PM addresses nation & announces extension of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana till November

5 kg free wheat/rice to be provided to each member of a family along with 1 kg free whole chana per family per month

New Delhi, June 30 (PIB) Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi today addressed the nation and announced the extension of Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana till the end of November. Prime Minister emphasized that provision of food to those in need during lockdown has been the foremost priority of the country. As soon as lockdown was announced, the Government brought about PM Garib Kalyan Yojana, under which a package of Rs 1.75 lakh crore for the poor was announced.



9 crore farmers and Rs 50,000 crore is being spent on PM Garib Kalyan Rojgar Abhiyaan, which has been started to provide employment opportunities. Prime Minister observed that the enormity of the decision to provide free ration for three months to more than 80 crore people i.e. providing 5 kg free rice/wheat to each member of the family, along with providing 1 kg pulses to each family, per month, has made the entire world take notice. The number of people who were provided free ration is several times the population of many large countries, he said.

New guidelines for Unlock 2.0 to come into effect from today

Chief Secretary orders implementation of guidelines for Phased Re-opening (Unlock-2) & National Directives for COVID-19 Management for public & work places issued by MHA in whole of A&N Islands

- Schools, Colleges, Coaching institutions, Cinema Halls and Gyms to remain closed
- Night curfew timings shall be in force from 10 PM to 5 AM

Port Blair, June 30

In exercise of the powers conferred under section 24(I) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the Chief Secretary, Andaman & Nicobar Administration, Shri Chetan B. Sanghi in his capacity as Chairperson, Union Territory Disaster Management Executive Committee, for the Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands has ordered that the Guidelines for Phased Re-opening (Unlock-2) and National Directives for COVID-19 Management, for public and work places, issued by MHA dated 29.06.2020 shall be applicable to the whole of A&N Islands.

In exercise of the powers under section 6(2) (i) of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) had directed the Union Home Secretary

to issue an order to reopen more activities in a calibrated manner, in areas outside the containment zones and to extend the lockdown in containment zones upto 31.07.2020. Accordingly, the Union Home Secretary directed vide order dated 29.06.2020 that the guidelines on Unlock -2, will be in force upto 31.07.2020.

Vide the above order of Chief Secretary, Andaman and Nicobar Administration, these guidelines have been made applicable to the whole of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. These guidelines will remain in force upto 31.07.2020.

Under the new guidelines of Unlock -2, operation of Cinema halls, gymnasiums, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places will not be allowed. Similarly, social,

political, sports, entertainment, academic, cultural and religious functions and other large congregations will not be permitted. The Ministry said, dates for opening of these will be decided separately, based on the assessment of the situation. Schools, colleges and coaching institutions will remain closed till 31st of July. Online distance learning should continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged.

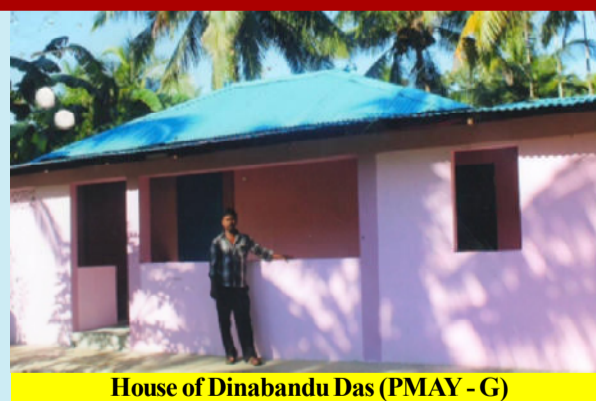
As per the guidelines, night curfew timings are being further relaxed and curfew shall be in force from 10 PM to 5 AM. It said, domestic flights and passenger trains have already been allowed in a limited manner and their operations will be further expanded in a calibrated manner. per month. Along with providing 5kg free rice/wheat to each member of a family, 1 kg free whole chana will also be provided to each family per month.

The Government will spend more than Rs 90,000 crore towards the extension of the scheme, the Prime Minister said, adding that if the amount spent towards it in the previous three months is added together, a total of almost Rs 1.5 lakh crore would be spent towards the scheme. He credited and thanked the hard-working farmers and honest tax payers for making it possible for the government to procure and distribute free foodgrains. Prime Minister underlined that the country is moving towards the institution of 'one nation, one ration card', which will be of immense benefit to the poor who travel to other states in search of work.

Prime Minister noted that the shift of the fight against coronavirus to Unlock 2 coincides with the weather which results in several ailments. He asked everyone to take care of their health. He observed that due to timely decisions like lockdown, it has been possible to save the lives of lakhs of people and the death rate in the country is amongst the lowest in the world. However, irresponsible and negligent behavior has been on the rise during Unlock 1, he said, adding that earlier people were more careful about usage of mask, washing hands for more than 20 seconds several times during the day and maintaining 'do gaz doori'. He emphasized that when more being more careful is necessary, rise of negligence is a cause of concern.

