importance of vaccination which provides immunity against the virus and help in saving lives.
 In A&N Islands, about 1,01,603 beneficiaries in the target age group of 45+ are to be vaccinated and with the concerted efforts of the Administration and the support of the people of the Islands, we have been able to cover a total of 97,800 beneficiaries constituting 96.26% of the population, so far. The remaining targeted beneficiaries have to be vaccinated as early as possible. Only then, we can be sure that the targeted beneficiaries are shielded with the required immunity to resist the impact of the virus. While the Administration is putting all out efforts to safeguard

Islanders, we must also do our part by working in tandem with the Administration by coming forward and getting ourselves vaccinated. The constant appeal being made by Administration to the left over beneficiaries needs to be paid heed to, as the safety of individual is in his own hands. Those having vaccine hesitancy should not be scared as necessary arrangements have been put in place to deal with any outcome after vaccination. Inter-Island bound passengers accounts for 57.08 % in total positive cases detected

'The less we move, the more we can contain the virus'

Port Blair, May 6

The fight against COVID-19 is like fighting a war with a dangerous invisible enemy. Apart from other preventive measures, restricting our movement is an effective strategy to control the transmission of the virus. Since COVID-19 virus transmits from person to person, it can be established that the less we move, the more we can contain the virus.

A comparative study of the health data ranging from March 1, 2021 to May 6, 2021 reveals that during second wave, the total positive cases so far detected in A&N Islands stands at 1235. It also discloses that the number of positive cases detected from inter-islands bound passengers outnumbers the mainland island bound passengers. Out of the total 1235 positive cases, 705 cases are that of inter-island passengers including 6 travelers coming from N&M Andaman to South Andaman and were tested positive during this period. It indicates that the inter island bound passengers constitutes 57.08% of the total positive cases detected.

Unnecessary movement of people from island to island during such crucial time can give rise to more transmission of the virus in areas which has so far been untouched by the virus. People must restrain from unnecessary travel, a press release from A&N Administration said.

Dealing with second wave of COVID pandemic Administration's move to conduct retest on incoming flight passengers through RAT at entry point yields result 206 positive cases detected so far; step proves beneficial in breaking the chain of transmission

Port Blair, May 6
 To minimize the intensity of the second wave of corona virus in A&N Islands, the A&N Administration has made elaborate arrangements to deal with the challenges arising out of the pandemic. Since the onset of the second wave, proactive decisions were taken keeping in mind the safety of the people of the Islands. The Administration ensured that necessary arrangements right from conducting mandatory Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) on

incoming passengers to availability of sufficient beds for COVID positive patients along with the required equipments for treating such patients were made on war footing. The decision to conduct mandatory RAT from

April 16, 2021 on incoming passengers has proved fruitful and this has enabled detection of positive cases at the entry point itself, which otherwise would have proved fatal for many through contacts. So far, 206

passengers were detected positive during RAT conducted at airport. Health data denotes that for clinical management of cases, 6376 isolation beds have been arranged in all the three Districts.

Accordingly, in South Andaman, 5583 isolation beds are available while in N&M Andaman 286 beds and in Nicobar District, 507 beds are available. Out of the 6376 beds, 225 are presently occupied.

COVID vaccination drive for 45 + 1,12,931 doses of COVISHIELD vaccine administered so far in A&N Islands

Port Blair, May 6

The vaccination drive is continuing in A&N Islands in an effective manner and health teams designated in various vaccination centres spread across the Islands are vaccinating all the beneficiaries above 45, who visit the centres spread over the A&N Islands on a daily basis. The vaccination sessions are continuing in more than 88 designated vaccination centres set up in different parts of the Islands towards the fight against Corona virus. 1112 doses of COVISHIELD vaccines were administered to the eligible



beneficiaries by the health teams today (May 6), taking the total number of doses of vaccines administered so far to 1,12,931.

The district wise figure administering of COVISHIELD doses to the eligible beneficiaries on May 6 by the Health Department states that in South Andaman, 442 persons above 45 were administered the vaccine while in North & Middle Andaman District, 111 persons and in Nicobar District, 559 were vaccinated, a press release from DHS said.

He said that the employees working in shops and other establishments can lodge their grievances pertaining to non-



payment of wages, deduction of wages and irregular payment by the employer. The Secretary further disclosed that to provide relief to such employees, a Control Room with no. 03192-233138 is functioning in Labour Commissioner Office from 8.30 am to 7 pm during which the employees

can report the grievances detailing the name and address of the employer. As soon as the grievance is received, the Inspectors of the Labour Department will take up the matter with the concerned shop owner/establishments and find a solution to the issues raised, the Secretary added.

