PM Modi makes surprise visit to Leh; Interacts with Army, Air Force and ITBP personnel at Nimu

Enemies of India have seen the fire & fury of our Forces: PM

New Delhi, July 3 (PIB)

Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi travelled to Nimu in Ladakh to interact with Indian troops earlier today. Nimu is surrounded by the Zaskar range and is on the banks of river Indus. The Prime Minister met the top leadership of the Indian Army and later interacted with personnel of the Army, Air Force and ITBP.

Prime Minister paid rich tributes to the valour of our Armed Forces, stating that their courage and devotion to Mother India is unparalleled. He stated that Indians can go about their lives peacefully because they know that our Armed Forces are standing firm, protecting the nation. Prime Minister said that due to the exemplary bravery of the Armed Forces in the recent weeks, the world has taken note of India's strength.

Prime Minister remembered all the proud sons of Mother India who made the supreme sacrifice at the Galwan Valley. He said that those who were martyred belong to all parts of India and epitomize our land's ethos of bravery. He affirmed that be it Leh-Ladakh, Kargil or the Siachen Glacier, be it the high mountains or the icy cold water that flows in the rivers, these are testimony to the gallantry of India's Armed Forces. The enemies of India have seen the fire and fury of our forces, said the Prime Minister. Prime Minister also paid homage to two Matas: to Mother India and to the Mothers of all those brave soldiers and security forces of India who serve



India with unparalleled diligence.

Prime Minister spoke at length about how the virtues of peace, friendship and courage have been a part of India's culture since time immemorial. He said that Power Sector being strategic and essential in nature is vulnerable for cyber attacks. Therefore, he added, imported equipments will

be subjected testing to check influx of malwares like Trojan etc. He also stressed that it should be our sincere endeavour to promote manufacturing of power infrastructure equipments within the country.

Shri Singh stated that a lot has been achieved in the power sector which includes a capacity addition of nearly 15000 MW per year (Contd. on last page)

Ultrasound machines commissioned at CHC Rangat, PHC Hut Bay & PHC Swaraj Dweep

Port Blair, July 3

The A & N Administration is committed to provide better health care services including better diagnostic facilities to the residents of these Islands. In this regard, the Administration has decided to install

Ultrasound Machines and Dialysis Units at all CHCs and PHCs of all major Islands. Recently, the Administration has procured 03 more Ultrasound Machines and commissioned them at CHC Rangat, PHC Hut Bay and PHC Swaraj Dweep for the benefit of local people of these areas, especially the expecting mothers. This will provide great relief to the residents of these areas specially the people of Hut Bay and Swaraj Dweep, who had to travel long distances by Ship/Boat to avail these facilities at Port Blair.

With the installation of these diagnosis equipments, the Administration has fulfilled its commitment to provide ultrasound facilities

to all Blocks/Major Islands of the UT. At present, the ultrasound facilities are available at GB Pant Hospital, Port Blair, PHC Garacharma (to be upgraded to District Hospital), CHC Bambooflat, PHC Hut Bay, PHC Swaraj Dweep, Dr. R.P. Hospital Mayabunder, CHC Rangat, CHC Diglipur, BJR Hospital Car Nicobar, CHC Nancowry and PHC Campbell Bay.

It is to mention that, presently only two Dialysis Units are functional in these Islands, one at GB Pant Hospital, Port Blair and the other at Dr. R.P Hospital Mayabunder. Keeping in view of the increased number of patients requiring regular dialysis session and the difficulties faced by such patients to reach the existing

17 Dialysis Machines to be installed at BJR Hospital Car Nicobar, CHC Diglipur, CHC Rangat, CHC Bambooflat & PHC Swaraj Dweep

Dialysis Unit, the Administration has decided to establish Dialysis Units at BJR Hospital, Car Nicobar, CHC Diglipur, CHC Rangat, CHC Bambooflat and PHC Swaraj Dweep. To provide the required facility, the Administration has procured 17 Dialysis Machines at a cost of Rs. 1.96 Crores. These machines will be installed at BJR Hospital Car Nicobar (04), CHC Diglipur (03), CHC Rangat (04), CHC Bambooflat (04) and PHC Swaraj Dweep (02). With the operationalization of these machines, the people of North and Middle Andaman and Car Nicobar Districts need not travel to Port Blair and Mayabunder, to avail dialysis facility. Presently, about 57

patients need Dialysis therapy in the territorial jurisdiction of these areas. With the installation of these 17 machines, approximately 125 persons will be benefitted/ avail the dialysis facility per month, a press release from Principal Secretary (Health) said.

