## 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh Victory Flame' commemorating 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of historic victory in 1971 War reaches A&N Islands

### Lt Governor, A&N Islands receives the Victory Flame at Naval Jetty

**Flame reminds us of glorious victory & sacrifices of heroes in 1971 war and will be carried to all parts of 'New Andamans': LG**  
**Passage of Flame through various parts of Isles would spread reassurance of coming out victorious through tough times & strengthen our resolve to fight all challenges: LG**



Port Blair, Aug. 3

India is commemorating 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the historic victory in 1971 war as 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh'. The celebrations commenced with Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi lighting the Victory Flame on December 16, 2020. The Victory Flame was lit from the eternal flame of the National War Memorial and signifies the bravery of our heroic soldiers during the war. Since then, the Victory Flame is travelling across the length and breadth of India and a large number of commemorative events have been conducted during its journey. The Victory Flame arrived here today by Indian Naval Ship INS Sumedha and was ceremonially received by the Hon'ble Lt Governor, A&N Islands Admiral DK Joshi, PVSM, AVSM, YSM, NM, VSM (Retd.) and was formally handed over to Lieutenant General Ajai Singh, AVSM Commander-in-Chief, A&N Command (CINCAN), for conduct of commemorative

activities at a function held at Port Blair Naval jetty. The solemn and grand ceremony was witnessed by the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain, war veterans, senior officers, officers of Civil Administration and personnel of ANC with fervor, nostalgia and enthusiasm. The Victory Flame will be in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands till August 28, 2021. During this period, a large number of events have been jointly planned by the A&N Administration and ANC. The Victory Flame will travel to all the major Islands of Andaman and Nicobar before being handed over to the Eastern Naval Command at Port Blair on August 28, 2021. The Indian Navy and Coast Guard Ships sounded 50 gongs marking the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the decisive victory of the Indian armed forces.

Addressing the historic day, the Lt Governor said that it is a great honour to receive the 'Swarnim Vijay Mashal' on behalf of A & N Islands. This

flame was ignited on 16th Dec., 2020 by the Hon'ble Prime Minister to commemorate 50<sup>th</sup> year of our Victory in the 1971 war and has reached after travelling more than 4500 km over land and sea. "The flame reminds us of our glorious victory and sacrifices of our heroes in the 1971 war and would be carried to all parts of "New Andamans", he remarked.

The Lt Governor stated that all our resident ex-servicemen and Islanders alike would relate to the glory that the flame embodies and cherish the memories of a hard fought victory that remains enshrined in gold letters in the annals of our history. "This flame also reminds the world that although we are a peace loving nation, we will defend our National interests robustly and with irreparable repercussions for the adversary", he mentioned adding that today's generation would feel special pride in being citizens of a nation which not only stand against atrocities but also

help our friendly neighbours in their times of need.

The Lt Governor asserted that freedom cannot be taken for granted and it is only as strong as the resolve and will of the citizens to fight for it. Our leadership and Armed Forces exemplified this during the 1971 war, where we not only ensured safeguarding of our national boundaries but also liberated a neighbour from the clutch of atrocities to bring the enemy down to its knees. We also demonstrated this during the Kargil war, Doklam standoff and most recently during the Galwan clashes. Our armed forces have all through played key decisive roles during these testing episodes and came out stronger.

The Lt Governor stated that it is reassuring to see that the Armed Forces, one of which I had the great honour of commanding, have organised a worthy reception in remembrance of our war heroes. He congratulated the ANC under the

### District Administration (SA) extends lockdown/ restricted movement till Aug. 10 with more relaxation

Shops selling essential and non-essential items shall be allowed to open between 6 am & 10 pm  
Parks/Playgrounds/Stadiums/Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted till 10 pm with 50% capacity  
All Religious places/ places of worship allowed to open till 10 pm with 25 persons at a time

Port Blair, Aug. 3

In order to ensure containment measures of isolation and social distancing in the South Andaman District with continuous focus on the fivefold strategy for effective management of COVID-19 i.e. Test-Track-Treat-Vaccination and adherence to COVID appropriate behavior to control any surge of the cases of COVID-19

again and also to prevent any disturbance to the peace and tranquility and taking into consideration the request of the public representatives and general public, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr.P.C., has ordered that lockdown/restricted movement shall

continue to be in force in the entire District of South Andaman from 04.08.2021 with no movement of men and materials between 10 pm & 6 am except for those specified. Accordingly, shops selling essential and non-essential items shall be allowed to open between 6 am & 10 pm by observing COVID appropriate behavior. It shall be the sole responsibility of the

owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and shall be held responsible for any violation and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/ establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall be liable for action under DM Act.

