## PM chairs Cabinet Meeting to give historic boost to Rural India Landmark decisions to benefit farmers & transform agriculture sector taken

New Delhi, June 3 (PIB)

The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi met today. Several landmark and historic decisions were taken in the meeting, which will go a long way in helping India's farmers while also transforming the agriculture sector. The Cabinet approved historic amendment to the Essential Commodities Act. This is a visionary step towards transformation of agriculture and raising farmers' income.

### Background

While India has become surplus in most agri-commodities, farmers have been unable to get better prices due to lack of investment in cold storage, warehouses, processing and export as the entrepreneurial spirit gets dampened due to hanging sword of Essential Commodities Act. Farmers suffer huge losses when there are bumper harvests, especially of perishable commodities. With adequate processing facilities, much of this wastage can be reduced.

### Benefits

With the amendment to Essential Commodities Act, commodities like cereals, pulses, oilseeds, edible oils, onion and potatoes will be removed from list of essential commodities. This will remove fears of private investors of excessive regulatory interference in their business operations.

The freedom to produce, hold, move, distribute and supply will lead to harnessing of economies of scale and attract private sector/foreign direct investment into



agriculture sector. It will help drive up investment in cold storages and modernization of food supply chain.

### Safeguarding interest of consumers

The Government, while liberalizing the regulatory environment, has also ensured that interests of consumers are safeguarded. It has been provided in the Amendment, that in situations such as war, famine, extraordinary price rise and natural calamity, such agricultural foodstuff can be regulated. However, the installed capacity of a value chain participant and the export demand of an exporter will remain exempted from such stock limit imposition so as to ensure that investments in agriculture are not discouraged. The amendment announced will help both farmers and consumers while bringing in price stability. It will create competitive market environment and also prevent wastage of agri-produce that happens due to lack of storage facilities.

### Barrier-free trade in agriculture produce

Cabinet approved 'The Farming Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Ordinance, 2020'.

### Background

Farmers in India today suffer from various restrictions in marketing their produce. There are restrictions for farmers in selling agri-produce outside the notified APMC market yards. The farmers are also restricted to sell the produce only to registered licensees of the State Governments. Further, Barriers exist in free flow of agriculture produce between various States owing to the prevalence of various APMC legislations enacted by the State Governments.

### Benefits

The Ordinance will create an ecosystem where the farmers and traders will enjoy freedom of choice of sale and purchase of agri-produce. It will also promote barrier-free inter-state and intra-state trade and commerce outside the physical premises of markets notified under State Agricultural Produce Marketing legislations. This is a historic-step in unlocking the vastly regulated agriculture markets in the country. It will open more choices for the farmer, reduce marketing costs for the farmers and help them in getting better prices. It will also help farmers of regions with surplus produce to get better prices and consumers of regions with shortages, lower prices. The ordinance also proposes an electronic trading in transaction platform for ensuring a seamless trade electronically.

The farmers will not be charged any cess or levy for sale of their produce under this Act. Further there will be a separate dispute resolution mechanism for the farmers.

## CBSE issues notification for conduct of pending Class 10, 12 Board Exams

Exams to be conducted in respective schools of candidates

Port Blair, June 3

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) on Tuesday released an Official Notification for the students of Class 10 and Class 12, appearing for the examinations that are scheduled to be held from July 1 to July 15, 2020. It is to be noted that this notification is for those class 10 students who are from the northeast district of Delhi and all class 12 students of all districts of the country.

In this notification, the Board has addressed various issues of Class 10 and 12 students regarding allotment of examination centres.

As per the notification, examinations would now be conducted in the respective schools of the candidates instead of the examination centre already allotted. CBSE will allow change of examination centre in respect of candidates who have shifted and are residing in some other district in the country than the place of their school. Examinations w.e.f. 1.7.2020 to 15.7.2020 will be conducted in the respective school of the candidates. In each district, where CBSE is having affiliated schools, one school will be fixed as a Nodal Examination Centre for the candidates who have shifted from their earlier district of examination centre to another district in India.

