field surveillance on daily basis and around 19,009 households covering a population of 65,885 have been surveyed and around 5732 co-morbid persons also being monitored. Around 447 medicine kits and 166 oximeters

have been issued to eligible cases for better tracking of health parameters of the concerned. The Administration is committed to providing better health care facilities and is working round the clock to ensure

that the spread of this virus is restricted by taking appropriate and preventive measures.

New Delhi, Jan. 8

Election Commission on Saturday announced the Assembly polls schedule for Uttar Pradesh, Goa, Punjab, Manipur and Uttarakhand. Announcing the poll schedule in New Delhi this afternoon, Chief Election

Sushil Chandra said Uttar Pradesh will go to polls in seven phases from 10th February to 7th March. Voting for Punjab, Uttarakhand and Goa will be held on 14th of February in single phase. Manipur will vote on 27th February and 3rd March in two phases. Counting of votes will be held on 10th of March. A total of 690 Assembly constituencies in Goa, Manipur, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Punjab will go to polls this time. reports are awaited. About 86 positive cases were found during the test conducted yesterday. During RAT conducted on 62 passengers bound for North & Middle Andaman at Ferrargunj, two positive cases have been detected. At Mohanpura Bus Terminus, test was

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Setting up of 100 new Sainik Schools will provide more opportunities for girls to join the Armed Forces: Raksha Mantri

"The setting up of 100 new Sainik schools will provide an opportunity to girls to join the Armed Forces and contribute to national security," said Raksha Mantri, Shri Rajnath Singh while chairing a webinar on Sainik Schools today. Shri Rajnath Singh said, the Government believes in increasing the role of women in the Armed Forces and a series of steps have been taken in that direction, including clearing the way for admission of girls in Sainik Schools and providing Permanent Commission to women officers. He exuded confidence the decision to establish new Sainik schools will encourage girls to realise their dreams of serving the country. The Raksha Mantri described the announcement of expansion of Sainik

Schools as one of the many important decisions taken by the Government in the last six-seven years to improve the quality of basic education of children and ensure holistic development of the country. He hoped that the amalgamation of Raksha and Shikshain Sainik schools will play an important role in nation-building in the times to come. He stated that while 'Sainik' signifies unity, discipline & devotion, 'School' is the centre of education, therefore, Sainik schools are playing a pivotal role in making children capable citizens. Shri Rajnath Singh added that the Government is focussing on providing quality education to the youth of the country as it lays a solid foundation for the all-round development of society. "Quality

education is the fourth of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals adopted by the United Nations. There are several other goals under 'quality education'. It has been our strong political commitment to achieve these goals. Several schemes like Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan and Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan are being run. Setting up of 100 new Sainik Schools is another important step in that direction," he said. The Raksha Mantri lauded the Sainik School Society for implementing the ideals of visionaries such as Swami Vivekananda, Mahatma Gandhi, Dr BR Ambedkar and Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan who had emphasised on physical, mental, moral and spiritual development of children along with academic education.

National vaccination drive crosses 150 crore 61 lakh mark

New Delhi, Jan. 8

More than 150 crore 61 lakh COVID vaccine doses have been administered in the country so far under Nationwide Vaccination Drive. Health Ministry said, more than 90 lakh 59 thousand doses were administered in the last 24 hours. The Ministry said a total of one lakh 41 thousand

986 new cases were reported in the last 24 hours. India's Active caseload stands at four lakh 72 thousand 169 and it is currently at 1.34 per cent .

The recovery rate is currently at 97.30 per cent. A total of 40 thousand 895 people recovered in the last 24 hours and total recoveries touched over three crore 44

lakh and 12 thousand. The weekly positivity rate currently stands at 5.66 per cent while the Daily positivity rate is at 9.28 per cent. Over 68 crore 84 lakh COVID tests have been conducted in the country so far. In the last 24 hours, more than 15 lakh 29 thousand tests were conducted. (Source: india.gov.in)

Need to link Weavers and Artisans through E-Commerce platforms and leveraging of technology: Commerce Minister

New Delhi, Jan. 8 (PIB)

Shri Piyush Goyal, Minister for Commerce & Industry, Textiles, Consumer Affairs and Food Distribution reviewed the functioning of Ministry of Textiles, its autonomous bodies and PSU under its administrative control. Speaking on the occasion, Shri Goyal said that there was an urgent need to link Weavers and Artisans through E-Commerce platforms and leveraging of technology. He said that no stone is to be left unturned for the growth of livelihoods in handlooms and handicrafts sector. The meeting was also attended by Ms Darshana Jardosh, MoS Railway & Textiles, senior officials of Ministry of Textiles. Textiles being very diversified sector,

wide ranging issues and activities were discussed in the meeting .

