Strengthening storage capacity of food grains in different Islands

Deptt. of Civil Supplies establishes 250 MT of storage godown at Katchal ensuring availability of 3 months buffer stock

Port Blair, Feb. 5

The Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs Department is instrumental in timely distribution of food grains to different Islands keeping into account the inclement weather condition coupled with natural calamity prone areas situated at far flung locations. To achieve this task, the Department has created warehouses/godowns in different areas including remote Islands so that the PDS beneficiaries receive their



monthly quota of food grains without fail from more than 450 Fair Price Shops spread over the length & breadth of these Islands. In order to have a better buffer stock of food grains in Southern Group of Islands, the Department has created a 250 MT of storage godown at Katchal in Nicobar Group of Islands. Constructed by the Andaman Public Works Department, this godown will cater to the need of food grain storage for tribal as well as general public. The newly constructed godown has the capacity to accommodate 3 months buffer stock of food grains by the Department to ensure adequate availability

of food grains for PDS beneficiaries throughout the year.

To have a better stock and hassle free distribution of food grains, the Department is maintaining 12 Principal Distribution Centres (PDC) one each at Campbell Bay, Kamorta, Katchal, Teressa, Chowra and Car Nicobar in Nicobar District while three PDC one each are operational in Little Andaman, Swaraj Dweep and Shaheed Dweep in South Andaman District and another three are operational in Diglipur, Mayabunder and Rangat in North & Middle Andaman District.

Atal Pension Yojana: A boon for unorganized sector

1991 persons enrolled under the pension scheme in A&N Islands so far

Port Blair, Feb. 5

The Atal Pension Yojana (APY) is a pension scheme for the workers in the unorganized sector. As per the scheme, people can make contributions in their Atal Pension Yojana account till the age of 60 years and get a monthly pension. The APY focuses on all citizens in the unorganized sector, who join the National Pension System (NPS) administered by the Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA). As per the data provided by the Lead Bank, Port Blair, altogether, 1991 persons have been enrolled



per month, Rs. 4000 per month, Rs. 5000 per month, at the age of 60 years, depending on their contributions, which itself would be based on the age of joining the APY. The minimum age of joining APY is 18 years and maximum age is 40 years. The age of exit and start of pension would be 60 years. Therefore, minimum period of contribution by any subscriber under APY would be 20 years or more. The benefit of fixed minimum pension would be guaranteed by the Government.

Food Safety Deptt. Officials conduct inspection of FBOs at Shaheed Dweep

The Officials of Food Safety Department conducted surprise inspection of food business premises located at Shaheed Dweep. They inspected 26 restaurants, 20 mobile food vendors, 25 fruit & vegetable vendors, 8 sweet stalls, 10 grocery shops, 1 bake house and 1 Milk Chilling Centre. Major and minor violations were noticed at 3 premises and

accordingly, cases have been registered against Food Business Operators (FBOs) and others were served with improvement notices with directions to rectify the defects within a fortnight.

Now, Manga is the sole bread earner at home supporting five members which includes her bedridden husband and her widowed daughter-in-law with two young kids. Her only source of meager income is from the petty masala vending, which too came to a halt with the surge of the pandemic. She recalls with tears in her eyes that life had come to a standstill and she went through fear, anxiety, and depression with worry as to how she could feed her family. The family was faced with a question of survival.

Her fears turned real when all her savings got exhausted and her family had to struggle very hard for one meal a day. It is then that she came to know about the PM SVANidhi scheme from the PBMC Office and applied for the micro credit loan facility of Rs. 10000/- with the assistance of the staff at facilitation counter. The loan facility came as a big relief and saviour for her as she could feed her family and get stocks for restarting her business. RBI projects GDP at 10.5% in 2021-22; keeps repo-rate unchanged at 4%