The South Andaman District Administration in the fight against COVID-19 pandemic has taken various actions to strengthen the healthcare facilities in order to provide better care to the patients. With the resolute efforts of the Chief Secretary, A&N Administration, Shri Jitendra Narain, 250 oxygen concentrators of 10 litres have been received from the M/s

The A & N Administration after detailed deliberations and consideration has decided to open up tourism activities with lots of caution and prayers to God and fingers crossed from Aug. 3 in South Andaman & N&M Andaman Districts. With the opening of tourism, the Administration has also

appealed to the people to follow COVID appropriate behavior and cautioned that incase, the number of COVID positive cases goes beyond 75, then the Administration will be forced to resort to lockdown and strict measures. Night curfew will continue and the District Administration will continue to conduct random RAT sample test on people.

Further, the Transport & Shipping Departments have been asked to exercise caution and adhere to the SOPs and avoid overcrowding in buses and vessels. The police authorities are being advised to take action even against the Transport and Shipping authorities for overcrowding. The hotel & private vessel owners are being

advised to conduct RAT on tourists/ passengers on payment basis as an additional safety layer in the interest of residents of A&N Islands.

The result of All India Secondary School Examination 2021 (Class X) has been announced today. During the academic session 2020-21, 120 Secondary Schools

(including all management) have registered with CBSE for conducting Class X examination 2021. During the compilation of results of 120 schools, out of 7085 candidates appeared in

the examination, 6998 candidates have qualified in the examination, 72 candidates are placed in compartment and result of 15 candidates is placed under RL (Result Late). The overall pass

percentage of Class X stands at 98.77% with an increase of 10.92% as compared to previous year results of 87.85%.

The Victory Mashal is traversing across the length and breadth of our country. This Mashal makes its journey to various commemorative events which are being held to pay homage to those who laid down their lives for India's biggest military victory, he said.

Earlier, the victory flame was accorded a joint Guard of Honour comprising of defence personnel of the Army, Navy, Air Force and

The Victory Flame post handing over to CINCAN travelled to Headquarter ANC, Goalghar Jn, Secretariat, Fire Brigade Jn and later to Flag Point where it was handed over to the Military Component Commander of the Andaman and Nicobar Command for further display at the historic location.

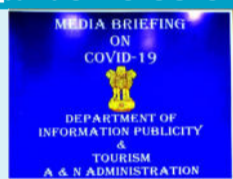

**Media briefed on COVID-19**

**Relaxation in lockdown should not be construed as war against the pandemic is over: Secretary (IP&T)**

Port Blair, Aug. 3

The Secretary (IP&T), Shri Sunil Kumar Singh briefing the media persons on COVID-19 status in the Islands held in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 360 flight passengers, who arrived here yesterday, no positive case has been detected. RAT test was conducted on 348 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj and one positive case was found. Today, 2 flights with 344 passengers arrived here and the results of RT-



PCR reports are awaited. The mobile testing team conducted random sample test at Shadipur today on 48 persons and all the reports were negative. The Secretary urged the citizens to adhere to COVID appropriate behavior and relaxation in lockdown should not be construed as the war against the pandemic is over.

Speaking about vaccination drive which

is being conducted smoothly in Isles, the Secretary said 1240 persons were vaccinated today till 3 pm, out of which, 620 were in the age group of 18-44.

The Director, ANIIMS, Dr. A.K Mandal said that 1 corona patient is undergoing treatment at GB Pant Hospital while no patient is on oxygen or ventilator.

The Deputy Director, GB Pant Hospital, Dr. Amitabha De mentioned that one new patient has been admitted and with this, the total number of patients being taken care of at ITI COVID Care Centre is now 3.

**Drive against encroachment on Govt. revenue land by District Administration**  
**2.50 hectares of revenue land restored**

The District Administration in its drive against encroachment on Government revenue land in the South Andaman District has been carrying out eviction drives during the last few days.

In continuation to this encroachment eviction drive was carried out by the revenue functionaries at Radhanagar, Swaraj Dweep, in the presence of Assistant Commissioner (Swaraj/ Shaheed Dweep). An area of around 2.50 hectares of Government Revenue Land was been restored to its original status with reference to Sy.No 67/1.

Around 1900 arecanut sapling were removed from the Government land.

Similar eviction drives were also conducted by the revenue field functionaries at Attam Pahad and at Matura village. 2 temporary structures were removed and approx 400 Sq.mtr. Government land was restored at Attam Pahad. An area of 3200 sq. mtrs of revenue land in Sy.No.108/7 was also restored at Mathura village.

