Port Blair, July 6 In order to place stricter measures of isolation and social distancing in the South Andaman District to control the surge in the cases of COVID-19 and also to prevent any disturbance to the peace and tranquility and taking into consideration the request of the public

representatives and general public, Shri Suneel Anchipaka, District Magistrate, South Andaman District, in exercise of the powers vested u/s 144 of Cr.P.C. has ordered lockdown to be imposed in the entire District of South Andaman with effect from July 7, 2021 and shall be in force till

July 13, 2021. As per the Order issued today, shops selling essential and non-essential items shall be allowed to open between 6 am & 6 pm by observing COVID appropriate behavior. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business

establishment to ensure its compliance and shall be held responsible for any violation and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall be liable for action under DM Act.

No movement of men and material other than the time fixed for opening of shops between 6 am & 6 pm shall be allowed. Movement shall be allowed for emergency cases, medical emergencies, pregnant women and patients availing medical services.

## Blanket ban on single use plastic items in A&N Islands

Hyper Market shop fined Rs. 50,000 as penalty for storage & sale of banned plastic items under Environment Protection Act, 1986

Port Blair, July 6 In exercise of the powers conferred under Section 5 of the Environment Protection Act, 1986, the Lieutenant Governor of A&N Islands banned Single Use Plastic items such as PET Bottles less

than 2 Litres, plastic straws, plastic sachets, plastic bodied cigarette lighters, plastic carry bags, plastic sheet/pouches and ear buds with plastic stick vide A&N Gazetted Notification no. 186 dated 05.09.2019 to reduce plastic

pollution in these islands and to preserve one of the world's richest ecosystems and biodiversity hotspots. The Andaman & Nicobar Pollution Control Committee (ANPCC) in its efforts of enforcing and regulating

compliance of the provisions made under the Notification conducted surprise inspections during December 2019 under the supervision of the Member Secretary, ANPCC and

**Social security pensions to Senior Citizens, Divyangjan, Widow & Destitute Women**

**Beneficiaries urged to submit Life Certificate**

Port Blair, July 6  
The Department of Social Welfare is providing social security pensions to Senior Citizens, Divyangjan, Widow and Destitute Women @Rs.2500/- per month and Rs.3000/- for senior citizen above the age of 80 years.

The Directorate of Social Welfare has made repeated requests to the above beneficiaries to furnish life certificates on or before 30th June, 2021 through print and electronic media in different occasions on 06.06.2021, 07.06.2021, 13.06.2021, 23.06.2021, 27.06.2021 & 01.07.2021.

The beneficiaries are required to furnish life certificate once in every year and subsequently, their credentials are verified to ascertain their eligibility for continued disbursement of monthly pension. This is required for maintaining a transparent and accountable system for ensuring the release pensions to only eligible persons.

Despite above efforts, still there are many beneficiaries who have failed to submit their life certificate within the due date. Usually, the monthly social security pension is released within the 10<sup>th</sup> day of succeeding month. However, due to the delay in submission of life certificate by the beneficiaries and its subsequent verification, it is expected unintended short delay in release of social security pensions to the beneficiaries of this UT Administration for the month of July, 2021. The delay is regretted and pensioners are requested to bear with the inconvenience. It is once again informed to all beneficiaries who have not submitted their life certificate to the Anganwadi Workers or Office of the CDPO to furnish the life certificate without further delay, failing which their monthly pension will kept on hold till receipt of the life certificate, a press release from Directorate of Social Welfare said.

seized large quantities of banned single use plastic items at 3 shops/units in Port Blair city namely M/s Mubarak Hyper Market, M/s Andaman & Nicobar Mineral Water Pvt. Ltd. and M/s Aryan Aqua (India) Pvt. Ltd. In order to ensure compliance of the Environment Protection Act, 1986, the ANPCC filed three Complaint Registered cases against the units before the Hon'ble Judicial Magistrate First Class-cour at Port Blair. Vide order dated 27.04.21 in CR case no. 137 of 2019, the accused, Director, M/s Mubarak Hyper Market, near Head Post Office, Port Blair was fined an amount of Rs. 50,000 as penalty and was sentenced in court custody till the rising of the court. Our island is facing serious threat to its natural resources including the unique biodiversity due to plastic pollution. It is our duty to conserve natural resources and keep them free from any kind of pollution. Environmental protection is the need of the hour and must be taken seriously. Improving the quality of our environment is needed for both human beings and other life forms. **COVID-19: Containment operations in Containment area of Hazaribagh declared over**

