New Delhi, Aug 5 (PIB) Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi performed Bhoomi Pujan at 'Shree Ram Janmabhoomi Mandir' at Ayodhya today. Speaking on the occasion, Prime Minister congratulated fellow countrymen and Ram Bhakts all across the world on the holy occasion. Terming it as historic, he said that India is starting a glorious chapter today, when people all across the country are excited and emotional to have finally achieved what they had been waiting for centuries, several of whom are scarcely able to believe that they are witnessing this day in their lifetime. He highlighted that Ram Janmabhoomi has become liberated

from the cycle of breaking down and building up again, and a grand temple for Ramlala will be constructed in place of tents now. Tackling the menace of drugs Ministry sanctions setting up of Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts with outpatient facilities

Port Blair, Aug 5 Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJ&E) conducted the first National Survey on the Extent and Pattern of Substance Use in India during 2018 and report of the survey was released in February, 2019. As per the survey report, the magnitude of substance abuse is higher in A & N Islands than the national average for substances like alcohol, cocaine, inhalants etc.



Accordingly, to tackle this menace, the Directorate of Social Welfare, A & N Administration has prepared an action plan as per the guidelines of National Action Plan for Drug Demand Reduction (NAPDDR) of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India and obtained approval from the Ministry alongwith sanctioning and release of Rs 1,12,50,000/- (Rupees one crore twelve lakh fifty thousand) to carry out various preventive education and awareness generation activities. This includes Rs 64,12,350/- (Rupees Sixty Four

Lakh Twelve Thousand Three Hundred Fifty) for setting up of 15 bedded Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA) with outpatient facilities in all the three districts of A & N Islands, under the administrative control of the Deputy Commissioner; IRCA constitutes one of the important components of NAPDDR. The Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA) would provide composite/integrated services for the rehabilitation of substance-dependent persons. It envisages total recovery of the addicted person leading to his socio-economic rehabilitation through an appropriate combination of individual counseling, group therapy, yoga, exposure to self-help/support groups and introduction to other recovering addicts and would include support and care to the family of the addicted person. IRCA also aims to enable the substance-dependent persons to achieve total abstinence and improve their quality of life. The Deputy Commissioners have initiated suitable steps such as set apart of land for construction of IRCA/allotment of vacant quarter/ opening of dedicated account. The IRCA will be operationalised soon after recruitment of staff in the respective Districts. Further, the Directorate of Social Welfare will

undertake activities such as awareness generation through social, print and digital media to spread social message against alcohol and substance abuse, Information Education and Communication (IEC) campaign, besides procurement of sports kits for distribution etc., a press release from the Directorate of Social Welfare said.

Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana Priority House Hold & Antyodaya Anna Yojana ration card holders advised to draw food grains for three months

Port Blair, Aug 5 All Priority House hold (PHH) and Antyodaya Anna Yojana (AAJ) ration card holders covered under the National Food Security Act shall be provided 5 kgs of rice per person and 1 kg chana whole per ration card per month for three months in Nicobar District. In South Andaman, Middle & North Andaman Districts, all such

families shall be provided with 4 kgs of rice and 1 kg of wheat per person and 1 kg chana whole per ration card holder per month for three months. The above quantity will be provided in the month of August, 2020 against the allocation of July, August and September, 2020 from their respective Fair Price Shop under Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) on free of cost. All such ration card holders have been informed to draw the food grains and chana whole as per their entitlement for three months in the month of August, 2020 itself, in addition to their regular PDS foodgrains. This will continue upto November, 2020, a press release from the Directorate of (CS&CA) said.

PBMC carries out sanitization in City People advised to follow COVID-19 safety guidelines

Port Blair, Aug 5 Continuing its effort in the city to prevent the spread of COVID-19, Port Blair Municipal Council (PBMC) has carried out sanitization in vulnerable areas of the city including all quarantine home/institutions/ market places today. The Revenue and Sanitary Officials of PBMC, spread across various parts of the city, imposed fine on violators for not wearing mask, not maintaining social distancing and littering in public places. Meanwhile, PBMC appeals to the general public to desist from all

