Eco Tourism Project in Smith Island is likely to attract International tourists in North & Middle Andaman

Port Blair, Dec. 5

ANIIDCO an undertaking of Andaman & Nicobar Islands Administration has invited Request for Qualification (RFQ) for setting up of the Luxury Tents & Tree Houses at Smith Island and the last date for submission of RFQ application was on 29.11.2021. Requisite number of RFQ applications have been received which are being evaluated for next stage. Eligible RFQ applicants shall be issued Request for Proposal (RFP) for submission of financial bid after approval of Standing Finance Committee (SFC), Govt. of India.

The exotic Smith Island connected by a sand bar to the Ross Island Wildlife Sanctuary is an ideal nature based tourism destination. The Islands Development Agency (IDA) in coordination with NITI Aayog had identified Smith Island as one of the Islands in A&N Islands for holistic development. The objective is to create high end tourism destination in an environmentally sustainable manner so that the ecology of the Islands is fully protected.

A land parcel measuring 25 hectares at Smith Island had been identified for setting up the



project. MoEF&CC has already granted CRZ Clearance for setting up of the project with certain conditions. The resort shall include a total of 70 rooms with an estimated project cost of Rs. 60 crores. The resort shall offer world class modern facilities & amenities and activities including scuba diving, snorkelling, nature trail & treks, banquet and conferences etc.

The resort shall adhere to environmental and green building standards of GRIHA/LEED/ Green Globe and star categorization by Ministry of Tourism,

Govt. of India. This self sustainable project will also include development of trunk infrastructure like Desalination Plant, Rain Water Treatment Plant, Solar Power Plant, DG Set, STP, etc. by the concessionaire.

As per the terms of the concession agreement, the concessionaire shall operate the project for 50 years including 3 years construction. Further, he has to ensure 30% of the total personnel employed are local residents during the first year of

357.6 MT of waste plastic transported to mainland for recycling

Administration appeals general public to carry own shopping bags & avoid using plastic bags to preserve Isles' pristine beauty

Port Blair, Dec. 5

The Andaman and Nicobar Administration has taken a number of initiatives to address the problem of plastic waste in these Islands. The Administration has issued notification banning manufacture, storage, use and import of single use plastic items dated 05.09.2019. 3 CR cases were filed before the Hon'ble Judicial Magistrate First Class (Ist Court) at Port Blair against establishments for non-compliance on

ban of Single Use Plastic items in 2019, all the three cases have been disposed with penalty of Rs. 50,000 each and were kept in custody till the rise of court. Total Rs 1,50,000 has been levied as fine. During road construction works by APWD, PBMC, RD&P and other agencies mandatorily utilize 8-10% waste plastic in road construction.

A total of 84.95 MT of shredded plastic waste has been utilized in construction of roads amounting to 78 lane-

kms. Further, Extended Producers Responsibility (EPR) provisions are being strictly enforced by way of making it mandatory for all companies supplying plastic packaged goods for 100% take back of waste plastic from these Islands. A&N Administration has launched Andaman & Nicobar Islands Extended Producers Responsibility (ANEPR) portal with an objective that the PIBOs and other stakeholders can themselves submit

the data related to Extended Producers Responsibility and plastic waste for compliance of Rule 13(2) of Plastic Waste Management Rules (PWMR) 2016.

Approximately, 971.6 MT of plastic packaged goods have been imported into these Islands during the period October, 2019 to September, 2021, out of which, 357.6 MT of waste plastic has been collected & transported to mainland for recycling.

