



COVID appropriate behavior violations in A&N Islands one of the highest in the country

Since the outbreak of corona virus, fine amount of Rs. 2,08,99,700 realized through 85,643 challans

Fine amounting to Rs. 50, 36,400 levied through 21,732 challans during 2nd wave

Port Blair, May 7

The Andaman & Nicobar Administration has taken many steps to contain the spread of COVID-19 virus in A&N Islands. However, despite the best efforts of the Administration to stop the transmission of the virus, the number of active cases still remains on the higher side. The total number of active cases as on date is 209 in A&N Islands. The residents of the Islands have been requested several times to follow COVID appropriate behavior and thereby help the Administration in its efforts to check the spread of the disease. The onset of second wave of COVID-19



positive cases has been primarily due to complacency in adhering to COVID Protocols and unnecessary movement.

A data from the Police Department reveals that the Islands stand among one of the highest per capita violations of COVID appropriate behaviour in the country. Data shows that during the second wave of COVID -19 as many as 1759 persons have been challaned for not wearing face mask in public places and 19,635 persons for not maintaining social distancing. A total fine amount of Rs. 50, 36,400/- has been realized from COVID violators through challans during this period. Record further shows that the total COVID violation since the outbreak of the 1st wave has been exponentially high and a fine amount of Rs. 2,08,99,700 has been realized through 85,643 challans. This puts the Islands at the fore in terms

of per capita violations and challans in the country.

The Administration so far has been quite liberal in its approach towards people and has imposed limited restrictions in the Islands considering the livelihood and convenience of the people but it is disheartening to note that some people are still very careless and are not paying heed to safety protocols. If the situation persists, the Administration will be forced to take more stringent measures.

This is the time when all of us should realize our social responsibility and rise above the petty politics and support the

Like elsewhere in the country, the Andaman and Nicobar Islands too is battling the dreaded 'Corona virus'. Of late, the data shows that the rise in number of positive cases in the Islands is more noticeable among inter-island bound passengers. Despite repeated pleas by Administration to general public to reconsider their journey

plan keeping in mind the transmission rate of the virus, yet inter-island movement is continuing unabated. While requests have been pouring from all quarters to facilitate inter-island movement, we must acknowledge the fact that the number of cases from mainland has decreased while the inter-island movement is witnessing more number of cases.

Data from Health

Department reveals that 5 flights with 267 passengers arrived today (May 7) and during the Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) conducted on these passengers, only one flight passenger was found positive while 6 inter-island bound passengers were tested positive at Ferrargunj. This shows that the number of cases outnumbers the cases detected from incoming flight passengers. As per

health data from the period of March 1, 2021 to May 7, 2021 during the second wave, the total positive cases so far detected in A&N Islands stood at 1291, out of which, 711 cases detected were of inter-island bound passengers. During the RAT test conducted on incoming flight passengers from April 16, 2021 to May 7, 2021, the total number of positive cases detected was 207.

In A&N Islands about 1,01,603 beneficiaries in the target age group of 45+ are to be vaccinated and with the concerted efforts of the Administration and the support of the people of the Islands, a total of

98,162 beneficiaries constituting 96.61 % of the population have been covered so far. The remaining 3441 beneficiaries have been once again requested to get themselves vaccinated as early as possible as a shield against the virus.

While the Administration is putting all out efforts to safeguard Islanders, we must come forward and get the vaccination for our safety. Time and again the Administration has been appealing to the people falling under

the category of 45+ to get themselves vaccinated and the repeated appeals should drive us to get immunized as early as possible. The surge in daily cases itself sounds alarming bell for us to wake up and act immediately.

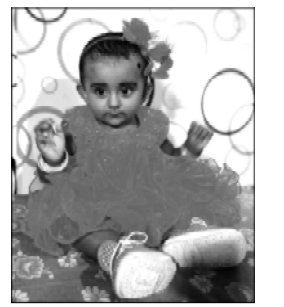
