant women was also convened by the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare to build consensus on COVID Vaccination of pregnant women. The consultation unanimously welcomed the recommendation of NTAGI to vaccinate pregnant women. The consultation included professional bodies like FOGSI, representatives of State Governments, CSOs, NGOs, Development Partner agencies, technical experts etc.

The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has accepted these recommendations and prepared an Operational Guideline for vaccination of pregnant women, Counselling kit for Medical Officers and FLWs, and IEC material for general public to equip the States/UTs to carry out the vaccination of pregnant women. Pregnant woman, who opts for vaccination, can be vaccinated with COVID-19 vaccines available in the country any time during their pregnancy at the nearest Government or Private COVID-19 Vaccination Center (CVC) after registration on CoWIN or by walk-in registration at the nearest CVC. The procedures and modalities of COVID-19 vaccination like registration, generation of certificates after vaccination etc. will remain the same as it is for any beneficiaries above 18 years of age under the National COVID Vaccination Program.

on date, there are 33 corona active cases in A&N Islands and all the cases are in South Andaman. Presently, 2 corona positive patients are admitted in G. B Pant Hospital and they are on Oxygen support. The number of COVID patients admitted in three COVID Care Centres in Port Blair area is nil while 1 patient is being taken care of in the COVID Care Centre at Wimberlygunj, the Secretary added.

He said, 39.07% population have been vaccinated as on July 1. 1,79,963 persons have been inoculated with Covishield Vaccine in Isles, out of the total population of 4,00,000. He said first dose have been given to 1,56,289 beneficiaries covering 55.50%. The second dose has been given to 23,674 beneficiaries and the percentage stands at 15.15, the Secretary said adding that number of second dose beneficiaries is picking up gradually as they are taking the vaccination as per their due date.

The number of beneficiaries who have been inoculated with first dose in the age group of 45 plus is 1,04,184, he said, adding that we have almost reached saturation in vaccinating the 45 plus beneficiaries. He urged the 45 plus beneficiaries whose second dose is due to reach the nearest vaccination Centre as walk-in beneficiaries on their due date for administration of vaccine without fail. Those eligible beneficiaries of 45 plus who have taken the first dose will not be denied the second dose and they will be administered second dose at all cost, the Secretary assured. The number of targeted beneficiaries in the age group of 18-44 years is around 2,83,000 and so far, 52,105 beneficiaries have been vaccinated till yesterday.

The Secretary further said that the vaccination drive is continuing smoothly and till 3 pm today, 752 beneficiaries were vaccinated in JNRM vaccination centre, out of which, 297 persons were in the age group of 18-44. He further disclosed that a total of 26 fixed Vaccination Centres are functioning throughout the Islands where 45 plus age group and second dose beneficiaries are being vaccinated on a daily basis without fail while for 18-44 age group four Centres are functioning i.e. at JNRM, Rangat, Mayabunder and Diglipur as of now.

Crackdown on Illicit Liquor by N&MA District Police continues

Mayabunder, July 2 Continuing its crackdown on the illicit liquor, Handia and illegal sale IMFL, the District Police of North & Middle Andaman has been conducting regular searches in jungles. In the month of June, the teams of various Police Stations, headed by SHOs and Sub-Inspectors conducted 34 search operations in the jungles. During these search operations, around 4500 litres of Lahan and Handia was destroyed. The strict vigil over the history sheeters and known bootleggers has also been identified. All the history sheeters are regularly being checked by the beat staff, making it hard for them



to be involved in any illicit activity. During the month of June, the District police have registered a total of 32 cases for violation of Excise Regulation, in which around 38 bottles of various quantities of IMFL and 118 beer cans have been seized. Apart from this, more than 300 kgs Handia and 44 ltrs illicit liquor has also been seized. With the good work being done by the police, the locals are coming forward and sharing information regarding the bases made by bootleggers in jungle for fermentation and processing, a press release from SP (N&M) said.

Coast Guard rescues seven fishermen off Tillanchong Island

Port Blair, July 2 In a swift sea-air coordinated Search and Rescue Operation, Indian Coast Guard located and rescued a distressed fishing boat 'RSN-TWO' with 7 crew onboard off Tillanchong Island on July 1. The Indian Coast Guard Regional Headquarters at Port Blair received an unregistered DAT (Distress Alert Transmitter) alert from DAT ID-85802 on June 30, 2021. Since the alert was activated from an unregistered DAT, the details of the boat and its owner were not available with Indian Coast Guard. The information was immediately shared with Fisheries authorities with a request to provide the details of person/boat issued with said DAT.