The area in and around Hazaribagh was declared as a Containment Zone in order to prevent the spread of COVID-19 vide Order dt. 01.06.2021. As per the updated Containment Plan for Large Outbreaks of Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 issued by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, the containment operation shall be deemed to be over 14 days from the discharge of last confirmed case (following negative tests as per discharge policy) from the designated health facility i.e. when the follow up of hospital contacts will be complete. The health authorities have confirmed that the conditions for removing Containment Area (SA) has come into force from 06.07.2021. The Order issued by DM (SA) has come into force from 06.07.2021. The case of Hazaribagh area. Further, the medical screening of all the residents of the area has already been done and samples of symptomatic persons were collected which were reported negative. In view of the above, the containment operations in the Containment Area of Hazaribagh Area has been declared over. However, the surveillance will continue for ILI/SARI. The SHO concerned shall keep strict vigil over the above said area to ensure that the instructions issued with regard to lockdown are being followed and shall also remove the restrictions on entry and exit from the above Containment Zone. 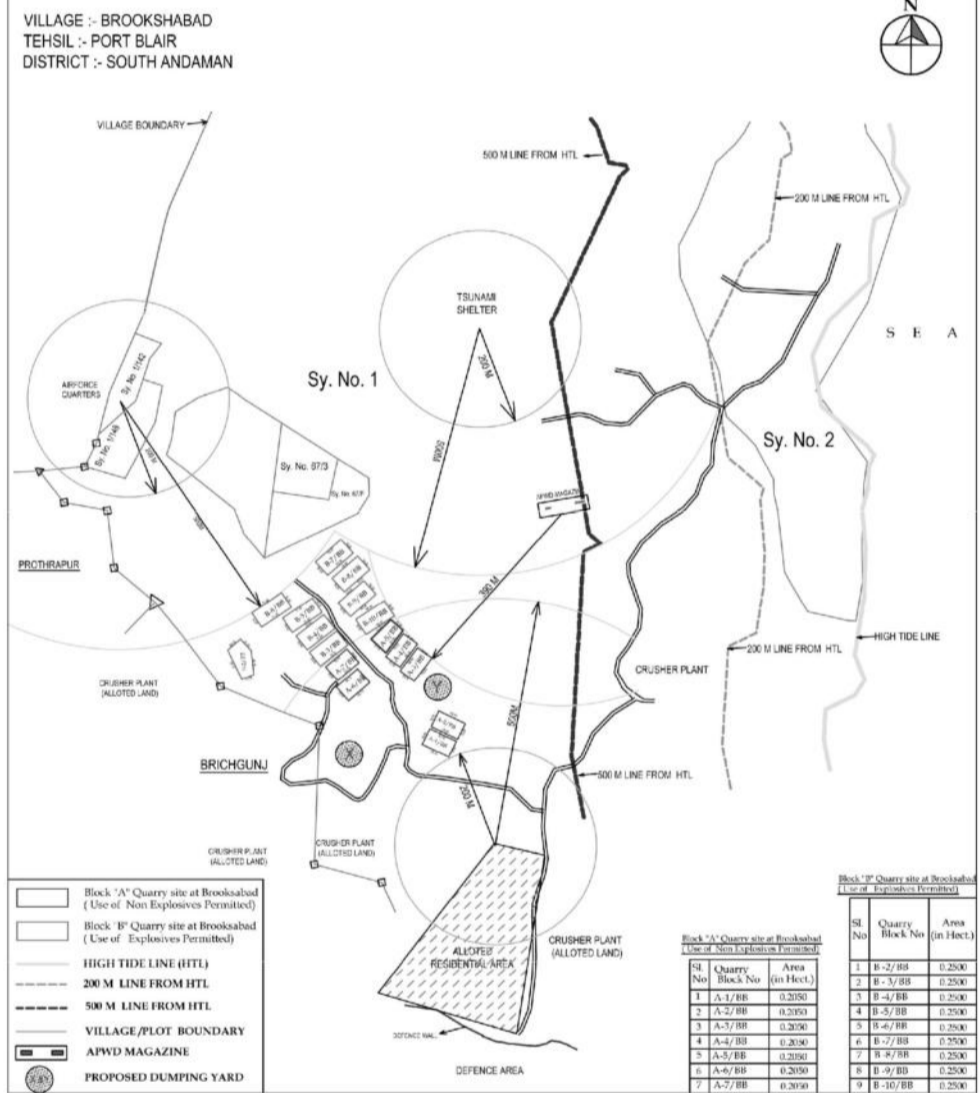

Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo after 6 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Travel of persons after 6 pm shall be allowed to proceed to their destinations at mainland on production of valid travel documents. However, the person (one person) who intend to pick/drop after 6 pm, should apply for e-pass well in advance with supporting documents and the same shall be issued by the Office of District Magistrate on case to case basis.

Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, ICMR, PBMC, Electricity, Home Guards, Civil Defence, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty after 6 pm shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned Departments.

Movement of bare minimum number of Officers/Officials, involved in providing services such as Pay & Accounts, Shipping Services, Forest, Banking, Water Supply & Sanitation in Rural Areas, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication shall be allowed after 6 pm on production of movement pass already issued by the Office of District Magistrate. The concerned Department should also ensure that such officials are called on for duties on alternate days to maintain COVID appropriate behavior at workplaces.

Movement of personnel involved in providing Broadcasting, all print and electronic media persons after 6 pm shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Movement of bare minimum personnel involved in Private Security Services, Cable Services, Internet Service Providers, POL Outlets, LPG Stores/Godown, ATMs, e-Commerce activities, Cold Storages and Warehouses shall be allowed after 6 pm on production of e-passes already issued to such persons by the Office of District Magistrate. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.25,000/- and shall also be liable for action under DM Act. The concerned organization should also ensure that such officials are called on for duties on alternate days to maintain COVID appropriate behavior at workplaces. All POL outlets shall be opened from 6 am to 6 pm.

Movement of bare minimum private medical personnel such as Doctors, nursing staff, paramedics etc. attached with diagnostic centres and clinics, veterinary clinics shall be allowed after 6 pm on production of e-passes already issued to such persons by the Office of District Magistrate. Movement of persons from containment zones shall be strictly restricted and shall only be permitted on case to case basis upon approval from the Office of District Magistrate.

Godowns and allied establishments shall be permitted to operate till 6 pm for non-business purposes and shall not cater to any customers. Only internal operations, receiving/dispatching of stocks etc. shall be permitted. Establishments violating this provision shall be liable for fine of Rs.50,000/-.

Port services will continue to operate as usual and both essential and non-essential cargo can be moved in and out of port, as per requirement for loading/unloading/clearing of cargo and the same shall be permitted till 6 pm only.

Construction activities shall be permitted from 6 am to 6 pm. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects beyond 6 pm shall be permitted with prior permission of District Magistrate.

Movement of persons involved with Hotels/Restaurants and Mess to be certified by the firm/organisation for home delivery of food shall be allowed till 9 pm on production of e-passes already issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Dine-in shall be permitted between 6 am & 6 pm subject to 50% of the seating capacity and strict adherence of COVID appropriate behaviors. However, take away/parcel service and home delivery should be encouraged. It shall be the sole responsibility of the owner/In-Charge of the shop/business establishment to ensure its compliance and also if any person attached with such organisation is found misusing the e-passes or using the same for purposes other than it is meant for, the owner/in-charge shall be held responsible and he/she shall be liable to be fined to the tune of Rs.50,000/- in addition to sealing of the shop/establishment for a period of 14 days by the Executive Magistrate and shall also be liable for action under DM Act.

Public Transport/Buses shall be allowed to ply with maximum 90% seating capacity including Autos, Taxis and Jeeps in partial modification to this Office Order No.566 dt. 23rd April, 2021. Transportation of cargo shall also be permitted. SOPs in this regard have been issued by the Transport Department, separately.