Prime Minister said that regulations need to be followed with the same seriousness as during Lockdown, especially in the Containment Zones. He exhorted people to spread awareness amongst those not following such rules and regulations, giving example of the Prime Minister of a country being fined Rs 13000 for not wearing mask in a public place. He said that local administration in India will need to act with same alacrity, since no one, including the Prime Minister, is above the rule of law.

Prime Minister said that in the coming times, Government will continue to take further steps to empower the poor and the needy. Economic activities will also be enhanced, with due precautions in place. He reiterated the pledge to work towards Atmanirbhar Bharat and to be vocal for local, while also asking people to be careful, use mask/face cover and continue following the mantra of maintaining 'do gaz doori'.

It has been noted recently that such concerns also pose a threat to sovereignty and security of the country.

The Ministry of Information Technology has received many complaints from various sources including several reports about misuse of some mobile apps available on Android and iOS platforms for stealing and surreptitiously transmitting users' data in an unauthorized manner to servers which have locations outside India. Islands in the FY 2016-17. The Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) had prepared and finalized the 'Auto-Generated List' of beneficiaries from the SECC-2011 data after applying various exclusion and inclusion parameters set by the MoRD. The GP-wise list of the same was made available through the 'AwaasSoft' (MIS of PMAY-G) which were further provided to all the Gram Panchayats to finalize their respective Permanent Wait List (PWL) through Gram Sabhas. Accordingly, the finalized list of 2125 beneficiaries were prepared and uploaded in the 'AwaasSoft' after approval of the Appellate Committee.

Out of the total target, 766, 405 & 302 beneficiaries have been released 1st, 2nd & 3rd instalments respectively, out of which 309 beneficiaries have completed their houses till date. The MoRD has released the first tranche of fund for this financial year amounting Rs. 179.808 lakhs and accordingly, 248 more beneficiaries have been covered this month. All the remaining eligible cases shall be completed by March, 2021. The present status of the PMAY in the UT of A & N Islands is shown in the table below:

The scheme releases the amount in three instalments (1st instalment Rs. 60000/-, 2nd instalment Rs. 40000/- & 3rd Instalment Rs 20000/-) after completion of various geo-tagging levels, directly into the bank account of the beneficiaries' through Public Financial Management System (PFMS) which thereby reduces the paperwork and misuse of the Govt. fund. As mentioned above, the scheme also provides 90 persondays under MGNREGA that provides employment to the masons/labours and helps in boosting the economy. The amount spent in purchasing the materials for the construction of the house also helps in the fractional increase of the GDP, a press release from Rural Development Department said.

Amendments in Indian Stamp Act, 1899 & Rules to come into effect from today

New Delhi, June 30 (PIB) The Amendments in the Indian Stamp Act, 1899 and Rules made thereunder, has brought through Finance Act 2019 and Rules made thereunder will come into effect from tomorrow, i.e. 1st July, 2020 vide notifications dated 30th March, 2020. In order to facilitate ease of doing business and to bring in uniformity of the stamp duty on securities across States and thereby build a pan-India securities market, the Central Government, after due deliberations and consultations with the States, through requisite amendments in the Indian Stamp Act, 1899 and Rules made thereunder, has created the legal and institutional mechanism to enable states to collect stamp duty on securities market instruments at one place by one agency (through Stock Exchange or Clearing Corporation authorized by it or by the Depository) on one instrument. A mechanism for appropriately sharing the stamp duty with relevant State Governments has also been developed which is based on the state of domicile of the buyer.

transported to 6 different locations viz. Gandhi Park, Brookshabad, Anarkali, Junglighat, School line, Dollygunj for its further processing/baling & transportation to mainland through authorized vendors. As on date, 192.22 tons of plastic waste, 124.663 tons of cardboard & 67.69 tons of glass wastes have been transported by PBMC to the mainland for onward processing.

It is pertinent to mention that due to source segregation efforts, PBMC has successfully closed the existing dumping yard and stopped smoke emission.

Single use plastic has been banned in Port Blair City. PBMC is utilizing the plastic waste in road construction and made it mandatory for using 8-10 % of plastic waste not only to increase road durability, but also eliminate plastic footprint from these serene & pristine Islands. So far, around 16 MT of waste plastic has been used for construction of 25KM of roads, within the jurisdiction of PBMC.

Further, in order to promote compost from bio-degradable waste generated in the town, the PBMC has been relentlessly collecting the cattle dung, egg shells from fast food shops, lemons from street vendors and thereafter transform it into manures/other products. PBMC utilizes these manures for maintaining the green patches/public parks and also make available to the general public through the counter set-up at Gandhi Park, on payment basis. Visitors approaching the counters are also motivated to transform their household waste into compost.

In order to promote the 3R principle (Reduce, Reuse & Recycle), PBMC has registered 3 SHGs Sanitary Workers and they have been allowed to use the Dry Resource Centers for producing 3R products as well as bio-composts for their livelihood by utilizing the type of waste being stored at SLRCs, which has been found to be a successful model. PBMC is committed to provide a 'Clean & Green' environment to its citizens, a press release from Secretary, PBMC said.