New Delhi, Feb. 5

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) today said that the monetary policy review has decided to continue with an accommodative stance of monetary policy to maintain status quo on key policy rates. This will continue as long as necessary at least through the current financial year and into next year to revive growth and mitigate the impact of Covid-19. The repo rate is kept unchanged at 4 percent and the reverse repo rate at 3.35 percent. While announcing the policy review, the RBI Governor, Shri Shaktikant Das said that the GDP growth is projected at 10.5 percent in the Financial Year 2021-22. He said projection of CPI inflation has been revised to 5.2 percent for the fourth quarter of the current financial year.  - ♦ Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs)/ Producers Cooperatives: FPOs and Producer Cooperatives would be provided the following support:

Chennai Test: England 263 for 3 at stumps on Day 1

Chennai, Feb. 5

England were 263 for three in their first innings at stumps on the opening day of the first Test match against India at M. A. Chidambaram Stadium in Chennai today. England Skipper Joe Root scored a classy century in his 100th Test. He was batting at 128 when stumps were drawn. Root also guided young opener Dom Sibley who scored 87. For the hosts, Jasprit Bumrah claimed two wickets while Ravichandran Ashwin bagged one. Earlier, England Skipper won the toss and chose to bat first. This game marks the return of international cricket in India after a year-long COVID-19 break. India played last test match before pandemic against Bangladesh on 22nd November 2019 at Eden Gardens, Kolkata.

accounts, leading to reduction in contribution collection charges. The subscribers should keep the required balance in their savings bank accounts on the stipulated due dates to avoid any late payment penalty. Due dates for monthly contribution payment is arrived based on the deposit of first contribution amount. In case of repeated defaults for specified period, the account is liable for foreclosure and the Govt co-contributions, if any shall be forfeited. Also any false declaration about his/her eligibility for benefits under this scheme for whatsoever reason, the entire Govt. contribution shall be forfeited along with the penal interest. For enrolment, Aadhaar would be the primary KYC document for identification of beneficiaries, spouse and nominees to avoid pension rights and entitlement related disputes in the long-term.

The programme started with the inaugural speech by Shri. Joju P. Alappatt, Director (Sc. & Tech.) who briefed the students on wetlands and their importance. A bird watching programme was also organized in the nearby wetland areas where research scholars from Zoological Survey of India, Port Blair guided the students in the identification of wetland birds. Wetland birds like common moor hen, purple moor hen, cotton teal, lesser whistling duck, etc. were spotted during the bird watching programme.

Further, large flock of endemic wetland bird, Andaman Teal was also spotted. Students were briefed on the common identification techniques for water birds besides giving inputs on the importance of conservation of wetlands birds. Common mangroves species in the area were also identified by the students with the help of resource persons. Altogether, 21 students from GSSS, School Line attended the awareness programme, a press release from Directorate of Science & Technology said.

Smti. Maya Mondal, who was a housewife with no other source of income, with her husband being a private worker with a meager salary decided to step out of the house and do something worthwhile that would shore up her financially support her family.

The situations got worsened after tsunami since her husband was also left jobless. This was when several NGOs approached the rural areas and trained them in many trades in order to make them self sufficient and overcome the hard times after tsunami. Maya also proceeded to learn the skill of manufacturing of handicrafts out of coconut shell. Initially, she started working in groups and manufactured several handicraft items.

Later, she realized that a unit on her own could benefit her in earning a lump amount and approached the KVIB office for financial assistance through PMEGP scheme. She was sanctioned an amount of Rs.1,00,000/- by the UCO Bank, Port Blair on being recommended by the DLTF.  - Consider such complaints and facilitate their disposal in accordance with law.
 - To be responsible for the conduct of business in his office.
 - To maintain confidentiality of any information or document coming into his knowledge or possession in the course of discharging his duties and not disclose such information or document to any person except with the consent of the person furnishing information such information or documents; provided that nothing in this clause shall prevent the Ombudsman from disclosing information or documents furnished by a party in a complaint to the other party or parties to the extent considered by him to be reasonable required to comply with principles of natural justice and fair play in the proceedings.

 - To furnish a report every year containing a general review of activities of the office of the Ombudsman during the preceding financial year to the Chief Secretary and the Secretary, State Nodal Department along with such other information as may be considered necessary by him in the annual report. The Ombudsman, on the basis of grievances handled by him will review the quality of the working of the MGNREGA authorities and make recommendations to improve implementation of MGNREGA.