The boat details were obtained from DAT manufacturer and as per the information



available, the said boat with 7 crew had left Port Blair on June 28, 2021 for fishing. On receipt of distress alert, Indian Coast Guard promptly launched Search and Rescue operation and deployed Coast Guard Ship C-422 from Kamorta on 30th June, 2021 for investigation and assistance. In order to augment the search, Indian Coast Guard deployed its Offshore Patrol Vessel ICGS Vishwast and CG aircraft in the early morning yesterday. Braving rough seas, the coordinated and relentless search undertaken by CG units resulted in locating the fishing boat at 0900 hrs on July 1 off Tillanchong Island. The boat reported machinery breakdown due to defect in gear box. ICG boarding team with technical and medical staff embarked the boat for investigation. The boat crew was provided with basic necessities and first aid. All seven boat crew are reported to be safe and healthy. Indian Coast Guard maintained continuous communication and shared the information on developments in the instant case with the boat owner and Fisheries authorities, a press release from PRO Coast Guard said.

hailstorm, cyclone etc.), post-harvest losses up to two weeks after harvesting. It also compensates the farmers against localized calamities affecting isolated farms in notified area/single peril risk.

Less than expected average yield due to mid-season adversity viz, floods, prolonged dry spells and severe drought etc. is also compensated for under PMFBY. The enrolment under the scheme is voluntary. All farmers including tenant farmers are eligible for coverage. The cutoff date for the enrolment under the scheme for Kharif, 2021 is 15/08/2021. The farmers have to approach the SBI or co-operative Bank of the concerned areas alongwith land records and enroll under the scheme.

After enrolment, any losses to the crop arising out of risks covered in the PMFBY need to be mandatorily reported within 24 hours to the Insurance Company (National Insurance Company) directly or through Department of Agriculture and/or Department of Revenue.

The farmers of Andaman and Nicobar Islands have been appealed to take maximum benefit of PMFBY scheme, a press release from Directorate of Agriculture said.

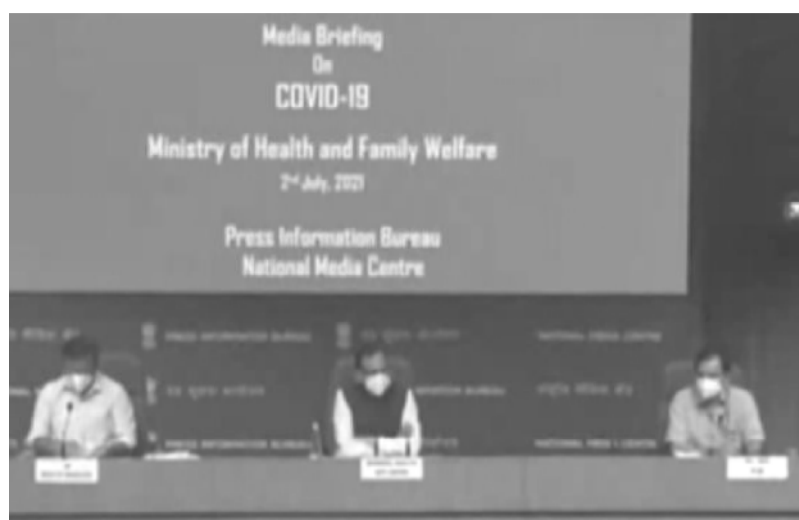

India's COVID Vaccination Coverage crosses 34 crore mark

New Delhi, July 2

He said, India has administered the largest number of Covid vaccine doses in the world so far followed by the United States of America wherein 32 crore 81 lakh vaccine doses have been administered. He said, the



country has administered on average over 39 lakh doses in the last month which shows that the pace of vaccination has picked up in the country. Shri Agarwal

has said despite the decrease in the Covid-19 fresh cases and positivity rate, people must rigorously follow the Covid-19 appropriate behavior. (Source:india.gov.in)

Role of women in leading scientific research increasing

New Delhi, July 2 (PIB)

The involvement of women as science leaders seems to be increasing. The percentage of women leading research projects has increased by 4 percent over two years, said a recent government report. Women Principal Investigators (PIs) participation in research that received Extramural Research (EMR) support (support through peer-reviewed competitive grant mechanism) was 28% during 2018-19, as compared to 24% during 2016-17, according to the Directory of Extramural Research & Development (R&D) Project 2018-19 report released by the government recently.

The report also showed that extramural R&D support or R&D support through peer-reviewed competitive grant mechanisms by the central government was Rs. 2091.04 Crore in 2018-19 as compared to Rs. 2036.32 Crore in 2017-18 --- an increase of Rs. 54.72 Crore over the previous year. The number of projects supported has increased, as has the number of PIs. A total of 3839 PIs undertook 4616 projects in comparison to 3491 PIs undertaking 4137 projects during 2017-18.

