Cabinet approves continuation of Samagra Shiksha Scheme for School Education from 1st April, 2021 to 31st March, 2026

Scheme covers 1.16 million schools, over 156 million students and 5.7 million Teachers of Govt. & Aided schools

New Delhi, Aug. 4 (PIB)

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, has given its approval for continuation of the revised Samagra Shiksha Scheme for a period of five years i.e., from 2021-22 to 2025-26 with a total financial outlay of Rs.2,94,283.04 crore which includes Central share of Rs.1,85,398.32

crore. The scheme covers 1.16 million schools, over 156 million students and 5.7 million Teachers of Govt. and Aided schools (from pre-primary to senior secondary level).

The Samagra Shiksha scheme is an integrated scheme for school education covering the entire gamut from pre-school to class XII. The scheme treats school education as a continuum and is in accordance with

Sustainable Development Goal for Education (SDG-4). The scheme not only provides support for the implementation of the RTE Act but has also been aligned with the recommendations of NEP 2020 to ensure that all children have access to quality education with an equitable and inclusive classroom environment which should take care of their diverse background, multilingual needs,

different academic abilities and make them active participants in the learning process.

The major interventions, across all levels of school education, proposed under the scheme are: (i) Universal Access including Infrastructure Development and Retention; (ii) Foundational Literacy and Numeracy; (iii) Gender and Equity; (iv) Inclusive Education; (v) Quality

and Innovation; (vi) Financial support for Teacher Salary; (vii) Digital initiatives; (viii) RTE Entitlements including uniforms, textbooks etc.; (ix) Support for ECCE; (x) Vocational Education; (xi) Sports and Physical Education; (xii) Strengthening of Teacher Education and Training; (xiii) Monitoring; (xiv) Programme Management; and (xv) National Component.

Vermicomposting - A source of alternative income for women

Port Blair, Aug. 4

Vermicomposting is a great way to improve the flavour, yield and overall health of plants and vegetables. The finished product from the vermicomposting process is called vermicast (worm castings). Vermicast is a very desirable soil amendment that increases the biodiversity and fertility of the soil.

Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) Phase-II, said to be the world's largest behavioural change & Flagship programme, will focus on scalable and commercially viable solutions to make the sanitation economy attractive to private businesses. The program



will strive to generate revenue through Solid Waste Management activities.

One such example is of the two SHG's namely Star SHG & Sanis SHG which are conducting vermicomposting in the two compost pits of Shivapuram Cluster at Gram Panchayat Shivapuram, under Rangat Block in the North

& Middle Andaman District. They do compost mainly by using dry & wet cow dung, dry grass, earthworms etc. Rural women can play a vital role in vermicomposting as they make major efforts for development and production.

Vermicomposting enterprise is a relatively

Lockdown/restricted movement shall continue to be in force in District of Nicobars till further orders

Shops selling essential and non-essential items allowed to open between 6 am & 10 pm • Parks/Playgrounds/Stadiums/Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted till 10 pm with 50% capacity and strict adherence to COVID appropriate behaviour

Port Blair, Aug. 4

In order to ensure containment measures of isolation and social distancing in the Nicobars District with continuous focus on the fivefold strategy for effective management of COVID-19 i.e. Test-Track-Treat-Vaccination and adherence to COVID appropriate behavior to control any surge of the cases of COVID-19 again and also to prevent any disturbance to the peace and tranquility and taking into consideration the request of the public representatives and

general public, Shri Yash Chaudhary, District Magistrate, Nicobars District, in exercise of the powers vested U/s 144 of Cr.P.C., has ordered that lockdown/restricted movement shall continue to be in force in the entire District of Nicobars from 04.08.2021 with no movement of men and materials between 11 pm to 6 am except for those specified. Shops selling essential and non-essential items shall be allowed to open between 6 am & 10 pm by observing COVID appropriate behavior.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and shall be held responsible for any isolation and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs. 50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall be liable for action under DM Act. Movement shall be allowed after 10 pm for medical emergency cases. All POL outlets shall be

opened from 6 am to 10 pm. Movement of private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedics etc. attached with diagnostic centres and clinics, veterinary clinics shall be allowed after 10 pm. Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/unloading/clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 10 pm only. For any relaxation in case of exigency, prior permission of Assistant Commissioner concerned may be obtained. Godowns and allied

