## Annual Session of Confederation of Indian Industries held Intent, Inclusion, Investment, Infrastructure & Innovation important to build an Aatmanirbhar Bharat: PM

### "We will definitely get our growth back"

New Delhi, June 2 (PIB)

The Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi delivered the inaugural address at the 125th Annual Session of Confederation of Indian Industries (CII) through video conference today. The theme of this year's annual conference is "Building India for a New World: Lives, livelihood, growth".

Speaking on the occasion, Prime Minister said such online events are becoming the new normal due to Corona. This is also the biggest strength of human beings that makes a way out of every difficulty, he added. He said, "On the one hand, we have to take strict steps to fight this Virus and save the lives of the countrymen and on the other hand we have to stabilize the economy and speed it up."

Referring to the theme of this year's annual session, the Prime Minister praised the Indian industry for starting the discussion of "Getting Growth Back". He urged the industry to go beyond it and said "Yes! We will definitely get our growth back." He said that his trust in India's Capabilities and Crisis Management, in



India's Talent and Technology, in its Innovation and Intellect of India, in the Farmers of India, MSME's, Entrepreneurs makes him confident about getting the growth back.

Prime Minister said Corona may have slowed down the speed of the growth, but today the biggest fact is that India has overtaken the lockdown phase and entered in the Un-Lock Phase one. A large part of Economy has opened in Un-Lock Phase one. A lot is going to open after 8th June. Getting Growth Back has started, he added.

The Prime Minister emphasized that when Coronavirus was spreading in the

world, India took the right steps at the right time. He said "Today we get to know how widespread the effect of lockdown in India is, by comparing it with other countries." He said "Re-strengthening Economy against Corona is one of our highest priorities." For

## Elections to 18 Rajya Sabha seats to be held on June 19

New Delhi, June 2

The Election Commission has announced the polls for pending 18 Rajya Sabha seats from seven States. The polling will be held on 19th of this month. The Commission had earlier deferred the elections on these seats scheduled for 26th of March due to COVID-19 situation.

The election will be conducted for filling four seats each in Andhra Pradesh and Gujarat, three seats each in Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, two seats in Jharkhand and one seat each in Manipur and Meghalaya. The time of poll will be from 9 am to 4 pm and the counting of votes will be held on the same day. (Source: india.gov.in)

## A&N Administration decides to resume Inter-Island helicopter service from June 4 Standard Operating Procedures to be followed notified

Port Blair, June 2

In pursuance of the Guidelines for phased reopening (Unlock 1) issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Andaman & Nicobar Administration has decided to recommence the helicopter services in Inter-Island sector w.e.f. June 4, 2020. The resumption of the service shall be by observing the below mentioned Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) notified by the Directorate of Civil Aviation.



- Passengers should report at airport/helipad 01 hour before the departure time.
- All passengers shall undergo thermal screening at the point of departure and only asymptomatic passengers will be allowed to board the flight/helicopter.
- All passengers to furnish a self health declaration in the prescribed format and submit the same at the point of departure.
- At airports /helipads required measures to ensure social distancing shall be taken.
- During boarding and travel, all passengers shall use face covers/mask.
- They will also follow hand hygiene, respiratory hygiene and maintain environmental hygiene.
- On arrival at the point of destination, thermal screening of all passengers

shall be done by the local health authorities.

- All passengers to share their contact details and residential address with Administration for record.
  - All asymptomatic passengers will be allowed to travel to their residence/ next destination by local/ private transport.
  - All symptomatic/ suspect cases in passengers, as assessed by the health authorities will be isolated at the designated COVID Care Centre (CCC).
- In addition to above, all Instructions/ Guidelines/ directives of the Ministries of Home Affairs, Civil Aviation, Health & Family Welfare and SOPs issued by the Govt. of India from time to time shall be strictly followed, a press release from Directorate of Civil Aviation said here today. ## DSS restores Harbour Ferry service Passengers should follow social distancing norms & compulsorily wear face masks Vessels to operate from 6 am to 8 pm daily

Port Blair, June 2

In the light of the Guidelines for phased re-opening (Unlock 1), issued by the Ministry of Home Affairs and thereafter subsequent Order dt. 31.05.2020 by Chief Secretary, A& N Administration under section 24(I) of Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Directorate of Shipping Services has restored its Harbour ferry services at Port Blair as well as outstations with immediate effect, till 30.06.2020 or till new guidelines in this regard come into force.

Conforming to the directions of the guidelines ibid of MHA, the above harbour ferry services shall operate daily from 6 am to 8 pm only. Due to the ongoing restrictions, the transshipment of passengers in the harbour ferry vessels shall be strictly in accordance to the norms



of social distancing issued by MHA and all travelling passengers should compulsorily wear face masks during transport.

Daily commuters have been requested to plan their journey accordingly and avoid congregation in the vessel as well as in the Harbour, so that safe and secure movement of passengers by complying the social distancing norms, is maintained in the Harbour ferry sector, a press release from Directorate of Shipping Services said.

## Country to receive normal monsoon this year

New Delhi, June 2

In a good news to farmers, the country will receive a normal monsoon rainfall this year. Sharing details about the Second Stage Long Range Forecast for Southwest Monsoon Season Rainfall from July to September, Secretary of Ministry of Earth Sciences Dr M Rajeevan said that conditions are becoming more favourable for a good monsoon. He said, in view of this condition, quantitatively, the monsoon rainfall between June to September over the country would be 102 per cent of its long period average which means 88

Publication of a list of the activities which could be financed under PMEGP scheme would give them a clear idea on the field of their interest considering the technical feasibility and financial viability of the project at the concerned area. Accordingly, a list of the probable activities which could be financed under PMEGP scheme is enlisted below for the awareness of the interested beneficiaries.