Infrastructure Development in Fisheries Sector in A&N Islands

Ice Plant of 10 MT commissioned at Mayabunder; 5 MT capacity Ice Plant at Panighat to be completed by December

Port Blair, July 3

In order to boost fishery productions and achieve the goal set under the Blue Revolution plan, the A&N Administration is expeditiously initiating various development activities in Fisheries Sector in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands. In addition to creation of fishing infrastructure, the demand for ice and quality preservation is met by constructing medium capacity Ice Plant and Cold Storages at various locations of the Islands i.e. Campbell Bay, Car Nicobar, Little Andaman, Port Blair and Rangat. Considering the additional demand, a new

Ice Plant of Ten MT has been commissioned at Mayabunder and another Ice Plant unit of five MT capacity in Panighat, Port Blair is expected to be completed by Dec, 2020. A pre-fab Cold Storage (10 MT) and a Containerized Ice Plant (05 MT) is to be realised during this financial year to meet the additional demand of ice and storage due to large number of fishing fleets operating in Junglighat.

Apart from this, the Fisheries Department is also promoting establishment of ice plant, cold storage and processing units in private sector by extending financial



assistance under centrally sponsored scheme to meet the future requirement for strengthening the cold chain and thereby facilitating the direct export from these Islands. In absence of exclusive fishing harbour, the existing fish landing jetty

at Junglighat is being extended by 75 meters to provide additional berthing space for mechanized and deep sea fishing vessels, which is expected to be completed by August-2020.

The initiatives towards fish harvest and post

harvest infrastructure is expected to increase the availability of quality seafood for export, which shall generate additional income and employment opportunities in A&N Islands, a press release from the Directorate of Fisheries said.

Scanty rainfall in South Andaman; level of water in Dhanikhari dam has not replenished to desired level

Various measures taken to ensure water supply in urban areas Citizens urged to construct rainwater harvesting structure in houses

Port Blair, July 3

There has been scanty rainfall in South Andaman despite the onset of South West monsoon. However, to meet the essential domestic requirement of the citizens in urban areas, various measures are being taken to ensure water supply. There is not much inflow and collection of water in Dhanikhari dam due to ineffective and intermittent rainfall in surrounding areas and therefore, the level of water in the dam has not replenished to the desired level. and friendship but this commitment to peace should not be seen as India's weakness. Today India is becoming stronger, be it in naval might, air power, space power and the strength of our army. Modernization of weapons and upgradation of infrastructure has enhanced our defence capabilities manifold.

Prime Minister recalled that Indian soldiers had a long history of bravery and competence in global military campaigns, including in the two World Wars.

Prime Minister said that the time for expansionism is over. This is the era of development. He recalled that it is this mindset of expansionism that did great harm. He added that in the last few years, several steps have been taken for the wellbeing of India's forces and furthering India's security preparedness. This includes ensuring availability of modern weaponry, increased border infrastructure, border area development and expanding the roads network. He further shared that expenditure on border infrastructure has been enhanced three times. Prime Minister also mentioned the efforts to strengthen the national security apparatus and to ensure the well-being of our armed forces. He highlighted recent initiatives of the government such as creation of CDS, construction of a grand National War Memorial, fulfilment of OROP after decades and steps to ensure the well-being of the families of the armed forces personnel.

During the interaction, Prime Minister recalled the greatness of Ladakh's culture as well as the noble teachings of Kushok Bakula Rimpoche. He described Ladakh as a land of sacrifice and a land that has given several patriots.

Prime Minister affirmed that the people of India are inspired by the teachings of Gautama Buddha, for whom courage was linked to conviction and compassion.

of rainfall between 23rd June, 2020 to 2nd July, the water level in the dam after meeting the daily drawl has gone up by 22 cms only (from 48.15 metres to 48.37 metres). The present water level in the Dhanikhari dam is still in the dead storage level and thus normal water drawl by gravity will not be possible as the same is being managed by pumping.

As and when the water level in the Dhanikhari Dam reaches 52.00 metres, normal water supply can be restored in Port Blair urban areas. Normal water supply has already resumed in rural areas like Ferrargunj, Wimberlygunj, Tirur except Bambooflat and Namunagar where the alternate day normal supply will be restored w.e.f 04.07.2020.

Considering the present water level in the dam, the citizens have been advised to harvest rainwater for domestic use. Further, the citizens have also been requested to initiate construction of rainwater harvesting structure in every house, for better water conservation management, a press release from APWD said.