Shri Suneel Anchipaka, Deputy Commissioner (SA) lauded the efforts of the revenue field staff and further cautioned

the general public to refrain from indulging in such illegal encroachments. He has requested the public to come forward in case of any inquiries or information regarding such illegal activities and can pass on such information to the District Control Room on the numbers 03192-240127/1077.

The Revenue Department as a custodian of all government land will continue its efforts to protect land from illegal encroachments by conducting such drives, a press release from Deputy Commissioner (SA) said.

No movement of men and material without valid movement pass/e-pass shall be allowed after 10 pm. Movement shall be allowed after 10 pm for medical emergency cases. Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo after 10 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement permit issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Travel of persons who intend to proceed to their destinations at mainland after 10 pm shall be allowed on production of valid travel documents. However, the person (one person) who intend to pick/drop after 10 pm, should apply for e-pass well in advance with supporting documents and the same shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate on case to case basis.

Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, ICMR, PBMC, Electricity, Shipping Services, Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty after 10 pm shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned departments. Movement of Officers/Officials, involved in providing services such as Pay & Accounts, Forest, Banking, Water Supply & Sanitation in Rural Areas, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication shall be allowed after 10 pm on production of movement passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of personnel involved in providing Broadcasting, all print and electronic media persons after 10 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of personnel involved in providing essential/emergency services shall be allowed after 10 pm on production of e-passes to be issued by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 10 pm. Movement of private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedics etc. attached with diagnostic centres and clinics, veterinary clinics shall be allowed after 10 pm on production of e-passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of persons from containment zones shall be strictly restricted and shall only be permitted on case to case basis upon approval from the Office of District Magistrate. Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/unloading/clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 10 pm only. e-Passes for operation of cargo movement after 10 pm needs to be obtained, which shall be strictly permitted on case to case basis by the Office of the District Magistrate.

Construction activities shall be permitted till 10 pm. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects beyond 10 pm shall be permitted with prior permission of District Magistrate and e-Passes needs to be obtained, which shall be strictly permitted on case to case basis by the Office of the District Magistrate. Movement of persons involved with Hotels/Restaurants and Mess for home delivery of food shall be allowed till 10 pm. Dine-in shall be permitted between 6 am to 10 pm only, subject to 50% of the seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. However, take away/parcel service and home delivery should be encouraged. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and he/she shall be held responsible for any violation and shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

Public Transport/Buses shall be allowed to ply with strict adherence to the SOPs issued in this regard by the Transport Department. Sale and service of liquor at licensed premises shall be permitted till 10 pm. SOPs and orders regarding the timings for sale and service of liquor at all licensed establishments (C, C1, B1, B2, B3 and B4 category) issued by the Deputy Commissioner (Excise), South Andaman should be strictly adhered to.

All Parks/Playgrounds/Stadiums/Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted till 10 pm with 50% capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. Any person violating the above directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.1,000/-, whereas the organisation shall be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/-.

Last rites/funerals shall be permitted with a maximum of 20 persons with strict adherence to COVID appropriate behaviours. No tribal passes will be issued for southern group of islands till further orders except for official purposes/national importance and strategic projects.

All Religious places/places of worship are allowed to open till 10 pm with 25 persons at a time along with priest for offering prayers. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The Management Committee of the religious places shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.25,000/- payable by the Committee.

Religious places/places of worship in containment zones shall remain closed. Only those outside containment zones will be allowed to open up. e-pass for emergency movement during restricted timings may be submitted online on <https://epass.andaman.gov.in>. The applicants/organizations submitting applications for e-pass should invariably submit valid and clear supporting documents, failing which the application will be summarily rejected.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.

Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s) and fine shall also be imposed as per Order issued by this office from time to time.

This order shall come into effect from 4<sup>th</sup> August 2021 and shall remain in force till 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2021.

## AAV & PHH ration card holders covered under NFSA urged to collect foodgrains by August 31

Port Blair, Aug. 3  
All AAV & PHH ration card holders covered under NFSA, 2013 have been informed that the GoI has extended distribution of foodgrains free of cost under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) @ 5 kg per person per month till November, 2021. Accordingly, in the month of August, 2021, each AAV & PHH person residing in South Andaman District, North & Middle Andaman District and Campbell Bay will be entitled for 5 kg foodgrains in the scale of 3.5 kg Rice and 1.5 kg Wheat

per person per month free of cost. Since, the tribal belt being a habitual rice eaters & in the absence of Flour Mills, PHH & AAV beneficiary of Car Nicobar and Nancowrie group of Islands will be entitled for 5 kg Rice per person per month free of cost under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY). This is in addition to the regular entitlement under NFSA.

