COVID vaccination drive for 45+ continuing smoothly 1,11,154 doses of COVISHIELD vaccine administered so far in A&N Islands

Port Blair, May 4
 The vaccination drive is continuing in A&N Islands in an effective manner and health teams designated in various vaccination centres spread across the Islands are vaccinating all the beneficiaries above 45, who visit the centres spread over the A&N Islands on a daily basis. The vaccination sessions are continuing in more than 88 designated vaccination centres set up in different parts of the Islands towards the fight against Corona virus. 619 doses of COVISHIELD vaccines



were administered to the eligible beneficiaries by the health teams today (May 4), taking the total number of doses of vaccines administered so far to 1,11,154. The district wise figure administering of COVISHIELD doses to the eligible beneficiaries on May 4

 Despite several pleas by Administration through various modes of communication to people above 45, to get themselves vaccinated, as a shield against the virus, yet a lot many have still not taken the vaccine. The official health data reveals that during the second wave, so far, A&N Islands has recorded 8 deaths due to COVID and it has been found that all the 6 deceased who were 45+ had not taken the vaccination while 2 were below 45. This indicates that the efficacy of the vaccine in protecting the person against COVID is vital. By taking vaccination, a person, if at all infected it won't be that severe and life threatening.

CPCB issues list of certified compostable carry bag, package manufacturers & sellers

Business establishments urged to procure only compostable carry bags & packages from listed sellers

Port Blair, May 4


The Central Pollution Control Board, in order to systematically phase out the Single Use Plastic carry bag/package and to discourage the use of compostable carry bags manufactured by the unauthorized firms, has issued a list of CPCB certified compostable carry bag/package manufacturers/sellers and has directed all Industrial Units/Business establishments to use and procure only the compostable carry bags/packages from the listed manufacturers/sellers. It has been further informed that using of non CPCB certified compostable carry bags/package and procuring compostable carry bags/packages from sellers/manufacturers other than the ones listed and authorized, invites non-compliance and violation of the provisions of the Plastic Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended, 2018. The list of certified manufacturers/sellers is available on the CPCB website https://cpcb.nic.in/certified_manufacturers-sellers/, a press release received from Directorate of Industries said.

Indian Coast Guard strikes again; apprehends Myanmar poachers in Indian EEZ

Port Blair, May 4

In a swift operation, Indian Coast Guard apprehended 4 Myanmar poachers illegally fishing in Indian waters off Barren Island. In the early hours on 2nd May, 2021, Indian Coast Guard ship Rajshree, during routine patrol in area, sighted one boat operating off Barren Island close to coast. The CG ship tried to establish communication with the boat, however, the boat did not respond. On realizing the presence of CG ship, the boat increased speed and entered the shallow waters to evade. The CG ship also increased speed to intercept, however, could not reach near the boat due to depth restrictions. The CG ship promptly responded by lowering ship's boat and dispatched boarding party for investigation/interception.

In order to escape apprehension by Indian Coast Guard, the poachers carried out forced ditching of their boat on the rocky shores of Barren and tried to flee in to the Island. The swift response and counter manoeuvre by CG boarding party resulted in apprehension of 2 poachers, while other managed to escape into the dense forest in the island. The boarding party also recovered fish catch including sea cucumber, turtle skull and conch shells from the ditched boat. The persistent efforts by CG ship to search for missing poachers resulted in apprehension of 2 more poachers on 3rd May, 2021. It is suspected that some of the poachers are still hiding in dense forest on Barren Island. The information has been shared with local police, Forest Department and Fisheries Authorities. Search of remaining poachers is in progress by CG ship. The apprehended poachers were handed over to local police at Port Blair on 4th May, 2021 for further investigation, a press release from PRO Coast Guard said.



