The Ministry of Minority Affairs, Govt. of India launched the scheme namely Pradhan Mantri Jan Vikas Karyakaram (PMJK) by restructuring the erstwhile Multi-Sector Development Programme for creation of infrastructure facilities in sectors of Health, Education, Skill Development, Employment and such other projects for improving the socio-economic condition of Minority Communities living in Minority

Concentration Blocks (MCB). The Ministry of Minority Affairs has identified Tehsils of Mayabunder, Rangat, Ferrargunj, Car Nicobar and Nancowry as a Minority Concentration Blocks in the UT of Andaman and Nicobar Islands. In order to implement the PMJK scheme, the Ministry has approved

projects of different nature beneficial to the Islanders in different tehsils for which it has also released the funds. Under this, the construction of 46 Anganwadi Centres (AWCs) has been sanctioned by the Ministry for an amount of Rs. 11.37 crores and Rs. 5.25 was released as 1st installment. Out of

the 46 AWCs, the construction work has been completed in respect of five AWCs buildings and rest of the work is under progress. Similarly, the Ministry has sanctioned construction of a New Working Women's Hostel at Mithila Village, Rangat at an estimated cost of Rs. 865 lakh and has released

Rs. 432.67 lakhs as 1st installment. This Working Women's Hostel consists of 25 double occupancy rooms with attached toilet and kitchen, 35 bedded dormitory, office-cum-reception room, kitchen with dining hall, recreation hall, daycare room, common washrooms, parking area, quarters

for warden and caretaker with other security arrangements. The land for the same at Mithila village near Rangat town has been set apart by District Administration, North and Middle Andaman. The tender for the project is under finalization by Andaman Public Works Department, being the construction agency for the project. Apart from this, various other projects have also been sanctioned under this scheme, which include expansion of Working Women's Hostel at Car

New Delhi, Feb. 8 (PIB) Government has issued instructions to liberalise the income criteria for eligibility of a child/sibling of a deceased Government servant/pensioner for grant of family pension under CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972. The relaxation is granted for family pension to disabled survivors as they require greater medical care and financial assistance. The Government is of the view that the income criteria for eligibility for family pension, applicable in the case of other family members, may not be applied in the case of a child/sibling suffering from a disability. 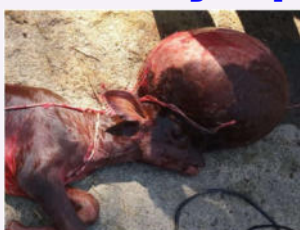

South Andaman District Police arrests two drug peddlers; seizes 1.510 kgs of ganja

Continuing its zero tolerance against the illegal trade of narcotic drugs in South Andaman District, the team of Police Station Chatham apprehended two drug peddlers and seized a total 1.510 kgs of 'Ganja' from them. On Feb. 5, acting on a credible information about two persons who might be in possession of contraband (Ganja) and will try to sell it to customers near new Vehicle Ferry Jetty, Chatham, a team was constituted comprising of SI Shubham Ghosh and

others under SI Gaurav Banerjee, SHO PS Chatham and sent to the spot. The team then successfully arrested two persons namely Naveen Ilavarsan, S/o Late. Nedunchezhiyan, (25) Yrs and Mathiraja, S/o Late Muthuramalingam, (23) Yrs, both R/o Anarkali and recovered 1.205 kgs of ganja from their possession. On their disclosure, some more (305 gms) of the contraband was recovered from their boat, M.L. Seven Star, which they had stationed at Junglighat Jetty. A case

under NDPS Act, 1985 was registered against the two accused persons and investigation of the case is under progress. The entire raid took place under the supervision of Shri Narra Chaitanya, SDPO South Andaman. Govt. relaxes norms for family pension ..

Government has, therefore, reviewed the income criteria for eligibility for family pension in respect of a child/sibling, suffering from a disability and has decided that the income criteria for eligibility for family pension to such children/siblings shall commensurate with the amount of the entitled family pension in their case.

Accordingly, Department of Pension & PW has issued instructions/orders on 08.02.2021 that a child/sibling of a deceased Government servant/pensioner, who is suffering from a mental or physical disability, shall be eligible for family pension for life, if his/her overall income, other than family pension, is less than the entitled family pension at ordinary rate i.e. 30% of the last pay drawn by the deceased Government servant/pensioner plus the Dearness Relief admissible thereon.

As per Rule 54(6) of the CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972, a child/sibling of a deceased Government servant or pensioner, suffering from a mental or physical disability, is eligible for family pension for life if he or she is suffering a disability which renders him unable to earn his livelihood. Presently, a member of the family, including a child/sibling suffering from a disability, is deemed to be earning his livelihood, if his/her income from sources other than family pension, is equal to or more than the minimum family pension i.e. 9000/- and the Dearness Relief admissible thereon.

In the case of a child/sibling, suffering from a mental or physical disability, who is presently not in receipt of a family pension due to non-fulfilment of the earlier income criteria, family pension shall be granted to him/her, if he/she fulfils the new income criteria and also fulfilled the other conditions for grant of family pension at the time of death of Government servant or pensioner or previous family pensioner. The financial benefits, in such cases, shall, however, accrue prospectively and no arrears for the period from the date of death of Government servant/pensioner/previous family pensioner shall be admissible.

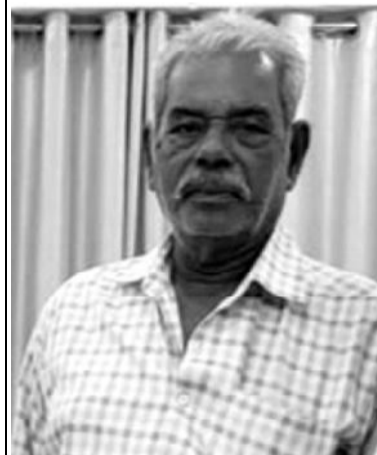

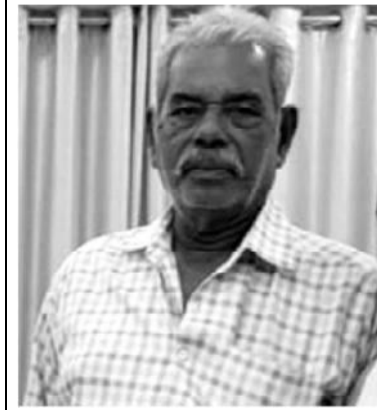

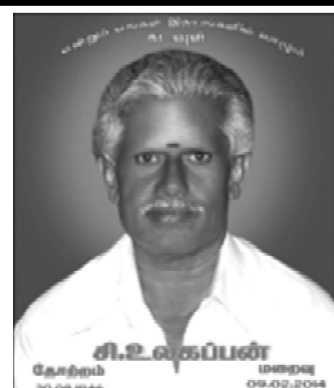