All concerned have been requested to receive their entitlement from the nearest Fair Price Shop (FPS) before the end of August, 2021 without fail as it will not be carry

forwarded for the successive month. However, since portability has been implemented in the entire UT, ration card holders are free to collect their entitlement of foodgrains from any Fair Price Shop (FPS) of their choice.

Further, the migrants of other States living in this UT and are covered under NFSA in their respective States/UTs can also receive foodgrains from any FPS of this UT under the One Nation One Ration Card Scheme. For any clarification contact Toll Free No. 14445, a press release from Directorate of CS&CA said.

## I. GENERAL ADVISORY FOR TOURISTS AND STAKEHOLDERS

- The Tourism Activities are permitted only in South Andaman & North & Middle Andaman District except Nicobar District.
- Persons above 65 years of age, persons with home co-morbidities, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years advised not to travel for tourism purposes.
- Tourists/Visitors who are at higher risk due to some medical history are advised to take extra precautions.
- Tourists/visitors shall minimize contact with other staff and visitors as far as possible and zero contact policy should be followed at all tourist destinations.
- All tourists/visitors shall be briefed by the hotel concerned about do's& don'ts to be mandatorily followed during their stay and movements.
- While travelling tourists/visitors should wear a face mask and carry their own sanitizer and wet wipes for personal use.
- At all tourist destinations, staff must wear face mask and wash/sanitize hands regularly mandatorily while performing their duties.
- AarogyaSetu App shall be mandatory for all incoming tourists/visitors.
- Respiratory etiquettes to be strictly followed. This involves strict practice of covering one's mouth and nose while coughing/sneezing with a tissue/ handkerchief/ flexed elbow and disposing off used tissues properly after use.
- The tourists/visitors on arrival at Port Blair airport have to undergo mandatorily Covid-19 screening with RTPCR test free of cost. Thereafter the tourists/ visitors are allowed to move to their respective hotels. However, they will have to be under quarantine at Port Blair in their hotels rooms until the result of RTPCR tests are received. In case of RTPCR positive test results, the tourists/visitors shall be remain in institutional quarantine in hotels notified by the Hoteliers Association in consent with the A&N Administration, on rate as specified or to the designated hospital/ Covid19 care centre on case to case basis. Other guidelines prescribed by the Ministry of Civil Aviation for airport (available at <https://www.mohfw.gov.in> and SOP) issued by Airport Manager, VSI also need to be followed.

## II. SOP REGARDING COVID-19 TESTING FOR TOURISTS COMING TO ANDAMAN ISLANDS

### On arrival at Port Blair

- The tourists need to carry COVID-19 negative test report from mainland based ICMR approved lab using Reverse Transcriptase-Polymerase Chain Reaction (RTPCR). However, the sample for RTPCR test should have been taken within 48 hours prior to starting the journey from the origin station. (For e.g. if the tourist takes a flight from Delhi at 0600 hrs. on 1st January, 2021, the sample for RTPCR test should have been taken not before 0600 hrs. on 30th December, 2020).
- The tourists/visitors on arrival at Port Blair airport have to undergo mandatorily Covid-19 screening with RTPCR test free of cost. Thereafter the tourists/visitors are allowed to move to their respective hotels. However, they will have to be under quarantine at Port Blair in their hotels rooms until the result of RTPCR tests are received. In case of RTPCR positive test results, the tourists/visitors shall be remain in institutional quarantine in hotels notified by the Hoteliers Association in consent with the A&N Administration, on rates as specified or to the designated hospital/ Covid-19 care centre on case to case basis. Other guidelines prescribed by the Ministry of Civil Aviation for airport (available at <https://www.mohfw.gov.in> and SOP) issued by Airport Manager, VSI also need to be followed.
- Tourists may also have to undergo random Rapid Antigen Test conducted from time to time on payment basis as prescribed by A&N Administration.

### In case tourist tests Positive for COVID-19 during stay

- If the tourists tests positive during stay in the Islands, he/she will need to undergo institutional isolation as per existing health protocols. The cost of such isolation for govt. facility will be paid by the tourists as fixed by the administration from time to time.
- If the patient wants to stay at hotels, he/she can stay in the hotels if all the conditions below are met:
  - Patients are not symptomatic and not more than 60 years old.
  - Request/undertaking is made by patient in writing.
  - If allowed by doctors.
- Hotels will make necessary arrangement to designate a part of their rooms for institutional isolation for this purpose.

