

125 crore residents of India have Aadhaar now

New Delhi, Dec 28 The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) announced a new milestone achieved by the Aadhaar project - crossing of the 125 crore mark. This means that over 1.25 billion residents of India have the 12-digit unique identity. The achievement comes along with the rapidly increasing use of Aadhaar as the primary identity document by the Aadhaar holders. This is evident from the fact that Aadhaar-based authentication services have been used close to 37,000 crore times since inception. At present UIDAI receives about 3 crore authentication requests every day. Also, residents are more inclined on keeping their details in Aadhaar up to date. UIDAI recorded close to 331 crore successful Aadhaar updates (biometric and demographic) till date. At present UIDAI receives about 3-4 lakh Aadhaar request every day.

Coast Guard apprehends 15 Myanmarese poachers for illegal fishing in Indian EEZ

Port Blair, Dec. 28 The Indian Coast Guard yesterday apprehended 15 Myanmarese poachers along with fishing boat for poaching of sea cucumber in Indian waters. On information from Kamorta Police on Dec 27, 2019 for a possible Myanmarese dinghy east of Kakana village, Kamorta Island, Indian Coast Guard Interceptor Boat C-422 was diverted for investigation. The Myanmarese boat was engaged in illegal fishing in the Indian Exclusive Economic Zone which was in clear violations to the Maritime Zones of India Act 1981. On being sighted by the C-422, the boat increased speed and started heading towards the shallow waters to evade apprehension. However, the Coast Guard



successfully intercepted the fleeing boat along with its crew. It was observed that the boat was carrying diving equipment like diving compressors, diving

Striker Dilpreet Singh returns to senior fold, included in Indian National Hockey Camp

New Delhi, Dec 28
Young striker Dilpreet Singh was on Saturday included in a 32-member men's core probables group for a two-week national coaching camp ahead of next month's Hockey Pro League, to be held in Bhubaneswar.



The 32 members, announced by Hockey India, will report to chief coach Graham Reid for the two-week camp ahead of their Pro League debut against the Netherlands on January 18 and 19. Dilpreet, who was last part of the Indian senior team at the 2018 men's World Cup, returned to the senior core group following his worthy performance at this year's Sultan of Johor Cup, where the Indian colts won a silver medal. Youngsters Shilanand Lakra, Rajkumar Pal, Nilam Sanjeev Xess and Dipsan Tirkey have

also been included in the probables list for the national camp to be held at the Kalinga Hockey Stadium. The core group, featuring a mix of experienced and young players, also has PR Sreejesh, Krishan Bhadur Pathak, Hamanpreet Singh, Surender Kumar, Birendra Lakra, Rupinder Pal Singh, Gurinder Singh, Amit Rohidas, Kothajit Singh Khadangbam, Manpreet Singh, Hardik Singh, Nilakanta Sharma and Vivek Sagar Prasad. "I believe all the players will return fresh for the camp after a good break for Christmas. The previous national coaching camp in Bhubaneswar was physically challenging where we expected the players to push their limits. It involved a lot of strength and conditioning work apart from hockey," chief coach Reid said.

Mary Kom beats Nikhat Zareen in women's trials final for Olympic Qualifiers

New Delhi, Dec 28
In boxing, six-time world champion M C Mary Kom defeated Nikhat Zareen in a split verdict trial bout to make the Indian team for next year's Olympic qualifiers in China. In a bout which had very few clear punches, Mary Kom prevailed 9-1 to make the squad in the 51 kg category.



In other results, two-time world silver-medallist Sonia Lather was upstaged by Sakshi Chaudhary in the 57 kg category. In the 60 kg class, former world champion L Sarita Devi lost to national champion Simranjit Kaur.

2nd Youth ODI: Yashasvi Jaiswal fires India U-19 team to series-clinching win over South Africa

Buffalo Park, Dec 28
Yashasvi Jaiswal grabbed four wickets before making an unbeaten 89 to star in India Under-19 team's series-clinching eight wicket win over South Africa in the second Youth ODI at the Buffalo Park here on Saturday.



Jaiswal, who turned 18 on Saturday and is in India's U-19 World Cup squad, gave himself a birthday gift by polishing off the South African tail with a four-wicket burst with his spin bowling to bundle out the home side for just 119 from 29.5 overs. Akash Singh, AV Ankoekar and Ravi Bishnoi also chipped in with two wickets each.

For South Africa, who suffered a batting collapse, one-down Jonathan Bird top-scored with a 25 while opener Andrew Louw made 24. Their six batsmen were dismissed for single-digit scores. Chasing the small target of 120, Jaiswal, who was bought by Rajasthan Royals for Rs 2.4 crore in the recent IPL auction, struck 14 boundaries and three sixes in his 56-ball unbeaten knock. Dhruv Jurel also remained not out on 26 as India chased down the target with 33.4 overs to spare, reaching 120 for 2 in 16.2 overs. Captain Priyam Garg was out for a duck.

Indian Air Force bids farewell to MiG 27

New Delhi, Dec 28
The MiG-27, which proved to be an ace attacker during the 1999 Kargil War roared through the skies for one last time yesterday after serving the Indian Air Force for over three decades. The swing-wing fighter has been the backbone of ground-attack fleet of the Air Force for several decades and the IAF bidding adieu to its squadron of seven aircraft from Jodhpur Air Base.



Veteran air warriors along with serving air warriors in large numbers are taking part in the ceremony. Air Officer Commanding-in-Chief South Western Air Command Air Marshal SK Ghotia presiding over the wind down ceremony. The Aircrafts also received water salute at Air Force Station Jodhpur.

when it delivered rockets and bombs with accuracy on enemy positions. The fleet also took active part in Operation Parakram. The Number 29 Squadron is the only unit in the IAF operating the MiG-27 upgrades. The upgraded version, because of its survivability, has participated in numerous national and international exercises. The Ministry said, the Squadron was raised on March 10, 1958, at Air Force Station Halwara with Ouragan (Toofani) aircraft. Over the years, the Squadron has been equipped with numerous types of fighters such as MiG-21 Type 77, MiG-21 Type 96, MiG-27 ML and MiG-27 upgrade. The lethal aircraft, for their role during the 1999 Kargil War, earned the moniker 'Bahadur' from IAF pilots.

Defence Ministry said, the upgraded variant of this last swing-wing fleet has been the pride of IAF strike fleet since 2006. All other variants, such as MiG-23 BN and MiG-23 MF and the pure MiG-27 have already retired from IAF. It said, the fleet earned its glory in the historic Kargil conflict