BCCI suspends IPL 2021 indefinitely after four players test positive for COVID-19

New Delhi, May 3

The current season of Indian Premier League has been suspended due to emergence of multiple cases of Covid-19 in the players. The Indian Premier League Governing Council and Board of Control for Cricket in India in an emergency meeting has unanimously decided to postpone IPL 2021 season with immediate effect. In a statement, Indian Premier League has said, the BCCI does not want to compromise on the safety of the players, support staff and the other participants involved in organizing the IPL. It said, this decision was taken keeping the safety, health and wellbeing of all the stakeholders in mind. It further said, these are difficult times, especially in India and the BCCI will do everything in its powers to arrange for the secure and safe passage of all the participants. The ongoing season of IPL were drawing criticisms from the various corners due to emergence of the second wave of COVID-19 in the country. The management has created a Bio Bubble mechanism for the safety of the players, but despite these efforts several players recently found COVID positive. (Source:india.gov.in)

India, the vaccination drive for 18 + will begin in Isles. The Deputy Director, G.B. Pant Hospital, Shri Amitabha De said the number of corona positive patients in the G. B Pant Hospital is 70, of which 57 are on Oxygen support and no patient is on ventilator. He further disclosed that altogether, 3 patients were admitted today at COVID Care Centres. Further, 15 patients were discharged and at present 113 patients are still in COVID Care Centres in South Andaman District, the Deputy Director added. The Director, ANIMS, Dr. AK Mandal, informed that availability of oxygen is monitored in 3 to 4 levels. He said, at present oxygen cylinders are available in huge quantity and two Pvt. Gas filling agencies are also having good quantity of oxygen to refill the empty cylinders. A contingency plan has also been devised wherein a ship has been kept standby to bring full load of oxygen cylinders in emergency situation. Apart from this, the Administration has also planned for oxygen generator and another Oxygen Concentrator, the Director ANIMS said adding that we are having enough number of oxygen concentrator. Oxygen concentrators are devices that help concentrate oxygen from the ambient air by removing nitrogen and delivering pure oxygen to individuals. Apart from G.B Pant Hospital, good quantity of Oxygen Concentrators have also been made available to other two districts too to maintain the oxygen requirement, he said. The Director further disclosed that the Administration has planned to setup Oxygen Generator Plant. Apart from G. B Pant Hospital, Oxygen Generator Plant will be established in North & Middle Andaman District as well as Nicobar District, he said adding that these plants will generate huge capacity of oxygen. The Deputy Director, IP, Shri RS Meena also attended the press conference.

shall be permitted beyond 1 pm to 6 pm to cargo and essential services vehicles only. Restaurants/hotels can continue operations beyond 1pm to 8 pm for home delivery/parcel wherein explicit permission (by name) of the delivery boy shall be taken by the concerned Assistant Commissioner. Fishermen and persons supplying milk shall be permitted beyond 1pm to 6 pm wherein explicit permission (by name) of the person shall be taken by the concerned Assistant Commissioner. For construction sites, where labourers are within the premises, construction activities can go on and while materials from port can be received upto 6 pm, no labour movement shall be allowed. Officials on essential duties are permitted to travel on production of valid identity cards to be issued by the concerned HoDs. The establishments listed above shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of atleast one meter from a person and not allowing more than 5 persons at a time inside the premises. It shall be applicable with effect from 6th May, 2021 till further orders, an order to this effect issued by DM (N&M) added.

Draft Notification of A&N Islands (Rural Area) Water Supply (Bye-Laws) 2021 (Contd. from page 3 of DT issue dated May, 04, 2021)

ii) For any commercial use the charges will be levied on per Tonne basis i.e Rs.150/Tonne

iii) The consumers shall be charged double the normal rates described above, for installation of tube well without approval of the Gram Panchayat for the period from the date of installation of the tube well till the approval is obtained in this behalf.

(iv) The word size of the bore should be read as size of the lowering assembly of the tube well. Any tube well installed by the Department of Rural Development or Water Supply Department/Agency will not be charged any water tariff. However, the tube wells installed by the private persons, individuals or any other departments for any purpose i.e. drinking, irrigation or commercial shall be charged as per rates already specified therein.

37. Change of Water Tariff from Commercial to Domestic:

For change of water tariff from commercial to domestic, an affidavit shall be submitted by the consumer stating that the commercial activity was previously carried out but subsequently stands discontinued henceforth. The tariff shall be changed by the authorized officer of Water Supply Department/Agency based on an application along with affidavit to this effect.

38. Illegal use of Pumps and Motors:

No direct on line water boosting arrangement shall be installed by the consumer. In case, it is found to be installed on the direct water supply system within the premises, the following action shall be taken against the consumer:-

- Confiscation of pump/motor and fine of Rs. 500.00 for first offence.
- Confiscation of pump/motor and fine of Rs. 1000.00 for second offence.
- Disconnection of Domestic/Commercial water connection.
- Confiscated pump will be released to consumer only after paying of fine.