### For travel to North & Middle Andaman District

The tourists are allowed to visit Baratang/North & Middle Andaman subject to compulsory RAT testing for Andaman Trunk Road commuters which will be carried out at Forest check post on the spot / same day on payment of applicable charges.

## III. Standard Operating Procedure for National Memorial Cellular Jail

- There will be a cap on the number of tourists/visitors in the National Memorial Cellular Jail which will accept tourists/visitors, as per the details given below:-

- Entry tickets shall be issued by e-mode / online only through [www.andamantourism.gov.in/etourist](http://www.andamantourism.gov.in/etourist).
- The tourist/visitors shall follow strict social distancing norms.
- Use of Face Mask is mandatory.
- Tourists/visitors will have to undergo mandatory hand hygiene and thermal scanning at the entrance.
- Tourists/visitors to strictly follow the designated routes for entry and exit and movement inside the monument.
- The department has the authority to restrict access to any part of the museum.
- Tourists/visitors to strictly adhere to the time limits / slot.
- The security staffs to ensure that there is no crowding at any point of time inside the monument.
- Group photography will not be allowed within the premises.
- Vehicles will not be allowed to be parked in front of the memorial. Parking will be allowed only in designated areas.
- Registered Guides will only be allowed to work inside the museum. Each guide will cater to maximum four guests who will maintain social distancing during the guided tour.
- No food and eatables will be allowed inside the monument/premises.
- Spitting and smoking are strictly prohibited inside the monument.
- Tourist / visitors shall not throw waste inside the monument.
- Tourist /visitors should avoid overcrowding at the drinking water site and at the washroom area.
- Respiratory etiquettes to be strictly followed. This involves strict practice of covering one's mouth and nose while coughing/sneezing with a tissue/ handkerchief/ flexed elbow and disposing off used tissues properly after use.

## IV. Standard Operating Procedure for Light & Sound Show at Netaji Subash Chandra Bose Island

- There will be only one show daily between 06 PM to 07 PM. (Hindi shows on all days except Wednesday. On Wednesday there will be English show).
- The show will be operated at 50% of the total seating capacity, following social distancing.
- The tourists/visitors shall follow strict social distancing norms. Seating arrangements to be made accordingly.
- Any additional guidelines regarding boat travel issued by DC (SA) / A&N Administration to be followed.
- Use of face mask will be mandatory for all the people visiting the show.
- Tourists/visitors will have to undergo mandatory hand hygiene and thermal screening at the entry point. Only asymptomatic staff and guests shall be allowed.
- Tourists/visitors to strictly adhere to the time limits.
- Group photography will not be allowed during the show.
- Spitting and smoking are strictly prohibited during the show.
- Tourist / Visitors should avoid overcrowding in the washroom area.
- Respiratory etiquettes to be strictly followed. This involves strict practice of covering one's mouth and nose while coughing/sneezing with a tissue/ handkerchief/ flexed elbow and disposing off used tissues properly after use.

## V. Standard Operating Procedure for opening of Beaches in A&N Islands

- The Tourism activities are permitted only in South Andaman and North & Middle Andaman District except Nicobar District.
- The beaches will remain open between 10.00 AM to 05.00 PM daily.
- Tourists/visitors to maintain a minimum distance of 02 meters in public places / beaches.
- Use of face cover / mask will be mandatory for all the people visiting the beaches.
- Life Guards / TSET Members posted at various beaches to wear mask and hand gloves and take other required precautionary measures.
- Spitting shall be strictly prohibited on the beaches.
- Entrance gate of the beaches to have mandatory hand hygiene (sanitizer) and thermal screening provisions. Only asymptomatic staff and guests shall be allowed.
- Tourists/visitors shall monitor their health report about any illness immediately to the Beach Officers/Life Guards and TSET Members.
- Tourists/visitors shall dispose of face cover/masks/ gloves and other leftovers only in the dustbins.
- Tourists / visitors should follow the directions of staff regarding crowd management at beaches.
- Separate entry and exit for guests on the beaches to be organised, wherever feasible.
- Group photography will not be allowed at the beaches.
- Only authorised vendors to be allowed on the beaches.
- Tourists/visitors should avoid overcrowding in the washroom area.
- Tourists/visitors above 65 years will not be allowed.
- Respiratory etiquettes to be strictly followed. This involves strict practice of covering one's mouth and nose while coughing/sneezing with a tissue/ handkerchief/ flexed elbow and disposing off used tissues properly after use.