There was special focus on livelihood sector of handlooms and handicrafts. Implementation of schemes in these sectors were discussed in details. Shri Goyal directed for simplification of process and for an effective online dashboard based monitoring system for transparency. He also advised all officials to maintain good communication with State Government functionaries to improve the outcome and impact of these Central Government schemes. In this regard he asked the officers

to organize a virtual conference with the State Government Secretaries responsible for this sector. The progress of Craft Villages was reviewed and the Minister directed for completion of all these projects in next 6 months.

Shri Goyal emphasized that the weavers and artisans should be assisted in marketing their produce through all platforms of e.g. Delhi Haat, Urban Haats and Handloom Haat. He also advised for leveraging technology by linking these weavers and artisans through e-commerce platforms available.

India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is estimated to rise 9.2 per cent in the current fiscal as compared to a contraction of 7.3 per cent in the financial year 2020-21. This was stated by the Statistics and Programme Implementation Ministry in its First Advance Estimates of National Income for the financial year 2021-22. It has also been

stated that real GDP or GDP at Constant Prices in the current fiscal year is estimated at 147.54 lakh crore rupees as against the Provisional Estimate of GDP for the year 2020-21 of 135.13 lakh crore rupees. It is proposed to fill up two (02) post of Superintending Engineer (Civil), (General Central Services) Group 'A' Gazetted (Ministerial) carrying the Pay Level – 13 (Rs.123100-215900) in the Andaman Public Works Department under A&N Administration on Deputation (ISTC) basis from the officers under the Central Govt./State Government/Public Sector Undertakings/Semi Govt./Autonomous or Statutory Organization and possessing the following experience and other eligibility conditions of appointment.

Deputation (Including Short Term Contract):

Officers under the Central Government/State Govt./UT Administration/PSUs/Universities/recognized Research Institutions/Semi-Government or Autonomous Bodies or Statutory Organization:-

(a) (i) holding analogous posts on regular basis in the parent cadre/department.

OR

(ii) with five years service in the grade rendered after appointment thereto on a regular basis in Level-12 (Rs.78800-209200) in the Pay Matrix or equivalent in the parent cadre or department; OR
(iii) with ten years service in the grade rendered after appointment thereto on a regular basis in Level-11 (Rs.67700-208700) in the Pay Matrix or equivalent in the parent cadre or department; AND

(b) Possessing the following educational qualification and experience

(i) Degree in Civil Engineering of a recognized University/Institute

OR

Having passed Part 'A' & 'B' Examination of the Institution of Engineers (India) in Civil Engineering

(ii) 10 years experience in Planning or Execution or Maintenance of Civil Engineering Projects.

The departmental officer in the feeder category who are in the direct line of Promotion will not be eligible for consideration for appointment on deputation. Similarly, Deputationist shall not be eligible for consideration for appointment by promotion.

(Period of Deputation (ISTC) including period of Deputation (ISTC) in another ex-cadre post held immediately preceding this appointment in the same or some other Organization/Department of the Central Govt. shall ordinarily not to exceed five years. The maximum age limit for appointment by Deputation (ISTC) shall be not exceeding 56 years as on the closing date of receipt of applications).

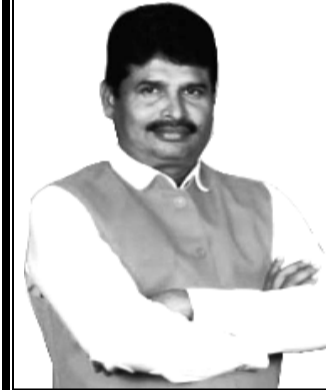