Eligibility for making request for change of



### examination centre

a) **Regular candidates:** Following category of regular candidates who have shifted from their district of school to some other district in India will be eligible to make request for change of examination centre:  
 i) Students who were residing in hostels  
 ii) Students sponsored by State Governments.  
 iii) Students who have shifted from the district of their school to some other district within India.

b) **Private candidates** - Private candidates who have shifted from their district of examination centre to some other district in India can also make a request to change their examination centre.

Change of centre in the same district will not be allowed. Change of examination centre will be allowed only in the district in which the applicant has shifted to, and in which CBSE is having affiliated schools. Provided, in case, a student is presently staying in a district in which there is no CBSE affiliated school, an examination centre in neighbouring district will be allotted. In the containment zone, no examination centre will be permitted. In case of schools falling in containment zones as on date, examination centre of the students of these schools will be allotted outside

## Containment area restrictions in Bambooflat, Hopetown, Shorepoint, Stewartgunj, Nayapuram, Kanyapuram, Wimberlygunj (Part), Kadakachang & Govindapuram lifted ILI & SARI surveillance to continue

Port Blair, June 3

The area constituting Bambooflat, Hopetown, Shorepoint, Stewartgunj, Nayapuram, Kanyapuram, Wimberlygunj (Part), Kadakachang & Govindapuram was constituted as a Containment Area in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The last positive case for COVID-19 was detected on 25th April, 2020 in the aforementioned Containment Area following which, containment operations were directed to be scaled down vide Order No.521 dated 22.05.2020.

As per the Updated Containment Plan for Large Outbreaks Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, the containment operation shall be deemed to be over 28 days from the discharge of last confirmed case (following negative tests as per discharge policy) from the designated health facility i.e. when the follow up of hospital contacts will be complete.

The health authorities have confirmed that the conditions for removing Containment Area restrictions are fulfilled in the case of Bambooflat, Hopetown, Shorepoint, Stewartgunj, Nayapuram, Kanyapuram, Wimberlygunj (Part), Kadakachang & Govindapuram. Further, the medical screening of all the residents of the area has already been done and samples of symptomatic persons were collected which were reported negative. Further, the last patient from the aforementioned Containment Area tested negative on 07.05.2020.

Now therefore, in view of the above, the containment operations in the Containment Area comprising Bambooflat, Hopetown, Shorepoint, Stewartgunj, Nayapuram, Kanyapuram, Wimberlygunj (Part), Kadakachang & Govindapuram has been declared over. However, the surveillance will continue for Influenza-like illness (ILI) and Severe Acute Respiratory Infections (SARI).

The following directions are further being issued for strict compliance by the officers concerned: -

➤ The SHO concerned shall keep strict vigil in the above said area to ensure that the instructions issued with regard to lockdown are being followed and shall also remove the restrictions on entry into and exit from the above Containment Area.

➤ Further, every person of aforesaid area will maintain social distancing and no such person will come outside the house in any case without covering their face with 3-ply mask or handmade washable cloth mask.

➤ Further, all the vendors, hawkers etc. will have to maintain proper hygiene and ensure social distancing.

All other directions issued from time to time by the Govt. of India and the A&N Administration related to lockdown and social distancing measures, shall be complied with scrupulously in their real terms and intent, an Order to this effect issued by the District Magistrate, South Andaman which has come in force w.e.f. midnight of 03.06.2020 said.

## Ministry of MSME gears up to implement new norms of classification of MSMEs

Upper ceiling for classification of MSMEs raised  
New definition & criterion notified; will come into effect from 1st July

New Delhi, June 3 (PIB)

Union Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (M/o MSMEs) has issued Gazette Notification to pave way for implementation of the upward revision in the definition and criteria of MSMEs in the country. The new definition and criterion will come into effect from 1st July, 2020. After 14 years since the MSME Development Act came into existence in 2006, a revision in MSME definition was announced in the Atmanirbhar Bharat package on 13th May, 2020. As per this announcement, the definition of Micro manufacturing

and services units was increased to Rs. 1 Crore of investment and Rs. 5 Crore of turnover. The limit of small unit was increased to Rs. 10 Crore of investment and Rs 50 Crore of turnover. Similarly, the limit of medium unit was increased to Rs. 20 Crore of investment and Rs. 100 Crore of turnover. The Government of India on 01.06.2020 decided for further upward revision of the MSME Definition. For medium Enterprises, now it will be Rs. 50 Crore of investment and Rs. 250 Crore of turnover.

