## PM Modi, Bangladesh PM hold bilateral talks; jointly inaugurate 3 projects; sign 7 agreements

New Delhi, Oct 5

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and his Bangladesh counterpart, Ms Sheikh Hasina today jointly inaugurated three bilateral projects through video conferencing including one on import of bulk LPG from Bangladesh. The other projects are the Vivekananda Bhavan at Ramakrishna Mission in Dhaka and the Bangladesh-India Professional Skill Development Institute, a facility to benefit small and medium enterprises at the Institute of Diploma Engineers.

Besides, India and



Bangladesh signed seven agreements in New Delhi this afternoon in several areas including education. The MoUs were

exchanged following bilateral talks between Prime Minister Shri Modi and Ms Hasina at Hyderabad House in New

Delhi.

In his statement, Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi said the projects inaugurated today - in LPG import, vocational training, and social facility - have the common goal of improving the conditions of the common people. He said the foundation of India-

Bangladesh ties is the welfare of the common man. Shri Modi said the Vivekananda Bhavan at Ramakrishna Mission will house more than 100 university students. He expressed happiness that bilateral ties will get a boost after today's productive discussions.

In her statement, the Bangladesh Prime Minister thanked the Indian government for the financial assistance provided for Vivekananda Bhavan and Bangladesh-India Professional Skill Development Institute. She hoped that many more projects can be inaugurated in future through joint cooperation. Ms Hasina said over the last two decades, engagements and cooperation in several

## Centre approves Rs. 400 crore for Bihar & Rs. 1200 crores for Karnataka for flood relief operations

New Delhi, Oct. 5

Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah has reviewed the ongoing rescue and relief work of all the flood-affected States.

Keeping in view the severity of flood situation and the fund positions in the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) account of Bihar and Karnataka, the Home Minister has approved advance release of 400 crore rupees to Bihar and 1200 crore rupees to Karnataka from National Disaster Response Fund. He has further approved the advance release of 2nd instalment of centre's share of SDRF amounting to over 213 crore rupees to Bihar for the year 2019-20.

During the South West Monsoon, 2019, 13 States have been affected by unprecedented floods/ landslides. In pursuance of a significant decision taken by the Union Home Minister in the High-Level Committee meeting held on 19th August 2019, even

before receipt of Memorandum from the concerned State Government for seeking additional financial assistance from NDRF, Ministry of Home Affairs constituted Inter-Ministerial Central Teams for 13 States.

## Anthropological Museum open on 362 days; attracts lakhs of visitors year-round

Port Blair, Oct. 5

The Zonal Anthropological Museum under Anthropological Survey of India, Port Blair, under the Ministry of Culture, GoI, is functioning 362 days in a year. Located at the prime location of Port Blair, this Museum attracts lakhs of visitors year-round. As per the order from Andaman & Nicobar Administration, the Zonal Anthropological Museum is open for the visitors/Public 362 days (except on 26th Jan., 15th Aug. and 2nd Oct.).

The galleries of Zonal Anthropological Museum depicting the Bio-cultural Evolution of Man, is designed to provide information about 'Man' as a physical being and his evolutionary journey from pre-historic times to contemporary society. Remaining galleries grouped as Tribes of Andaman Islands, Tribal Habitats and their material culture depict rich and diversified cultural patterns and displaying varying facets of tribal culture and other rural communities of this archipelago. The exhibitions are thematically arranged with models, graphics, dioramas, showcases, panels and valuable ethnographic objects collected from different Islands of Andaman and Nicobar. The old visual documentaries of Anthropological Survey of India have also been set up to provide information about our research inputs to the masses like students, scholars and academicians.

The tickets for Indian adults cost Rs.20/-, children Rs. 10/- and for students it is Rs. 10/-, Defence Personnel in Uniform (entry free), Differently abled Person (entry free) and for foreigners Rs. 150/-, a communication received here said.

### Income generation through Apiculture

Raw honey has been used as a folk remedy throughout history and has a variety of benefits and medicinal uses. Meet the honey man from RK Pur, Little Andaman,

"From every full/complete colony about 10 kgs of honey can be harvested and more farmers must be encouraged to take up honey cultivation", he said.

Trained in beekeeping by the Dept. of Agriculture, A&N Administration through its various training programmes, Shri Gain said he is grateful to the Dept. for encouraging farmers to take up apiculture as a source of income generation.