## VI. Standard Operating Procedure for Opening of Museums

- Only those museums which are in the non-containment zone will be opened for tourists/visitors.
- The Curator / In-charge / Staff of Museum shall ensure that hand sanitizer are made available at the entry point for visiting tourists/visitors.
- Entry tickets may be issued, preferably by e-mode only.
- The tourists/visitors shall follow social distancing norms. The use of face cover and mask will be mandatory.
- Entrance to have mandatory hand hygiene and thermal scanning facilities.
- There will be separate entry and exit point within the museum, as far as feasible.
- Tourists/visitor shall stick to time limit inside the museums.

- The security staff shall ensure that there is no crowding at entry or inside the museums.
- No food and eatables shall be allowed inside the museums.
- Tourists/visitors shall not touch walls, railings or any other items inside the museums
- Spitting and smoking are strictly prohibited in the museums.
- Respiratory etiquettes to be strictly followed. This involves strict practice of covering one's mouth and nose while coughing/sneezing with a tissue/ handkerchief/ flexed elbow and disposing off used tissues properly after use.

## VII. Standard Operating Procedure for Waterbased/Watersports activities

### A. General Standard Operating Procedure for Watersports

- The following general measures and the specific step as listed out herein are to be observed by all: Owner, Operator, Employees, Associations, Agents, Guides and Guests- at all times. General measures are:
- All Watersports/boating activities in containment zones shall remain closed and no operation shall be allowed.
  - It shall be made mandatory for guests and all those involved in operations to download, install and verify the status AarogyaSetu mobile application.
  - The Owner, Operator, Employees, Associations, Agents, Guides etc. Must subject themselves for thermal scanning at least twice in a day- before commencement of the duties in the morning and upon completion of the operations in the afternoon/evening.
  - All Guests arriving at the booking counter/watersports centre should be thermally scanned and the status ascertained on AarogyaSetu mobile app before the tickets are issued.
  - It is mandatory for all to wear the face-mask of stipulated standard all through and it should be enforced unflinchingly.
  - Respiratory etiquettes to be strictly followed. This involves strict practice of covering one's mouth and nose while coughing/sneezing with a tissue/ handkerchief/ flexed elbow and disposing off used tissues properly after use.
  - Sick or unwell guests to be immediately taken for check-up to nearest hospital in separate vehicle.
  - Booking of trips and allocation of slots should be planned to avoid unwarranted gathering of guests and adhere to social distancing norms.
  - Ensure that guests are taken in small groups to meet physical distancing norm of minimum 6 feet between guests and it should be strictly maintained. Any change in this norm should be in accordance to the Government norms from time to time.
  - Greet the guests with "Namaste" preferably with folded hands. Hand-shakes should be strictly avoided.
  - Agents and guides should carry sanitizer and wear mask.
  - Always carry extra face masks onboard to offer guest in case of emergency.
  - As per Ministry of Tourism stipulation, the Guides must handle group lesser than 10 guests. One dedicated person should be deployed for coordination of every group of maximum 10 guests.
  - At ticket counters/booths, the staff etc must wear the gloves and masks all through. In addition, face-shield for the counter-staff can also be considered.
  - Upon issuing the tickets, the guests should be given a detail brief on the do's and don'ts during the operations, and it must be reminded frequently till the trip is over.
  - Employees handling ticketing and currency transactions are compulsorily to wear, face shield and to hand sanitize the hand frequently.
  - Maintain the hygienic standards.

### B. Standard Operating Procedure for Boat owners

The following practices are to be strictly adhered to while taking guests for boating trips. The following SOP stipulates practices at each stage/facet and for specific stakeholders. The boat shall operate 50% passenger capacity.

#### I. Before Boarding the Boat (While arriving at watersports centre)

##### i. Boat Owners:

- It must be ensured that all touch points in public areas like the ticketing counter, counter tops, boat jetty, onboard boat, door handles, levers, hand railings, etc. are cleaned frequently and at regular intervals every day using a sanitizer/disinfectant. It is advised to use Sodium Hypochlorite 1% solution having at least 70% alcohol to clean these frequently touched points.
  - The commonly used personal safety protection equipments like Personal Floatation Device (PFD) should not be reused without disinfecting.
  - Ensure that hand sanitizers are made available in sufficient numbers and quantity for disinfection facilities of visiting tourists/crew members at the booking counter/booking stations.
  - At ticket counter, if wash basin is not available, a water tank fitted with tap may be placed at safe distance from booking counter/station. Soap dispenser may be placed near the wash-basin.
  - Face masks and sanitizers should be made available to guests on demand.
  - Proper documentation of the guest in each trip for contact tracing must be enforced. Use of separate trip sheets for each trip must be a standard practice.
  - The trip-sheet should have details viz.: Guest name, their age, city of domicile, telephone, date and time of the trip etc. Trip-sheet must be duly signed by the escort and owner.
- ##### ii. Operator and Crew Members:-
- To ensure all boat systems and engines function efficiently and all equipment and gears in full operating condition.
  - A boat operating with more than one staff, viz. the operator and crew/helper must ensure the stipulated social distancing norms on-board also.
  - The boat and all gears in use must be cleaned and disinfected before commencement of the operation, after which, it must also be thoroughly wash-down. On completion of trips every day also, above safe procedure must be followed.
  - To ensure that sanitizers are used by the guests before boarding the vessel.
  - Maintain the hygienic standards.