PM Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises Scheme
Credit linked subsidy to micro enterprises

Port Blair, July 3

The Ministry of Food Processing Industries, Govt. of India has launched a new Centrally Sponsored Scheme called 'Prime Minister Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PM FME)' Scheme under Atmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan, with the aim to enhance the competitiveness of existing individual Micro Enterprises in the unorganized segment of the Food Processing Industry and promote formalization of the sector thereby supporting Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), Self Help Groups and Producers Cooperatives along their entire value chain.

Under the programme, support will be provided for credit linked grant at 35 % of the project cost with maximum grant up to Rs. 10.0 lakh to existing unorganized food processing units for up gradation; Credit linked grant at 35% of the project cost to SHGs/FPOs/ Cooperatives for capital expenditure with maximum limit as prescribed; Seed capital @ Rs. 40,000/- per member of SHGs engaged in food processing as a working capital; Credit linked grant at 35% of the project cost for common infrastructure with maximum limit as prescribed; Support for marketing & branding up to 50% of the expenditure with maximum limit as prescribed.

Income Tax Department refunded Rs. 62,361 crore to more than 20 lakh taxpayers amid COVID-19 pandemic

New Delhi, July 3 (PIB)

In pursuance to the Government's decision vide Press Note dated April 8th, 2020 to issue pending income tax refunds in order to help taxpayers in a COVID-19 pandemic situation, the Income Tax Department has issued tax refunds at a speed of 76 cases per minute from 8th April to 30th June, 2020. During this period of just 56 weekdays, the Central Board of Direct taxes (CBDT) has issued refunds in more than 20.44 lakh cases amounting to more than Rs. 62,361 crore.

It is stated that taxpayers are experiencing this facet of the I-T Department which is not only taxpayer-friendly, but also that of a facilitator providing liquidity in this hard time of COVID-19 pandemic. Income tax refunds amounting to Rs. 23,453.57 crore have been issued in 19,07,853 cases to taxpayers and corporate tax refunds amounting to Rs. 38,908.37 crore have been issued in 1,36,744 cases to taxpayers during this period. Refunds of this magnitude and numbers have been issued completely electronically and have been directly deposited into the bank accounts of the taxpayers.

Unlike what used to happen some years ago, in these refund cases, no taxpayer had to approach the Department to request for release of refund. They got refunds directly into their bank accounts.

CBDT reiterated that taxpayers should provide immediate response to emails of the Department so that refunds in their cases too could be processed and issued right away. Such emails of I-T Department seek taxpayers to confirm their outstanding demand, their bank account number and reconciliation of defect/ mismatch prior to issue of refund. In all such cases, quick responses from the taxpayers would enable the I-T Department to process their refunds expeditiously.

since 2014, connecting the entire nation through one grid spanning far off areas like Leh and Ladakh with grid. India's Grid system is one of the best in the world which was demonstrated during light out event on 5th April, 2020 when our grid handled steepest fall and climb in demand within a very short time. Now the major challenge in Power Sector, he said is to make the distribution companies viable and make our country self reliant in manufacturing of equipments related to Power Sector. As such, liquidity infusion upto Rs. 90,000 crore for DISCOMs was being given under a Package announced by the Govt of India recently for losses upto 31st March, 2020. He informed that against this demand of about Rs 93000 crore has been received from States/UTs and an amount of Rs 20000 crore have been approved as of now while the remaining demands are being processed expeditiously.

Speaking to media through VC, the Minister informed that various States/UTs Governments requested for extending the Union Govt's package to cover losses upto June, 2020, will be considered to extend the quantum of support by the Union Government. The Minister stated that the demand of the States/UTs for extending the support will be considered.

The Minister also informed that a new scheme will soon be announced after merging Deen Dayal Upadhya Gram Jyoti Yojana (DDUGJY) and Integrated Power Development Scheme (IPDS). Centre's funding to States is being made conditional in the new scheme. The States or UTs whose DISCOMs are not in loss will have no problem in getting the funds but the states/UTs whose DISCOMs are in loss will have to give a proper plan as to how they are going to eliminate the losses to get funds. He added that State/UT Governments will get some flexibility in the new scheme to enable them to plan according to their specific needs. Shri Singh underlined that State Governments and UTs have been given around Rs. 1.5 crore every 3-4 years to improve the infrastructure in Power Sector but the same situation keep repeating itself due to lack of non-adherence to loss reductions trajectory. That is why the adhering to new scheme is proposed to link the funding to the reforms.