India records highest-ever single-day spike with 4,12,262 fresh COVID-19 cases, 3,980 deaths

New Delhi, May 6
 India on Thursday reported 4,12,262 new COVID-19 cases in the last 24 hours, the highest single-day spike in COVID-19 cases since the pandemic began. With this, the cumulative count of COVID-19 cases in the country has gone up to 2,10,77,410, informed the Union Health Ministry on Thursday. As many as 3,980 patients succumbed to the infection during the last 24 hours, taking the total COVID-related death toll to 2,30,168.

 conducted on these passengers, 5 were found positive. The number of passengers from mainland and the COVID positivity rate is also coming down as far as the testing of flight passengers are concerned, he added. About vaccination drive, the Secretary informed that it is continuing and till 4 pm today (May 6) about 700 eligible beneficiaries above 45 were vaccinated. He once again requested the eligible persons above 45 to come forward to get vaccinated at the earliest and help the Administration to restrict the spread of corona virus. Stating that the 3rd wave of Corona virus is anticipated in the country, he said, we are also preparing to tackle that too, adding that the best way to deal with the 3rd wave is to get oneself vaccinated. Vaccination is an important tool in our hand which can save us from the menace of the virus. The Director, ANIIMS, Dr. AK Mandal was also present on the occasion. The Deputy Director, G. B. Pant Hospital, Shri Amitabha De said the number of corona positive patients in the G. B Pant Hospital has come down from 96 to 73 at present. Out of the 73 patients, 50 are on Oxygen support including 26 in ICU. The Director, (IP&T), Shri Alok Kumar, Deputy Director, IP, Shri R.S. Meena also attended the press conference.

Mandatory online certification of disability through UDID portal from June 1

New Delhi, May 6 (PIB) mode. The Central ensure compliance of this notification. The Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPWD), Government of India has issued Gazette notification SO 1736(E) dated 05.05.2021 and making it mandatory for all States/UTs to grant certificate of disability through online mode only using UDID portal w.e.f. 01.06.2021. The Central Government notified the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 under RPwD Act, 2016 on 15.06.2017. Rule 18(5) mandates the Central Government to appoint a date making it mandatory for the State/UT authorities to issue certificate of disability through online mode. The UDID project is under implementation since 2016. Concerned authorities of all States/UTs have been imparted training by DEPWD for working on the UDID portal (www.swavlambancard.gov.in). The States/UTs have been given adequate time to convert to online mode. It will ensure complete digitization of certification of disability from 01.06.2021, besides providing a viable mechanism for cross-checking genuineness of the certificate to achieve pan-India validity, and simplifying the process for the benefit of Divyangjan.

 The data further reveals that the rate of testing per million in A&N Islands has been recorded at 938693 while the positivity rate is 1.67 % as on date. While the positivity rate may be lower as compared to other states and UT, we cannot be complacent and let our guards down. To stop the transmission rate, stringent measures such as notifying of containment zones in areas where cases are high have been helpful in stopping further infection. Presently, 12 Containment Zones have been formed in South Andaman District. To ensure that those in Containment Zones do not violate the containment measures, the District Administration has deputed officers to monitor the activities. Vaccination drives are being carried out across the Islands and till date 1,12,931 beneficiaries have been vaccinated. With all the measures put in place for the safety of the Islanders, it is equally important for every individual to heed to the instructions issued by the Administration from time to time such as following COVID Appropriate Behaviour and getting themselves vaccinated.

Draft Notification of A&N Islands (Rural Area) Water Supply (Bye-Laws) 2021 (Contd. from page 3 of DT issue dated May, 06, 2021)

ii) For any commercial use the charges will be levied on per Tonne basis i.e Rs.150/Tonne

iii) The consumers shall be charged double the normal rates described above, for installation of tube well without approval of the Gram Panchayat for the period from the date of installation of the tube well till the approval is obtained in this behalf.

(iv) The word size of the bore should be read as size of the lowering assembly of the tube well. Any tube well installed by the Department of Rural Development or Water Supply Department/Agency will not be charged any water tariff. However, the tube wells installed by the private persons, individuals or any other departments for any purpose i.e. drinking, irrigation or commercial shall be charged as per rates already specified therein.

37. Change of Water Tariff from Commercial to Domestic:

For change of water tariff from commercial to domestic, an affidavit shall be submitted by the consumer stating that the commercial activity was previously carried out but subsequently stands discontinued henceforth. The tariff shall be changed by the authorized officer of Water Supply Department/Agency based on an application along with affidavit to this effect.

38. Illegal use of Pumps and Motors:

No direct on line water boosting arrangement shall be installed by the consumer. In case, it is found to be installed on the direct water supply system within the premises, the following action shall be taken against the consumer:-

- Confiscation of pump/motor and fine of Rs. 500.00 for first offence.
- Confiscation of pump/motor and fine of Rs. 1000.00 for second offence.
- Disconnection of Domestic/Commercial water connection.
- Confiscated pump will be released to consumer only after paying of fine.

39. Illegal Restoration of already disconnected Water Supply:

To streamline the levy of water charges in cases where disconnected supply is restored without proper authority, the consumers shall be charged water charges for the consumption at the penal rates of double the applicable rates of the tariff structure along with defaulting amount. Additional Charges of Rs.500/- will also be charged for disconnection of water supply from the ferrule for each such attempt.