#### iii. Duties and responsibilities of Guests

- Vigilantly maintain the social distancing norms uncompromisingly.
- Avoid sharing of items like in addition eatables, water bottles, toys and safety gear etc. Always wear hand-gloves.
- Wash the hands frequently with soap for 20 - 30 seconds even if it is visibly not dirty.
- Hand sanitizers should be used before and after use of safety gear.
- Self-monitoring of health by all and reporting any illness at the earliest must be diligently practiced.
- All guests must mandatorily to have AarogyaSetu mobile application downloaded installed and used frequently.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

## II. While boarding the boat

### i. Duties and Responsibilities of owners:-

- Fix the queue markers as per distancing between norms in waiting areas and ensure the orders.
- Ensure complete discipline and order during boarding and to avoid unwarranted heckling.
- Ensure that all persons aboard are seated as per social distancing norms, wearing face masks, hand gloves etc.
- Ensure all equipments are adequately disinfected before and after every use.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

### ii. Duties and Responsibilities of Operator and Crew

- It shall be mandatory on part of the operator and crew to ensure social distancing norms on-board.
- It must be ensured that the hand gloves, masks and face shields are worn by the crew members, especially during the boarding and alighting.
- The guest needing assistance during boarding and alighting should compulsorily wear face shield and hand gloves.
- Specific seat should be allotted to each guest and they should not be allowed to change during the entire trip.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

### iii. Duties and Responsibilities of Guests

- Always allow the guests in front to move/board or alight first by maintaining social distancing norms.
- Always wait for those in front to completely disembark the ramps during boarding/alighting before others are allowed.
- Always walk in the walkways assigned and do not wander.
- The guests should avoid touching the objects/ surfaces when it is not absolutely necessary.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

## iv. During Ride- Duties and Responsibilities

### 1) Owners

- Proactive replenishment: Hand Sanitizers, Hand Gloves and Masks to be available at the Guest waiting Area.
- Supply sufficient disinfectants like sodium hypochlorite (1%) etc.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

### 2. Operators and Crews

- Safe operation practices must be strictly followed.
- Ensure that at no point during the trip, the guest should be allowed to change the seat or stand-up to avoid loss of balance and bodily contact.
- If bodily contact was necessary, use hand sanitizers and clean hands properly.
- Maintain safe speed so as to avoid any accidents or injury so that calling emergency services/help can be avoided.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

### 3. Guests

- Always wear a face mask and do not sneeze or cough openly, instead use towels or folded elbow. While onboard, should not stand-up to avoid loss of balance and bodily contact.
- To remain seated only at the assigned seat throughout the trip.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

## III. While Alighting- Duties and Responsibilities

### 1. Owners, Operators and Crew

- Ensure that the Jetty or marina area is not crowded. Complete discipline must be adhered to.
- Incoming boats should wait for their turn to use jetty/marina until all boats are cleared off.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

### 2. Guests

- Guest should vacate/disembark from boat by following social distancing norms.
- Remove safety gears and also sanitize the hand thereafter.
- Dispose of the disposables only at designated bins/containers.
- Maintain the hygienic standards.

### C. Standard Operating Procedure for Snorkeling

All Standard Operating Procedure mentioned above is to be complied with by the Operators/Crew members/Association/ Agents and Guests. However, additional measures/precautions to be taken on certain activity specific watersports such as Snorkeling which are as follows:-

#### Snorkelling:-

##### Before entering the water:-

- The Snorkeling Guide shall brief the guests on the importance of maintaining social distancing and operations of snorkelling.
- The Guests should have complete personal snorkelling kit full face mask. Only such guests should be allowed to undergo the ride.
- No Snorkeling equipments shall be hired, borrowed, lent or shared even among members of the same family.
- Only 02 guests per Guide must be allowed to snorkel at a time.
- All guests must compulsorily wear face masks and hand gloves until entering the water and upon leaving the water-body.
- At no point should the snorkelling guide touch any guest's snorkelling equipments. All demonstrations must be given using own equipments.

