India gets first tranche of Swiss bank account details

New Delhi, Oct 7

India has received the first tranche of details about financial accounts of its residents in Swiss banks under a new automatic exchange of information framework between the two countries.

It marks a significant milestone in the fight against black money suspected to be stashed abroad.

A Federal Tax Administration (FTA) spokesperson said, India figures among 75 countries with which Switzerland's FTA has exchanged information on financial accounts within



the framework of global standards on AEOL.

This is the first time that India has received details from Switzerland under the AEOL framework, which provides for exchange of information on financial accounts that currently active as well as those accounts that were

closed during 2018.

The next exchange would take place in September 2020.

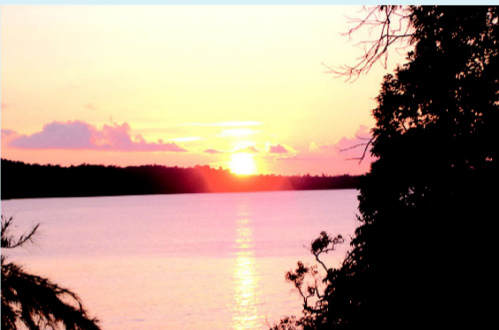

approach for fire vehicles and thereby 4 lengths of delivery hose were laid down to start fire fighting operation. Further, there was dense smoke was emanating all around and it was difficult for Fire Service personnel to locate the seat of fire. Additional Water Tenders and Bouzer from Fire Station Aberdeen and Marine were also mobilized to the scene of fire owing to the rapidly spreading fire. The semi RCC building involved in fire was destroyed completely and the loss was estimated as Rs.25 Lakhs (approximately).

Due to stringent action and high sense of professionalism of fire fighters, the residential buildings situated within close proximity costing many crores could be saved. The reason of the fire was identified as short circuit at the electric meter board of the house.

Due to the earnest efforts and hard work of Fire Service personnel, the fire was put out completely within half an hour of continues fire fighting and saved many residential buildings situated in the thickly populated area from great damage. Shri. S.K. Meena, Dy.SP (Fire Service) also rushed to the spot and supervised the entire operation till the fire was brought under control and ultimately putout.

About curbing the poaching activities in A&N Islands, the CINCAN said that with available assets the Command is able to thwart the poaching activities in isles waters. The arrest of the poachers reflects that all agencies are working effectively with co-ordination on the given task, the CINCAN said adding that the joint patrolling has also been increased from once in three months to one in every month.

Answering to a query, the CINCAN informed that the Shibpur airstrip at Diglipur is ready to start flights under UDAN scheme of the Govt. of India and the clearances from the A&N Command has already given to the private operator to start the flights. Responding to another query, the CINCAN said that the border with China is unresolved and Border talks are going on since several years. Our Relationship with China is tensed as well as of Co-operation. There is presence of Chinese Navy in Bay of Bengal but we are also continuously monitoring their movement through our Ships and Aircrafts, the CINCAN added. Further acquisition plan for the A&N Command has been placed before the Govt. of India and the capacity & capability building is an ongoing process, he said.