## Govt. to conduct skill mapping of citizens returning from overseas

New Delhi, June 3 (PIB)

With the aim of making the best of our skilled workforce returning to the country due to the ongoing pandemic, the Government of India has launched a new initiative SWADES (Skilled Workers Arrival Database for Employment Support) to conduct a skill mapping exercise of the returning citizens under the Vande Bharat Mission. This is a joint initiative of the Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, the Ministry of Civil Aviation and the Ministry of External Affairs which aims to create a database of qualified citizens based on their skillsets and experience to tap into and fulfil demand

of Indian and foreign companies.

The collected information will be shared with the companies for suitable placement opportunities in the country. The returning citizens are required to fill up an online SWADES Skills Card. The card will facilitate a strategic framework to provide the returning citizens with suitable employment opportunities through discussions with key stakeholders including State Governments, Industry Associations and Employers. MSDE's implementation arm National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) is supporting the

is based on the MSME Act, 2006. It was different for manufacturing and services units. It was also very low in terms of financial limits. Since then, the economy has undergone significant changes. After the package announced on 13th May, 2020, there were several representations saying that the announced revision is still not in line with market and price conditions and hence it should be further revised upwardly. Keeping in mind these representations, the Prime Minister decided to further increase the limit for medium units. This has been done in order to be realistic with time and to establish an objective system of classification and to provide ease of doing business. Also, a new composite formula of classification for manufacturing and service units has been notified. Now, there will be no difference between manufacturing and service sectors. Also, a new criterion of turnover is added. Ministry officials said that the new definition will pave way for strengthening and growth of the MSMEs. Particularly, the provision of excluding the exports from counting of turnover will encourage the MSMEs to export more and more without fearing to loose the benefits of a MSME unit.

**One India, One Agriculture Market**  
The ordinance basically aims at creating additional trading opportunities outside the APMC market yards to help farmers get remunerative prices due to additional competition. This will supplement the existing MSP procurement system which is providing stable income to farmers. It will certainly pave the way for creating One India, One Agriculture Market and will lay the foundation for ensuring golden harvests for our hard working farmers.

Farmers empowered to engage with processors, aggregators, wholesalers, large retailers, exporters  
Cabinet approved 'The Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Ordinance, 2020'.

**Background**  
Indian Agriculture is characterized by fragmentation due to small holding sizes and has certain weaknesses such as weather dependence, production uncertainties and market unpredictability. This makes agriculture risky and inefficient in respect of both input & output management.

**Benefits**  
The ordinance will empower farmers for engaging with processors, wholesalers, aggregators,wholesalers, large retailers, exporters etc., on a level playing field without any fear of exploitation. It will transfer the risk of market unpredictability from the farmer to the sponsor and also enable the farmer to access modern technology and better inputs. It will reduce cost of marketing and improve income of farmers. This Ordinance will act as a catalyst to attract private sector investment for building supply chains for supply of Indian farm produce to global markets. Farmers will get access to technology and advice for high value agriculture and get ready market for such produce.

Farmers will engage in direct marketing thereby eliminating intermediaries resulting in full realization of price. Farmers have been provided adequate protection. Sale, lease or mortgage of farmers' land is totally prohibited and farmers' land is also protected against any recovery. Effective dispute resolution mechanism has been provided for with clear time lines for redressal.