39. Illegal Restoration of already disconnected Water Supply:

To streamline the levy of water charges in cases where disconnected supply is restored without proper authority, the consumers shall be charged water charges for the consumption at the penal rates of double the applicable rates of the tariff structure along with defaulting amount. Additional Charges of Rs.500/- will also be charged for disconnection of water supply from the ferrule for each such attempt.

40. Disputes Settlement & Redressal Committees:

i) Any question, dispute or difference, whatsoever arising in respect of water connections obtained by the consumers from the Water Supply Department/Agency under these Bye-laws regarding water tariff, charges, penalties etc. imposed by the competent authority in accordance with or on account of violation of the said bye-laws shall be referred to the following Dispute Redressal Committees(DRC) constituted to settle the disputes.

iii) Procedure For Making An Application

In case, the consumer is not satisfied with the billed amount, he/ she will have to make a written request to the Member Secretary of the concerned Committee alongwith 50% of the billed amount in the shape of the Demand Draft payable to Water supply department/agency. The Member Secretary shall arrange a meeting of the Dispute Redressal Committee once in a month and place all such requests before the Committee for decision.

In case, the consumer is not satisfied with the decision of concerned Dispute Redressal Committee (Reviewing Authority), he can make an appeal to the Appellate Authority in writing within 15 days from the decision of Reviewing Authority.

In all these Dispute Redressal Committees, the Consumer and/or his authorized representative shall be given full opportunity to put his / her case before the concerned Dispute Redressal Committee. Normally, these committees shall try to arrive at a consensus decision. In case of difference of opinion amongst the Chairman / Members thereof, the case will be decided with a majority opinion present. The Dispute Redressal Committee shall pass speaking Orders/Decisions and

specify clearly, if any relaxation of rules is involved in the case. The Committee Members, if required, can also inspect / visit the premises to access the factual position. Each Dispute Redressal Committee shall decide the cases by holding maximum two meetings for any disputed case and in case the consumer or his/her authorized representative fails to turn up in the meeting, the decision of the Review/Appellate Authority shall be considered as final. Atleast one meeting will be convened in a period of one month by each committee to decide the case.

Decision of the Appellate Authority will be final and binding and no further appeal shall be entertained. These Committees shall review and decide all the cases including waiving off irrecoverable amounts. Further these Committees shall consider/review all the disputed cases of the consumers, who have been sanctioned water supply connection.

Meter connections including cases relating to excessive charging of water bills due to following reasons:

- Premises remained locked after construction but water bills kept on increasing every month.
- Premises initially occupied but thereafter remained locked for considerable period.
- Excessive water bill on account of high average consumption due to any technical defect in water meter including recording of wrong water meter reading.
- Excessive water charges bill due to leakage within the premises of the consumer.
- Water connection got sanctioned but physically no water connection was installed at site and the construction was not commenced or only a part of the building constructed but remained incomplete.
- Excessive water bill due to levy of commercial charges where the commercial activity was not carried out at all or was carried out for a limited period.
- To settle disputed bills, where the Water Supply Department/Agency disconnected the water supply but the same was reconnected by the consumer without the permission of Water Supply Department/informing the Water Supply Department/ Agency.
- Building was not fully occupied, only a Chowkidar/ Watchman residing for watch and ward.

All the pending cases lying for consideration/ review shall be forwarded to the concerned committees by the respective Member secretary of the area under their jurisdiction within a month from the issue of this Notification. However, the cases already decided prior to the formation of these committees shall not be reopened.

41. Every connection must have float valve at the end point of discharge mouth for control on over flow/wastage of water, it is mandatory or else the connection will be disconnected. Water Supply Department/Agency limits its responsibility of providing water at reasonable pressure upto a height of 1.0 m from the ground level of the building. Consumers are required to construct Storage Tanks / Sump Tanks within the height limit mentioned above for collecting water through the communication pipe.

42. No person shall construct any Latrine or Cesspool within Five meters of any well, tank, water pipe or in any position where such well, tank or pipe is likely to be injured or water therein polluted.
