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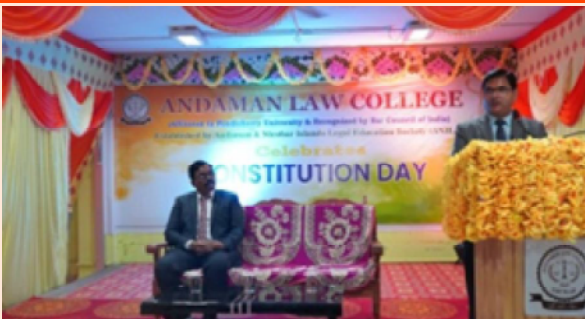

The ICAR-Krishi Vigyan Kendra, South Andaman, in association with ICAR-CIFA, Bhubaneswar, Odisha organized an Awareness-cum-Demonstration programme on the use of the CIFA-Brood-Vac vaccine in fish farming on Dec. 4 at ICAR-CIARI. The program was graced by Ms Jagtap Kalyani Rajendra, Director, Deptt. of Fisheries, Dr. Eaknath B. Chakurkar, Director, ICAR-CIARI, Dr. Mrinal Samanta, Head, Fish Health Management Division, ICAR-CIFA, Bhubaneswar, Dr. Y. Ramakrishna, Principal Scientist & Head, KVK, South Andaman, fish farmers, Scientists and others.

The objective of the programme was to educate Island farmers and hatchery owners



about the use of the CIFA-Brood-Vac vaccine in fish farming. Ms Jagtap Kalyani Rajendra, applauded the efforts of CIARI in organizing a programme which will significantly contribute in enhancing knowledge and practices among local farmers, leading to improved fish production and health. Dr Eaknath B. Chakurkar, highlighted about the way the vaccine will help and benefit the fish farming community of the Islands in disease management and

thereby enhancing their income. Dr. Mrinal Samanta, the person instrumental in developing the vaccine explained that the immunity-based vaccine is designed to enhance broadly acting innate immunity in spawns by transferring maternal immunity from brood fish, ultimately benefiting the aquaculture sector by improving fish health and productivity.

B Neelaiah achieves milestone at the 18th Asian Schools Chess Championship 2024

Arbiter (IA) Exam and achieved his first IA Norm. He further secured his second norm while officiating at the World Junior Chess Championship 2024 in Gujarat this June. His role in the ongoing Asian Schools Chess Championship will earn him his third IA Norm, propelling him closer to the coveted International Arbiter title, which requires five norms, a press release received from President, ANCA said.

Cyber Fraud Awareness: A Case of Matrimonial Scam and Financial Deception registered

In a recent case of cyber fraud reported by a resident of Andaman & Nicobar Islands, an alarming instance of financial deception has come to light. The victim, who had updated their profile on a Matrimonial website in November 2024, was contacted by an individual claiming to be from Sweden. Over time, they developed a close friendship and began communicating regularly via WhatsApp.

The individual, under the pretense of plans to settle in India and purchase property, informed the victim that they would be visiting India. On 1st December, 2024, the victim was informed that the individual had boarded a flight from Sweden. The following day, they received a call from an unknown number, allegedly from Delhi Airport, where the caller identified themselves as a Customs Officer. The caller claimed that the individual was detained for carrying foreign currency worth Rs. 1 crore and demanded an immediate penalty payment to release them.

Believing the fraudulent claims, the



victim transferred a total of Rs. 1,79,800 in multiple transactions. It was only later that they realized they had been deceived by a scammer. A complaint was subsequently filed with the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal (NCRP).

This case serves as a crucial reminder of the growing threat of cyber frauds, particularly matrimonial scams. The Cyber Crime Police Station urges the public to exercise caution when dealing with online contacts and to avoid transferring money to unknown individuals. It

is essential to verify any requests for money before taking action.