Shri Singh congratulated officials related to power sector for commendable job during the Lock Down period in the wake of Pandemic COVID-19. He said that now we have achieved a capacity of 3.7 lakh megawatt in power generation against a demand of 1 lakh 85 thousand megawatt. We are also supplying power to many countries.

In the second session of the video conference, issues of New and Renewable Energy were discussed. The Minister said that we are planning to launch a new variant on KUSUM Scheme in which the feeder to the Agriculture Sector will be solarized. It will eliminate the burden of subsidy of State Governments which they give in irrigation in the next 3-4 years.

It takes care of the basic needs of children through proper care, protection, development, treatment and social re-integration by adopting a child-friendly approach in the adjudication and disposal of matters in the best interest of children and for their rehabilitation through processes provided, and institutions and bodies established.

3) The social worker members shall not be less than thirty five years of age and shall have at least seven years of experience of working with children in the field of education, health, or welfare activities, or should be a practicing professional with a degree in child psychology or psychiatry or sociology or in the field of law.

4) As far as possible, the two social worker members so selected for a Board shall be from different fields.

5) No person shall be eligible for selection as a member of the Board, if he/she –

- (i) has any past record of violation of human rights or child rights;
- (ii) has been convicted of an offence involving moral turpitude, and such conviction has not been reversed or has not been granted full pardon in respect of such offence;
- (iii) has been removed or dismissed from service of the Central Government or a State Government or an undertaking or corporation owned or controlled by the Central Government or a State Government;
- (iv) has ever indulged in child abuse or employment of child labour or any other violation of human rights or immoral act.

6) The social worker members of the Board shall be paid not less than

Rs. 1500/- per sitting, which shall include sitting allowance, travel allowance and any other allowance, as the UT Administration may prescribe.

7) The Board shall sit on all working days for a minimum of six hours commensurate with the working hours of a Magistrate Court, unless the case pendency is less in a particular district and the UT Administration issues an order in this regard.

Term of Members of the Board under Rule 5 of A & N Islands Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Rules, 2017:-

(1) The term of the social worker member of the Board shall not be more than for a period of three years from the date of appointment.

(2) A social worker member of the Board shall be eligible for appointment of maximum of two terms, which shall not be continuous.

(3) The members may resign at any time, by giving one month's notice in writing to the State Government.

Composition of Child Welfare Committee and Eligibility criteria for members (refer section 27 of JJ Act and Rule 15 of A& N Islands Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Rules, 2017:-

a) The Committee shall consist of a Chairperson and four other members as the UT Administration may think fit to appoint, of whom at least one shall be a woman and another an expert in matters concerning children.

b) The Chairperson and members of the Committee shall be appointed by the UT Administration on the recommendation of the Selection Committee constituted under Rule 87 of Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Rules, 2017.

c) The Chairperson and the members shall be above the age of thirty-five years and shall have a minimum of seven years of experience of working with children in the field of education, health, or welfare activities, or should be a practising professional with a degree in child psychology or psychiatry or social work or sociology or human development or in the field of law or a retired judicial officer.

d) A member of the Committee shall be eligible for appointment of maximum of two terms, which shall not be continuous.

e) The Chairperson and the members may resign at any time by giving one month's notice in writing to the State Government.

f) The Chairperson and members of the Committee shall be paid such sitting allowance, travel allowance and any other allowance, as the UT Administration may prescribe, but not less than Rs.1500/- per sitting.

g) The Committee shall sit on all working days for a minimum of six hours commensurate with the working hours of a magistrate court, unless the case pendency is less in a particular district & UT Administration issue an order in this regard.

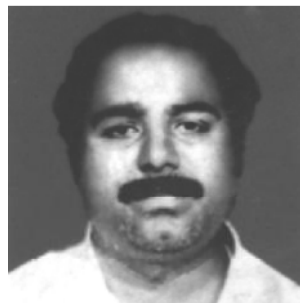

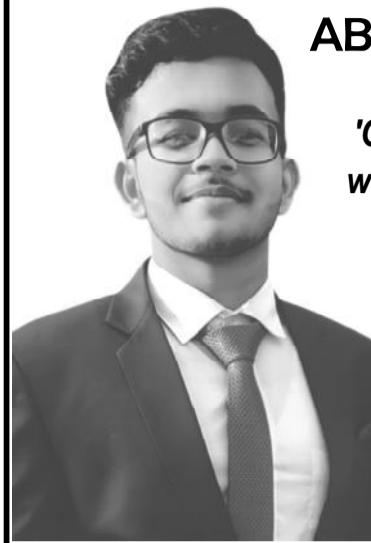