One positive case detected during RT-PCR conducted on incoming flight passengers: Director (IP&T)

The Director (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar briefing the media persons on COVID-19 status in the Islands held in the conference hall of IP&T here this evening stated that during the RT-PCR test conducted on 360 flight passengers, who arrived here yesterday, one positive case has been detected. RAT test was conducted on 349

passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj and no positive case was found. Today, 2 flights with 321 passengers arrived here and the result of RT-PCR reports are awaited. The mobile testing team conducted random sample test at Austinabad and Brookshabad areas today on 92 persons and all the reports were negative. Speaking about

vaccination drive which is being conducted smoothly in Isles, the Secretary said 968 persons were vaccinated today till 3 pm, out of which, 653 were in the age group of 18-44. support available under Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY) for seaweed culture and project being implemented by CSMCRI for identification of suitable sites, standardization of culture techniques and selection of species for taking up the activity in the Islands. During the programme, live demonstration was conducted by the CSMCRI team on the fabrication of rafts, insertion of seedlings followed by video presentation on seaweed farming activities being carried out in Mandappam Coast, Tamil Nadu. The participants raised queries regarding marketing of the harvest and clearances required from Government agencies for undertaking the activity which were clarified on the spot. The Joint Director (Fisheries) assured all cooperation and assistance from the Department of Fisheries to the beneficiaries for taking up seaweed cultivation as an option for additional income. The training programme was followed by field visit to the seed bank facility at Hathi Tappu. The programme was coordinated by Shri C. Hamza, Assistant Director of Fisheries, South Andaman. The programme was attended by 35 villagers and 15 officials from the Department of Fisheries, a press release from Directorate of Fisheries said.

Deepika suicide case: FIR U/s 306 IPC filed against Sub-Inspector

Port Blair, Aug. 4
Ms. Deepika Kishan, R/o Bambooflat committed suicide at her residence on July 30, 2021 and a UDFIR was registered at PS Bambooflat. Investigations done so far have prima-facie revealed that deceased was in a relationship with Sub-Inspector of A&N Police. It has also come to

notice that this Sub-Inspector was simultaneously having relationship with another woman. This made the deceased apprehensive. She sought help of husband of the woman in sorting her relationship. As per the husband of other woman, on the day of the suicide, the deceased took her own photograph with her

dupatta tied around her neck and mentioned that she is committing suicide and the woman will never be happy for ruining her life. A case FIR No. 45/21 dated 03/08/2021 U/s 306 IPC has been registered at PS Bambooflat against the Sub-Inspector, a press release from SP (SA) said.

establishments which are permitted as per said Order can operate till 10 pm for non-business purposes and should not cater to any customers. Only internal operations, receiving/dispatching of stocks etc. shall be permitted. For any relaxation in case of exigency, prior permission of Assistant Commissioner concerned may be obtained. Establishments violating this provision shall be liable for fine of Rs.25,000/- For any relaxation in case of exigency, prior permission of Assistant Commissioner-concerned may be obtained. Construction activities shall be permitted till 10 pm. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects beyond 10 pm shall be permitted with prior permission of respective Assistant Commissioners. Movement of persons involved with Guest House/Hotels/Restaurants and Mess for home delivery of food shall be allowed till 10 pm. Dine-in shall be permitted between 6 am to 10 pm only, subject to 50% of the seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviours. However, take away/parcel service and home delivery should be encouraged. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and he/she shall be held responsible for any violation and shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act. Public Transport/Buses shall be allowed to ply with strict adherence to the SOPs issued in this regard by the Transport Department. All Parks/Playgrounds/Stadiums/Gyms and yoga institutes shall be permitted till 10 pm with 50% capacity and strict adherence to COVID appropriate behaviours. Any person violating the above directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs.1,000/-, whereas the organisation shall be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/-. Last rites/funerals shall be permitted with a maximum of 20 persons with strict adherence of to COVID appropriate behaviours. All Religious places/places of worship are allowed to open till 10 pm with 25 persons at a time along with priest for offering prayers. Wearing of face masks, maintaining social distancing, provision of thermal scanning and use of hand wash and sanitizers will be mandatory. The Management Committee of the religious places shall be responsible to ensure strict compliance and any violations of the directions shall be liable for fine to the tune of Rs. 25,000/- payable by the Committee. In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services. - The visitors/guests and the operators must travel independently and in separate vehicles/vessels;
 - The social distancing norms and face-masks should be followed compulsorily;
 - While not under-water, face-mask for all must be compulsory.
- The boat operators, Crew members and all other staff should be tested for Covid - 19 by RAT/RT-PCR once in every 15 days.
 - The operators shall have to mandatorily maintain daily list of tourists/guests handled by the centres with full contact details for the purpose of contact tracing.