##### While in water:-

- Demonstrate snorkelling skills in thigh-level water, maintaining social distancing norms.
- All guests must wear a life jacket before entering the water.
- Use Lifebuoy with rope to tow the guests while snorkelling.

##### After leaving the water:-

- The safety gears such as Life Jacket and Life-buoy used by the guests must be rinsed, dried and disinfected before the next use.
- The snorkelling equipment used by the guide must be kept at possession at all times to avoid accidental usage by other guides. The Guide must be diligent on this practice.
- To ensure that the snorkel guide should mark all personal snorkeling kit with paint so that other persons may not use the same.

### D. Emergency Response Procedure

As we all are aware of the fact that Watersports/water based activities have inherent risk factor involved, therefore as part of precautionary measures the following preparedness is to be kept ready by the owner/operator/crew:-

#### 1. On board Emergency:-

- As a matter of practice, the Operator or Crew shall not disobey physical distancing norms unless any life-threatening emergency situation emerges.
- The Operator must call for Emergency Medical Service (EMS) from the boat, and with the victim, immediately rush to the shore.
- Assess the condition of patient till the emergency medical service arrives for help. If possible, ask the family or friend of the patient to aid the patient as per qualified First Aider instructions.
- When EMS arrives, brief the professional medical person about the condition and First Aid provided to the patient.
- If the PPE kit is available at Watersports centre, the qualified First Aider must wear the same to perform First Aid till the time EMS arrives.

#### 2. Over board Emergency:-

- During Man Over-board situation, the boat operator and crew must follow the standard MOB procedure to rescue the victim.
- All boats in operations must carry a boat embarkation ladder/scramble net and extra rope 14 mm and 15 meters length.
- To rescue the conscious victim on-board, the life guard/crew must give correct instructions to climb the ladder and to get on-board. If the victim requires support, provide step-by-step instructions to the family members or friends of the victim to assist him/her.
- If the victim is unconscious in water, use spinal board/ back board to mobilize the victim from water and recover him on-board.
- Once the victim is on-board, qualified First Aider must do complete assessment of victim for response. If the victim does not respond, i.e. No breath or No Pulse, contact EMS immediately and rush the victim to the shore. If possible, commence the CPR procedure on board. Else, administer the CPR procedure immediately after reaching the shore and securing the victim.

#### Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation:-

- If the Victim is not responding, the qualified CPR aider must wear PPE kit and gloves before commencing of chest compression. Continue chest compression at the rate of 100 per minute.
- Emergency breathing must be given only with AMBU bag, mouth to mouth resuscitation is strictly forbidden.
- Continue the procedure till the Emergency Medical Service arrives or the victim is handed over to a medical professional.

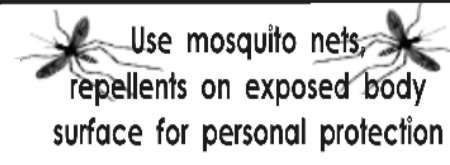

(ix) The Malayalee Origin candidates, whose parent have settled in A & N Islands permanently can apply for the above seats, provided such candidates have a minimum of 10 years continuous education in these Islands. 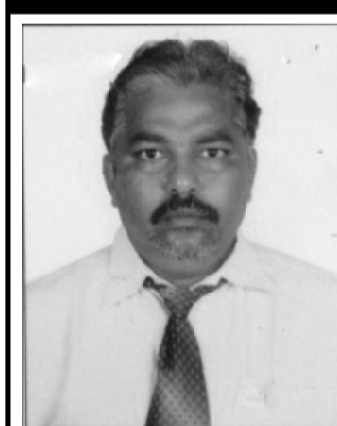

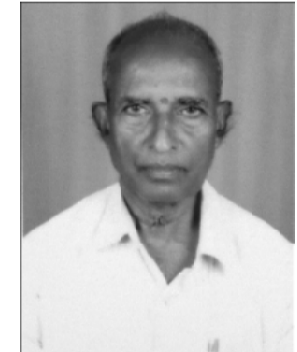

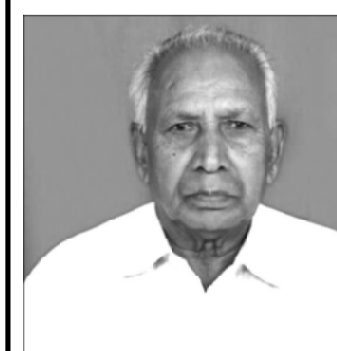