The e-passes issued by the Office of the District Magistrate to individuals for movement after 6 pm involved in various activities/services shall be revalidated automatically and such individuals need not apply for fresh e-passes. Sale and service of liquor at licensed premises shall be permitted. SOPs and orders regarding the timings for sale and service of liquor at all licensed establishments (C, C1, B1, B2, B3 and B4 category) shall be issued by the Deputy Commissioner (Excise), South Andaman, separately.

e-pass for emergency movement during restricted timings may be submitted online on <https://epass.andaman.gov.in>. The applicants/organizations submitting applications for e-pass should invariably submit valid and clear supporting documents, failing which, the application will be summarily rejected.

Persons engaged for essential activities for movement of goods on Andaman Trunk Road, loading and unloading of essential cargo shall be allowed on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate. Goods transport, vehicles carrying agricultural produce of farmers, agriculture & its allied activities shall be permitted.

Movement of officers/officials involved in providing essential services such as District Administration, Police, CISF, Health Services, Home Guards, Electricity, Fire and emergency services, Defence personnel on duty shall be permitted on production of valid Identity Cards issued by their concerned departments.

Movement of bare minimum number of Officers/officials, certified by the Head of Department, involved in providing essential and emergency services such as Pay & Accounts, Shipping Services, Forest, Banking, Disaster Management, Port services and related services, Telecommunication, Courts as per orders of High Court and E-commerce activities shall be permitted on production of valid movement passes issued by the Office of District Magistrate.

Persons going for booking of first dose and administration of second dose of COVID vaccine shall be permitted on showing valid booking ID or appointment slips.

Restaurants/hotels/Guest House/Eateries can continue operations beyond 6 pm only for home delivery/parcel and room service till 9 pm, if inmates are staying.

Construction activities shall be permitted from 6 am to 6 pm. Construction activities of national importance and strategic projects beyond 6 pm shall be permitted with the prior permission of the respective Assistant Commissioner.

Public Transport/Buses shall be allowed to ply with maximum 90% seating capacity including Autos, Taxis and Jeeps. Transportation of cargo shall also be permitted. SOPs in this regard shall be issued by the Transport Department, separately.

The shops/establishments mentioned in the order shall strictly follow norms of social distancing by maintaining a distance of at least one meter from a person and not allowing more than 5 persons at a time inside the premises.

In view of the emergent circumstances, this order is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general. Further, the Superintendent of Police/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Executive Magistrates and all authorities concerned shall ensure strict compliance of this order and shall adequately inform and sensitize the field functionaries to note that these restrictions fundamentally relate to movement of people, but not to that of essential services.

Any disobedience of the above orders shall invite penal action u/s 188 of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 against the violator(s) and also fines shall also be imposed as per Order No.27 dt. 23rd April 2021. This order shall come in force in the Nicobars District from 6th July 2021 and shall be effective till further orders.

provide hand sanitizer to the passengers mandatorily. Similarly, Jeeps are permitted to operate with not more than five passengers while taxis with three passengers for ensuring social distancing. Sanitization of the vehicles shall be carried out by the driver after every trip. Wearing of the mask by the driver as well as passengers is compulsory and driver shall ensure that the passengers should wear mask properly. Driver shall provide hand sanitizer to the passengers mandatorily.

Contract Carriage Cabs are allowed to ply with not more than 5 passengers in SUV and 3 passengers in Sedan/Hatchback for ensuring social distancing. Sanitization of the vehicles shall be carried out by the driver after every trip. Wearing of the mask by the driver as well as passengers is compulsory and driver shall ensure that the passengers should wear mask properly. Driver shall provide hand sanitizer to the passengers mandatorily.

Stage Carriage buses shall be allowed to ply with maximum 90% of the registered seating capacity. No passengers shall be permitted to sit in the co-driver's seat and standing passengers are not allowed. Sanitization of the buses shall be carried out after every trip. Hand sanitizer shall also be kept in the bus for the use of passengers. Wearing of mask by the crew as well as passengers is compulsory. Bus conductors have to ensure that the passengers wear mask properly and shall provide hand sanitizer to the passengers mandatorily.

Any persons violating these measures will be liable to be proceeded against as per the provisions of Section 51 to 60 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, besides legal action under Section 188 of the IPC, and other legal provisions as per Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 and Rules.


Strict penal action will be taken against the vehicle/ permit owners for violation of any of the conditions without any leniency which may lead to cancellation of permits, the Order to this effect issued by Transport Department added.