II. SPECIFIC PREVENTIVE MEASURES FOR JET SKI OPERATORS:-

- It demands close body contact between the operator and guest during rides, which is unavoidable. Therefore, PWC operator must wear two-piece full body raincoat, gloves and Face shield (as mentioned in Appendix 1) during operation.
 - Before taking the guest on ride, brief the guest for seating position during the ride and re-boarding procedure in case of toppleup.
 - Guest shall wear face mask and face shield during theride.
 - Operator shall ride the PWC carefully to avoid capsizing and recovery procedure.
 - On completion of each ride, thoroughly sanitize/disinfect PWC andallequipment's.
 - Personal Flotation Device used by guest must be disinfected thoroughly and to avoid its use for next 48 hours.
- III. In the event of any violation of this SOP by the operator, in the first instance, the operator will be debarred for fifteen days and in case of second time violation, the license of that particular operator will be suspended for three months.

B. STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE FOR PARASAILING CENTRE:-

- The visitors/guests and the operators must travel independently and in separate vehicles/vessels;
 - The social distancing norms and face-masks should be followed compulsorily;
 - While not under-water, face-mask for all must be compulsory.
- The boat operators, Crew members and all other staff should be tested for Covid - 19 by RAT/RT-PCR once in every 15 days.
 - The operators shall have to mandatorily maintain daily list of tourists/guests handled by the centres with full contact details for the purpose of contact tracing.

II. Specific Preventive Measures For Parasailing Centres:-

- Parasailing activity requires close contact with the guests during operations. Adequate protection must be taken by both the operators and crew to protect themselves from the virus contraction and thereby being a carrier.
- Harness should be disinfected and dried after every use.
 - The Operator/Crew should demonstrate to the guests on how to wear the harness. The Operator/Crew shall only inspect whether the harness is secured properly.
 - Parasailing boat should carry only half the capacity of passengers on board as registered with the local administration to ensure social distancing.
 - The Operator and crew shall wear a full length two-piece rain coat as a personal protection equipment to protect themselves from virus contraction.
 - It must be ensured that rigid Face shield (as mentioned in Appendix 1) and gloves are worn by the operator and crew.
 - The Parasailing boat should have a spare PPE kit and AMBU bag onboard at all times to mitigate emergency.
 - All guests should board the parasailing boat only if they are wearing a face mask and gloves. Face masks and gloves should be made available to guests on demand.
 - Frequent hand sanitization should be reminded to the guests. This must be ensured by the operator/crew.
 - All directives under pleasure boating rides of this document must be strictly adhered to while conducting parasailing operations.
 - Buddy from the Parasailing centre should be avoided for the flight as far as possible.
 - Systematic logging of the activities as stipulated.
- III. Standard Operating Procedure for Boat Operation-Parasailing
- The following practices are to be strictly adhered to while taking guests for parasailing. The following SOP stipulates practices at each stage/facet meticulously.