Of this support, 64% of the projects were received by 8 states, including Tamil Nadu, Delhi, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, and West Bengal, accounting for 71 % of the share of funding.

The 22 Indian Institute of Technologies (IITs) combined received 822 projects - the maximum number, with highest financial support of Rs. 449.25 Crore, followed by 26 National Institute of Technology (NITs) combined, which received 191 projects with financial support of Rs. 55.83 Crore. The maximum financial support went to Engineering and Technology, while the maximum number of projects went to Biological Sciences.

The Department of Science and Technology (DST) accounted for the maximum

Extramural Research (EMR) support of Rs. 1392.21 Crore (67%), followed by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) with Rs. 341.37 Crore (16%). The two Departments together contributed to 83% of the total extramural R&D funding in India.

The Scientific and Technological (S&T) activities play a vital role in the economic, social, and physical development of a country. Scientific and technological research needs huge investments and calls for judicious utilization of scarce resources like finance, trained manpower, raw materials, and so on. Data collection and analysis pertaining to resources devoted to S&T, therefore, assumes significant importance. The growth of S&T, its performance, and its impact on society and economy are indicators to assess the effectiveness of planning and policy formulation.

Extramural Research and Development (R&D) projects support is a peer-reviewed competitive grant mechanism of the Central Government to promote, catalyze and advance R&D and innovation in the country and provides special encouragement to scientists to

India recorded highest ever merchandise export in 1st quarter this year

New Delhi, July 2

India has recorded the highest ever merchandise export in the first quarter of April to June this year despite the severity of the second wave of COVID-19 pandemic. Also, the country has received the highest ever FDI inflow of 81.72 billion US dollar in the last financial year.

Addressing a press conference in New Delhi today, Commerce and Industry Minister, Shri Piyush Goyal said that India has set a target of 400 billion US dollar merchandise exports in this financial year. Shri Goyal

said, the highest ever Merchandise export of 95 billion dollar has been achieved in the first quarter of this financial year between April to June.

The Minister said, India's economy is growing and the exports are also growing. He said, sector specific government's interventions, involvement of all the stakeholders and simplification of procedures have resulted in record performance of exports. He said, several labour intensive sectors have seen a rapid export growth. (Source:india.gov.in)

DRDO's Short Span Bridging System-10 m inducted into Indian Army

New Delhi, July 2 (PIB)

The first production lot of 12 Short Span Bridging System (SSBS)-10 m, designed and developed by Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), has been inducted into Indian Army by Chief of the Army Staff General MM Naravane during a ceremony held at Cariappa Parade Ground, Delhi Cantt. on July 02, 2021. Secretary Department of Defence R&D and Chairman DRDO Dr G Satheesh Reddy was present on the occasion.

The SSBS-10 m plays a crucial role of bridging the gaps up to 9.5 m as a single span providing a 4 m wide, fully decked roadway, ensuring faster movement of the troops. Research & Development Establishment (Engrs) Pune, a premier engineering laboratory of DRDO, has designed and developed the system in association with M/s L&T Ltd. The 12 bridges are part of 102 SSBS-10 m from M/s L&T Ltd, which is the production agency.

The Project Short Span Bridging System involved the development of two prototypes of 5 m SSBS on Tatra 6x6 chassis and



another two prototypes of 10 m SSBS on Tatra 8x8 re-engineered chassis. Both the systems have undergone rigorous Directorate General of Quality Assurance (DGQA), MET and User trials and after successful completion of all the trials, the systems were recommended for induction into the services. This bridging system is compatible with Sarvatra Bridging System (75 m), where the last span requires covering gaps less than 9.5 m. The deployed bridge is of the load classification of MLC 70. The system will help in quick movement of troops and enhance the mobilization of resources.

The DRDO has vast experience in developing critical Combat Engineering Systems like Military Bridging Systems. Number of mechanised mobility solutions for the Indian Army like Single Span 5 m and 10

m, Short Span Bridging System, 46 m Modular Bridge, 20 m BLT-T72 and multi span 75 m Sarvatra Bridging System etc. have been developed. Manually launched 34.5 m Mountain Foot Bridge was also developed by DRDO earlier. These bridges have been widely accepted by the Indian Army.

Raksha Mantri, Shri Rajnath Singh has congratulated DRDO, Indian Army and the Industry on the successful development and induction of the system. He stated that this induction will give a boost to the fast-growing Indian defence industrial ecosystem and help the industry to contribute towards 'Atmanirbhar Bharat'. Chairman DRDO Dr G Satheesh Reddy congratulated the teams involved in the successful development and induction of this bridging system into the Indian Army.