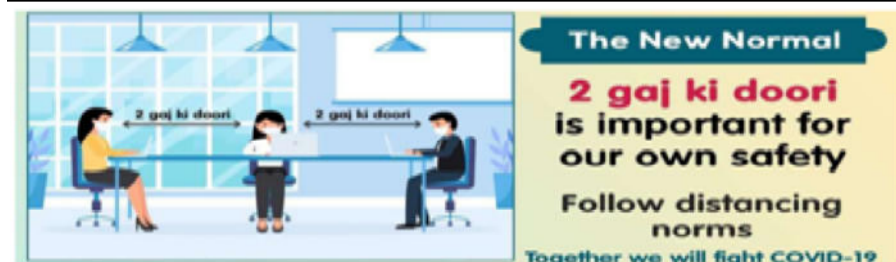

Consultation process for new Science, Technology, and Innovation Policy (STIP) initiated

New Delhi, June 2 and Innovation Policy (STIP 2020). The Office of the Principal Scientific Adviser to the Government of India (Office of PSA) and the Department of Science and Technology (DST) have jointly initiated a decentralized, bottom-up, and inclusive process for the formulation of a new national Science Technology strategy for Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI). As the crisis changes the world, the new policy with its decentralized manner of formation will reorient STI in terms of priorities, sectoral focus, the way research is done, and technologies are developed and deployed for larger socio-economic welfare.

this, the government is taking the decisions that are required immediately and also those that are required in the long run, he added.

The Prime Minister listed the steps taken by the Government in helping people during this crisis situation. Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Yojana has helped a lot in providing immediate benefits to the poor. Ration has been delivered to about 74 crore Beneficiaries under this scheme. Free ration is also being provided to migrant workers. Be it women, disabled persons, elderly, laborers, everyone has benefited from it. During the lockdown, the government has delivered more than 8 crore gas cylinders to the poor - that too free. 50 lakh private employees have got the Government contribution of 24% of EPF amount in their bank accounts, which amounts to Rs.800 Crore. Prime Minister listed 5 things which are very important to build a **Aatmanirbhar Bharat** and to bring India back on the path of rapid development, viz. **Intent, Inclusion, Investment, Infrastructure and Innovation**. These are reflected in the bold decisions taken by the Government recently, he added. He also said that many sectors have been made ready for the future.

The PM said "For us reforms are not any random or scattered decisions. For us reforms are systemic, planned, integrated, inter-connected and futuristic processes. For us, reforms means having the courage to take decisions, and taking them to a logical conclusion." He listed out the initiatives of the Government to make an encouraging ecosystem for the private enterprises like Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC), Bank merger, GST and Faceless IT assessment. The Prime Minister further said that the government is also doing such policy reforms which the country had given up hope. In the agriculture sector, the Prime Minister said the rules and regulations made after independence, left the farmers in the hands of middlemen. After amendment in Agricultural Produce Market Committee (APMC) Act, now farmers have the right to sell to anyone, in any state of the country.

The PM said that labour reforms are being done to increase employment opportunities, keeping the welfare of our workers in mind. Non-strategic sectors in which the private sectors were not allowed, have also been opened. Commercial mining is now allowed in the coal sector, he added. Prime Minister said "In the direction the government is moving, be it our mining sector, energy sector, or research and technology, industry will also get opportunities in every field, and new opportunities will also open for youths. Going beyond all this, now the participation of private players in the strategic sectors of the country is also becoming a reality. Whether you want to invest in the space sector, or want to explore new opportunities in atomic energy, the possibilities are completely open for you."

The Prime Minister said the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector is like an economic engine of our country and contributes around 30% of the GDP. He said that a long time demand of the industry to update the definition of MSMEs has been fulfilled. This will enable MSMEs to grow without any worries and they will not have to follow other paths to maintain the status of MSMEs. Global tenders have been scrapped in government procurement of up to Rs 200 crores to benefit crores of associates working in MSMEs of the country, he added. PM said that the expectation of India from the world has increased and they trust India more. India helped more than 150 countries with medical supplies, he added. The Prime Minister said that the world is looking for a trusted, reliable partner. In India, there is a potential, strength and ability. He urged the industry to take full advantage of the trust that has developed towards India. He stressed that Getting Growth Back is not so difficult either. The biggest thing is that now Indian Industries have a clear path that is **Aatmanirbhar Bharat**. He clarified that **Aatmanirbhar Bharat** means that we will become stronger and embrace the world. **Aatmanirbhar Bharat** means to be fully integrated with the world economy and also supportive.

centimetres. He also said, there is a good distribution of monsoon rainfall in the country.

He said, quantitatively, it will be 107 per cent of long period average in North West India, 103 per cent in Central India, 102 per cent in South Peninsula and 96 per cent in North East India which is less than normal. Dr Rajeevan also said, in July, there will be a good rainfall as it is very crucial for agriculture. He said, however, the month of August will also witness good rainfall but it will be little less than the normal monsoon.

On onset of monsoon, he said, the Southwest monsoon has arrived in Kerala and it has covered most of the state. (Source : india.gov.in)