1. Before Boarding (While arriving at Watersports centre)

(i). Boat Owners:

- It must be ensured that all touch points in public areas like the ticketing counter, counter tops, boat jetty, onboard boat, door handles, levers, hand railings, etc. are cleaned frequently and at regular intervals every day using a sanitizer/disinfectant. It is advised to use Sodium Hypochlorite 1% solution having at least 70% alcohol to clean these frequently touchedpoints.
- The commonly used personal safety protection equipment like Life jackets/Personal Flotation Device (PFD) should not be reused without cleaning anddisinfecting. Initsabsence,theriskofcontractingthevirusincreases.If same PFD's are to be reused every day, it must be cleaned with lukewarm water and dried and rubbed thoroughly with alcohol (70%) basedsanitizers.
- Ensure that hand washing facilities like wash-basin in working condition and sanitizers are available for use at the booking stations along with provision for timelyreplenishment.
- At ticket counter, if wash basin is not available, a water tank fitted with tap may be placed at safe distance from booking counter/station. Foot operated soap dispenser may be placed near the wash-basin.
- Face masks and sanitizers should be made available to guests ondemand.
- Proper documentation of the guest in each trip for contact tracing must be enforced. Use of separate trip sheets for each trip must be a standardpractice.
- The trip-sheet should have details viz.:Guest name, their age, city of domicile, telephone, date and time of the trip etc.Trip-sheet must be duly signed by the escort andowner.
- Minimum two Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) kit must be available at Watersports centre for handling of COVID symptom staff or guest or for medical emergencies.

- Maintain proper Log-in mechanism as per below. This shall be in addition to the standard Log-inprocedure:
 - ✓ Equipment log-in: There should be entries on equipment number, date of use, disinfection date and time, Visitor/guest used thegears;
 - ✓ Guest log-in: Name and contact details, thermal scanner &oxymeter reading, Sr. Number of the equipments and gearsissued.
 - ✓ Separate record to be maintained for disinfected and issued equipment's.
- (ii). Operator and Crew Members
 - To ensure all boat systems and engines function efficiently and all equipment and gears in full operatingcondition.
 - A boat operating with more than one staff, viz. the operator and crew/helper must ensure the stipulated social distancing norms on-board also.
 - The boat and all gears in use must be cleaned and disinfected before commencement of the operation, after which, it must also be thoroughly wash- down. On completion of trips every day also, above safe procedure must be followed.
 - To ensure that sanitizers are used by the guests before boarding the vessel.

(iii). Association/ Agents/Guides

- Greet the guests with "Namaste" preferably with folded hands. Hand-shakes should be strictly avoided.
 - Agents and guides should carry sanitizer and wearmask.
 - Always carry extra face masks onboard to offer guest in case ofemergency.
 - As per Ministry of Tourism stipulation, the Guides must handle group lesser than 10 guests. One dedicated person should be deployed for coordination of every group of maximum 10 guests.
 - At ticket counters/booths, the staff etc must wear the gloves and masks all through. In addition, face-shield for the counter-staff can also beconsidered.
 - Upon issuing the tickets, the guests should be given detail brief on the do's and don'ts during the operations, and it must be reminded frequently till the trip is over.
 - Employees handling ticketing and currency transactions are compulsorily to wear, face shield and to hand sanitize the handfrequently.
- ##### (iv). The Guests
- Vigilantly maintain the social distancing normsuncompromisingly.
 - Avoid sharing of items like in addition eatables, water bottles, toys and safety gear etc. Always werehand-gloves.
 - Wash the hands frequently with soap for 20 - 30 seconds even if it is visibly not dirty.
 - Hand sanitizers should be used before and after use of safetygear.
 - Self-monitoring of health by all and reporting any illness at the earliest must be diligentlypracticed.
 - All guests must mandatorily to have AarogyaSetu mobile application downloaded installed and usedfrequently.

2. While Boarding the Boat

(i). Boat Owners:

- Fix the queue markers as per distancing norms in waiting areas and ensure the orders.
- Ensure complete discipline and order during boarding and to avoid unwarranted heckling.
- Ensure that all persons aboard are seated as per social distancing norms, wearing face masks, hand glovesetc.
- Ensure all equipments are adequately disinfected before and after everyuse.