40. Disputes Settlement & Redressal Committees:

i) Any question, dispute or difference, whatsoever arising in respect of water connections obtained by the consumers from the Water Supply Department/Agency under these Bye-laws regarding water tariff, charges, penalties etc. imposed by the competent authority in accordance with or on account of violation of the said bye-laws shall be referred to the following Dispute Redressal Committees(DRC) constituted to settle the disputes.

This committee shall act as an Appellate Authority for the disputes beyond Rs.1,00,000/-

iii) Procedure For Making An Application

In case, the consumer is not satisfied with the billed amount, he/ she will have to make a written request to the Member Secretary of the concerned Committee alongwith 50% of the billed amount in the shape of the Demand Draft payable to Water supply department/agency. The Member Secretary shall arrange a meeting of the Dispute Redressal Committee once in a month and place all such requests before the Committee for decision.

In case, the consumer is not satisfied with the decision of concerned Dispute Redressal Committee (Reviewing Authority), he can make an appeal to the Appellate Authority in writing within 15 days from the decision of Reviewing Authority.

In all these Dispute Redressal Committees, the Consumer and/or his authorized representative shall be given full opportunity to put his / her case before the concerned Dispute Redressal Committee. Normally, these committees shall try to arrive at a consensus decision. In case of difference of opinion amongst the Chairman / Members thereof, the case will be decided with a majority opinion present. The Dispute Redressal Committee shall pass speaking Orders/Decisions and

specify clearly, if any relaxation of rules is involved in the case. The Committee Members, if required, can also inspect / visit the premises to access the factual position. Each Dispute Redressal Committee shall decide the cases by holding maximum two meetings for any disputed case and in case the consumer or his/her authorized representative fails to turn up in the meeting, the decision of the Review/Appellate Authority shall be considered as final. Atleast one meeting will be convened in a period of one month by each committee to decide the case.

Decision of the Appellate Authority will be final and binding and no further appeal shall be entertained. These Committees shall review and decide all the cases including waiving off irrecoverable amounts. Further these Committees shall consider/review all the disputed cases of the consumers, who have been sanctioned water supply connection.

Meter connections including cases relating to excessive charging of water bills due to following reasons:

- Premises remained locked after construction but water bills kept on increasing every month.
- Premises initially occupied but thereafter remained locked for considerable period.
- Excessive water bill on account of high average consumption due to any technical defect in water meter including recording of wrong water meter reading.
- Excessive water charges bill due to leakage within the premises of the consumer.
- Water connection got sanctioned but physically no water connection was installed at site and the construction was not commenced or only a part of the building constructed but remained incomplete.
- Excessive water bill due to levy of commercial charges where the commercial activity was not carried out at all or was carried out for a limited period.
- To settle disputed bills, where the Water Supply Department/Agency disconnected the water supply but the same was reconnected by the consumer without the permission of Water Supply Department/informing the Water Supply Department/ Agency.
- Building was not fully occupied, only a Chowkidar/ Watchman residing for watch and ward.

All the pending cases lying for consideration/ review shall be forwarded to the concerned committees by the respective Member secretary of the area under their jurisdiction within a month from the issue of this Notification. However, the cases already decided prior to the formation of these committees shall not be reopened.

41. Every connection must have float valve at the end point of discharge mouth for control on over flow/wastage of water, it is mandatory or else the connection will be disconnected. Water Supply Department/Agency limits its responsibility of providing water at reasonable pressure upto a height of 1.0 m from the ground level of the building. Consumers are required to construct Storage Tanks / Sump Tanks within the height limit mentioned above for collecting water through the communication pipe.

42. No person shall construct any Latrine or Cesspool within Five meters of any well, tank, water pipe or in any position where such well, tank or pipe is likely to be injured or water therein polluted.

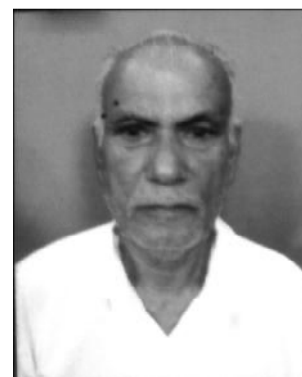

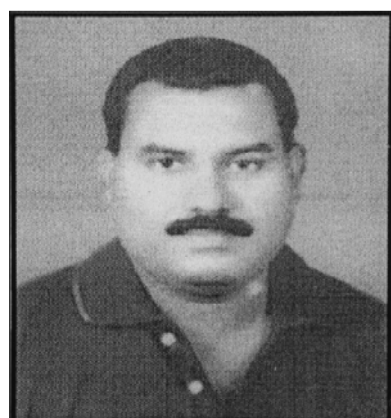

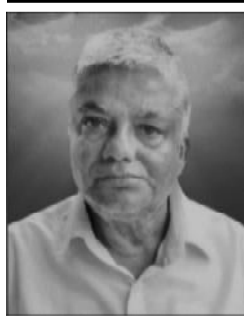