Farmers' Corner- A Knowledge Hub

Rain water harvesting through lined pond

In Andaman and Nicobar islands, during post monsoon period, there is growing scarcity of water for meeting even domestic demand and livestock use resulting in very less importance given to agricultural use. Hence, the only option available is rainwater harvesting, storage and its efficient use in agriculture and other sectors. In the islands, normally rain water harvesting is done through farm ponds which dry up during summer months due to water loss from evaporation and seepage. However, efficient water storage in small ponds is possible in the island through lining with suitable material. Plastics can be used very effectively in lining the ponds. The lined tanks have been found as one of the best option for water storage at cheaper cost. Generally mechanical excavator is used for making pond in high rainfall and sandy coastal areas. The pond of any size can be made based on available space and budget. However, small size (6 x 5 m) pond is always better for the islands. The steps involved in construction of lined pond are,

- * Site selection, cleaning, levelling and demarcate pond area (6 x 5 m)
- * Dig the soil upto 1.5 m depth using mechanical excavator and make boundary around the pond
- * Give 1:1 or 1:0.5 slope depending on the soil type and to prevent collapse of side wall
- * Remove any stones or other projections from the bed and sides of the pond followed by compaction and consolidation
- * A layer of fine soil (1-2 inch) should be spread over the bottom of the pond to avoid any damage to the film.
- * Place LDPE film of size 10 x 10mat bottom and side slopes of the pond followed by anchoring

From this small lined pond, about 40 m³ (1m³=1000 lit) of rain water could be harvested and stored at the end of rainy season, which is sufficient to irrigate vegetable crops in 0.20 ha. The approximate cost of making lined pond is Rs. 50,000. The short duration vegetables like okra, cowpea, gourds, palak and amaranthus etc can be easily cultivated and an average yield of 1000-1500 kg/0.2 ha can be achieved. Benefits: Rainwater harvesting through lined pond is one of the best options for efficient water storage without seepage loss and promoting vegetable cultivation for household use. Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh today said that marine minerals from coastal and ocean sources will be key to India's future economy. In addition, he said, metals like nickel and cobalt play an important role in promoting renewable

energy technologies needed to fight the climate change challenges. Inaugurating the new building facilities at CSIR-IMMT (Institute of Minerals & Materials Technology) at Bhubaneswar, Dr Jitendra Singh told the scientists and students that IMMT is a R&D Lab of national importance in minerals and materials technology under the aegis of CSIR to address the problems of industry for their sustainable development.

while Axer Patel remained not out on 41. Earlier, New Zealand were bowled out for 62 runs in their first innings in reply to India's 325.

Indian team registers 13-0 win over Thailand in Women's Hockey Asian Champions Trophy

Donghae, Dec. 5

In Hockey, drag-flicker Gurjit Kaur scored five goals as the Indian team registered an emphatic 13-0 win over Thailand in their first game in Women's Asian Champions Trophy 2021 at the Donghae, South Korea. Gurjit gave India the lead in the second minute of the match after an infringement from Thailand in their defensive third awarded India a fourth-place finish at

penalty stroke. Gurjit, who scored four goals at the Tokyo Olympics 2020, kept a cool head and put the ball in the back of the nets to give India a 1-0 lead in the second minute. Gurjit Kaur, who made her International debut today, scored a field goal in the 16th minute. This was India Women's team's first match since the historic fourth-place finish at

the Tokyo Olympics. In the absence of Captain Rani, who has been rested from the tournament, the Indian team was led by veteran goalkeeper Savita. The next match between India and Malaysia scheduled for tomorrow will not be played due to covid-related issues, as officially stated by the Asian Hockey Federation. India will play the 8th of this month.

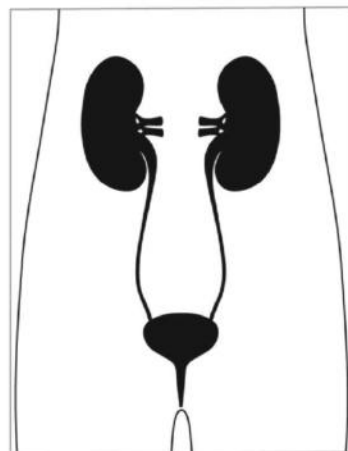

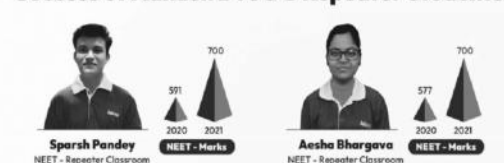