**Government committed to the cause of farmer's welfare**  
A series of steps were announced as part of the **Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyaan** to provide a boost to those engaged in agriculture and allied activities. These include provision of concessional credit through Kisan Credit Cards, financing facility for agri-infra projects, Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana and other measures to strengthen fisheries, vaccination against Foot & Mouth Disease and Brucellosis, Herbal Cultivation promotion, boost to beekeeping, Operation Green etc. Through PM KISAN, over 9.54 crore farmer families (as on first June, 2020) have benefited and an amount of Rs. 19,515 crore has been disbursed so far during the lockdown period. An amount of Rs. 8090 crore has been paid during lockdown period under PMFBY. These steps are only the latest in a series of measures taken by the government, which shows its continuous commitment to championing the cause of welfare of the hardworking farmers of India.

**EPFO updates KYC for 52.62 lakh subscribers since 1st April, 2020**

New Delhi, June 3 (PIB) To extend the availability and reach of online services, which have become crucial in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, EPFO updated Know Your Customer (KYC) data for its 52.62 lakh subscribers in the month of April and May, 2020. This includes Aadhaar seeding for 39.97 lakh subscribers, mobile seeding (UAN activation) for 9.87 lakh subscribers and bank account seeding for 11.11 lakh subscribers. KYC is a one-time process which helps in identity verification of subscribers through linking of Universal Account Number (UAN) with KYC details. Further, to enable Aadhaar seeding for 39.97 lakh subscribers, mobile seeding (UAN activation) undertaken massive exercise of rectifying the details of the subscribers even during the lockdown. This resulted in 4.81 lakh name corrections, 2.01 lakh date of birth corrections and 3.70 lakh Aadhaar number corrections in the last two months. KYC updation enables a member to avail online services through member portal.

the containment zone. Private candidates (2nd chance Compartment, Failures of previous year, Improvement of Performance, Additional subject, Female candidates of NCT of Delhi, Visually Impaired candidates) and Patracher Vidyalaya candidates who have not shifted from their district of examination centre to any other district in India will be required to appear for the examination from the allotted examination centre from where they have appeared earlier upto 18.3.2020. No examination will be conducted for the students studying in CBSE affiliated schools situated outside India (abroad) because of restrictions imposed by their Governments. Their result will be declared as per the assessment scheme to be decided by the Board. Result in respect of the subjects whose examinations will not be conducted by the Board will also be declared as per assessment scheme to be decided by the Board. In case children with special needs availing the facility of scribe do not wish to appear in the forthcoming examination because of noncompliance of social distancing norms, their result will be declared as per the assessment scheme to be decided by the Board. Last date of any activity will not be changed under any circumstances. Once option is exercised by candidate/school for change of examination centre, no change will be allowed thereafter. No request for reconduct of examination will be entertained. CBSE will accept requests of candidates (Regular) for change of examination centre only through their school. It will be the responsibility of the School to contact their students to know whether they have shifted to some other district and would like to avail the facility of changing the examination centre to their present district of stay in India, and thereafter, to provide the information to CBSE. Schools will use e-संज्ञा portal on CBSE website for providing desired information. Request in any other mode will not be entertained by the Board. School will process the genuine requests made by their students and will recommend to the CBSE for change of district for appearing in the examinations as per rule. School will ensure that all requests received from their students regarding change in district for appearing in the examinations are uploaded on e-संज्ञा portal correctly. No request for change of examination centre should be sent to CBSE directly by the candidates. Such requests will not be entertained. Students who may have requested CBSE to change their examination centre will have to make a request to their own school. Candidates can check the location of their examination centre with the help of Mobile App-Examination centre locator of CBSE" from 20.06.2020. App is available in Play Store. This App will work only on Android Mobile. Request for change of Examination Centre should be made by the candidates to their schools between June 3 & June 9. Private candidates can apply for change of Examination Centre between June 3 & June 11 upto 5 pm.

- Over head tank, coolers and other water containers should be kept closed by tightly fitting lids.
- Empty and dry the coolers, overhead tank, flower pots, broken / discarded vessels and other water containers once in a week and fill it with fresh water.
- Only use insecticides treated mosquito nets