(ii). Operator and Crew

- It shall be mandatory on part of the operator and crew to ensure social distancing normson-board.
- It must be ensured that the hand gloves, masks and face shields are worn by the crew members, especially during the boarding andalighting.
- The guest needing assistance during boarding and alighting should compulsorily wear face shield and handgloves.
- Specific seat should be allotted to each guest and they should not be allowed to change during the entiretrip.

(iii). The Guests

- Always allow the guests in front to move/board or alight first by maintaining social distancingnorms.
- Always wait for those in front to completely disembark the ramps during boarding/alighting before others areallowed.
- Always walk in the walkways assigned and do not wander orjaywalk.
- The guests must be told to avoid touching the objects/ surfaces when it is not absolutelynecessary.

3. During the Ride

(i). Boat Owners-

- Proactive replenishment: Hand Sanitizers, Hand Gloves and Masks to be available at the Guest waiting Area.
- Supply Garbage Bags (separate bio-hazard bags for used masks and other PPEs as per CPCB's guidelines), sufficient disinfectants like sodium hypochlorite (1%) etc. are in order.

(ii). Operator and Crew

- Safe operation practices must be strictlyfollowed.
- Ensure that at no point during the trip, the guest should be allowed to change the seat or stand-up to avoid loss of balance and bodilycontact.
- If bodily contact was necessary, use hand sanitizers and clean handsproperly.
- Maintain safe speed so as to avoid any accidents or injury so that calling emergency services/help can be avoided.

(iii). The Guests

- Always wear a face mask and do not sneeze or cough openly, instead use towels or folded elbow. While onboard, should not stand-up to avoid loss of balance and bodilycontact
- To remain seated only at the assigned seat throughout thetrip.

4. While Alighting

(i). Owners, Operator and Crew

- Ensure that the Jetty or marina area is not crowded. Complete discipline must be adheredto.
- Incoming boats should wait for their turn to use jetty/marina until all boats are cleared offit.
- Keep the hand-gloves and seek help of the crew if necessary foralighting.

(ii). Guests

- Use hand-gloves while alighting. Should vacate from boat with order and discipline and by following social distancingnorms.
- Remove safety gears and sanitise the handafterwards.
- Dispose of the disposables only at designatedbins/containers.

5. After the Ride

(i). Owners, Operator and Crew

- OncompletionofeachrideSanitize/disinfectboatandallequipment'sthoroughly.
 - Personal Flotation Device used by guest must be disinfected thoroughly and if possible avoid using the same PFD for nexttrip.

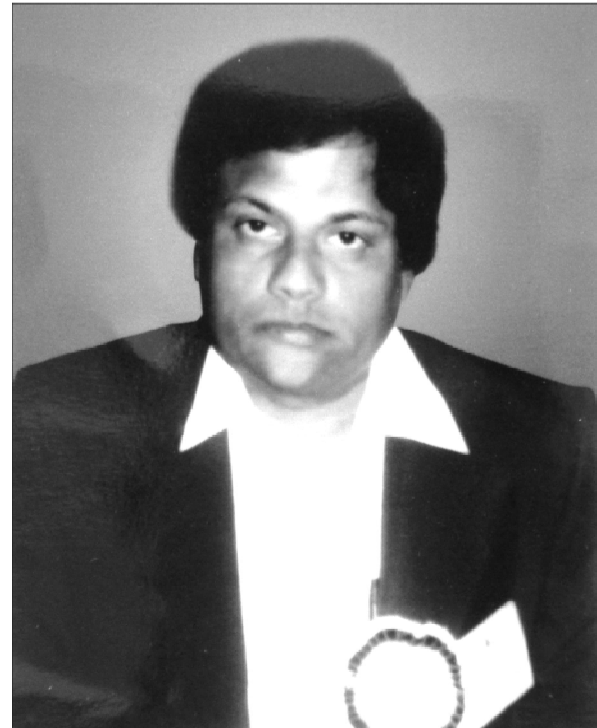