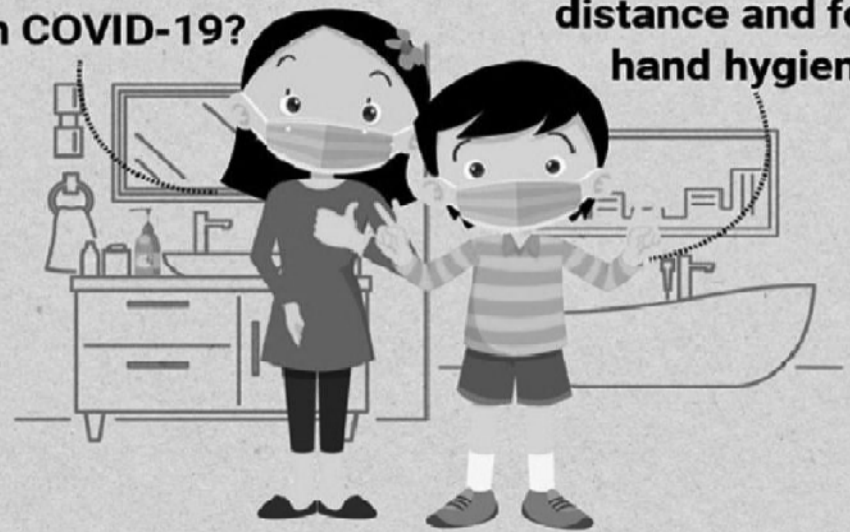

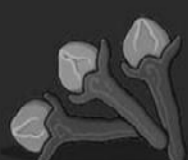

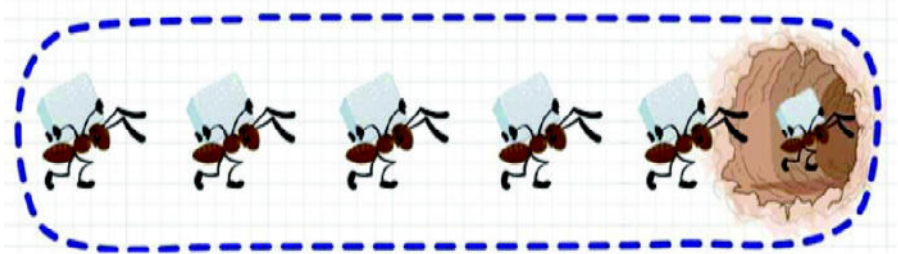

and similar dignity and restraint is visible today also.

Prime Minister recalled how people from all walks of life including the poor, backwards, dalits, tribals had been instrumental in several feats such as victory of Shree Ram, Shree Krishna lifting Govardhan, Chatrapati Shivaji establishing Swaraj, Gandhiji leading independence movement etc. Similarly, the construction of Ram Mandir has started with the help and contribution of common citizens, he said.

Recounting the character traits of Shree Ram, Prime Minister remarked that he always stuck to the truth, and established social harmony as the cornerstone of his rule. He loved his subjects equally, but had a special kindness for the poor and the needy. There is no aspect of life where Shree Ram doesn't serve as an inspiration, and his impact is visible in several aspects of culture, philosophy, faith and tradition of the country.

Prime Minister said that Shree Ram has acted as a guiding light for people, through Valmiki Ramayan in ancient times, through Tulsidas, Kabir and Guru Nanak in medieval times and was also present in the bhajans of Mahatma Gandhi as the power source of ahimsa and satyagrah. Lord Buddha is also associated with Shree Ram, and the city of Ayodhya has been a center of faith of Jains since centuries, he said. Recounting the different Ramayans written in various languages, Prime Minister noted that Shree Ram is the common thread of unity in diversity in the country.

Prime Minister noted that Shree Ram is revered in several countries. He listed out the Ramayans popular in countries such as Indonesia, the country with the maximum Muslim population, Cambodia, Laos, Malaysia, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Nepal, and said that references to Shree Ram are also found in Iran and China and Ram Kathas are popular in several countries. He said that people in all these countries must be feeling glad today, with the start of construction of Ram Mandir.

Prime Minister expressed hope that the temple will serve as an inspiration for the entire humanity for eras to come. He noted that it is important that the message of Shree Ram, Ram Mandir and of our age old tradition reaches out to the entire world. Keeping this in mind, Ram Circuit is being made in the country.

Prime Minister recounted the contours of Ram Rajya dreamt by Mahatma Gandhi. Sports Minister chairs 1st General Council meeting of Khelo India Scheme Urges States to organise State-level Khelo India Games annually to identify grassroot-level talents

New Delhi, Aug 5

Sports Minister, Shri Kiren Rijju yesterday chaired the 1st General Council meeting of the Khelo India Scheme. Speaking at the meeting, Shri Rijju urged the states to organise State-level Khelo India Games annually with an effort to identify a larger number of grassroot-level talents. He said, the annual competitions being organized at the national level under the Khelo India Scheme, like the Khelo India Youth Games and University Games, have helped to identify sporting talent from all States. The Minister said, States that already conduct annual sporting competit-



ions can align with the Khelo India Scheme and the Centre will support them in conducting these events. He said, to make India a sporting superpower, we need to identify talent as young as 5 to 10 years old and groom them to be future champions. It takes at least eight years to groom an athlete for the Olympics. Shri Rijju has asked the States to organise competitions at the District, Block and Panchayat-level to identify young talent. The Sports Minister spoke of the 5 Aonal Talent Scouting Committees that are being planned for East, West, North, South and North East India.
