

G7 calls for greater role for women in peace processes



New York, April 7 Foreign ministers from Group of Seven (G7) countries have called for a greater role for women in solving conflicts, saying that peace settlements with female involvement were more likely to endure. The world's seven most developed nations, G7 ministers, at their meeting in the northern French resort of Dinard to prepare a summit meeting

under French presidency in August, also called on greater mobilisation worldwide to prevent sexual and gender-based violence in conflict. According to the UN Women's agency, between 1990 and 2017, women constituted only two per cent of mediators, eight per cent of negotiators, and five per cent of witnesses and signatories in all major peace

process. France has placed gender inequality at the heart of its presidency of the G7, though a plan to create a new mechanism to warn about sexual violence being used as a weapon during the war was not included in a final joint statement. Foreign Minister Jean-Yves Le Drian said that the countries had agreed a roadmap to adopt the mechanism.

General Election-2019 IT Deptt. gears up to monitor election expenditure; operationalizes 24X7 Control Room to receive information

Port Blair, April, 7 The Income Tax Department is geared up for monitoring of Election Expenditure for the first phase of Lok Sabha Election to be held on April 11, 2019 for Andaman & Nicobar Islands Parliamentary Constituency. Briefing media person at Income Tax Office here today, the Deputy Commissioner (IT), Shri Narender Singh, who is also the Nodal Officer, Income Tax, informed that regular review meetings are being taken by Shri Ashish Verma, the Principal Director of Income Tax, Investigation, so that the task entrusted by the Election Commission of India to prevent the flow of Black Money in the election process is



properly carried out. For this purpose various steps have been taken, he said. The Nodal Officer stated that the Department has operationalized 24X7 Control Room to receive information about the flow of cash, which might be used in the election process. Two dedicated mobile numbers/whatsapp

6289702922 and 6289704146 are active, on which such information may be shared, he said stating that the identity of informer shall be kept confidential. The Department has also operationalized an Air Intelligence Unit at Port Blair Airport to keep a tab on flow of cash. Various Quick Response teams

have also been formed after requisitioning additional Inspectors from West Bengal, he said, mentioning that the Department is coordinating with the flying squad of the local Police. The Nodal Officer further said that the Income Tax Department is making regular contact with local banks

to attain information regarding withdrawal of cash which exceed a threshold limit, on which the IT Department takes necessary action. It also keeps in touch with the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) and DEOs of all Districts, Flying Squads and State Surveillance Teams and local Police as well to ensure timely coordinated action, he said.

Training programme and seminars have been organised to sensitize officers and officials of the Department about their roles and responsibilities in the election process. The trainings programmes were conducted by Shri Debashis Mazumder, Additional Director- Investigation, Kolkata, he added.

Traffic diversions made for smooth distribution & collection of election materials at Netaji Stadium & JNRM on April 10, 11 & 12

Port Blair, April 7 As part of the ensuing Lok Sabha Election, 2019 which will be held here in the A&N Islands on April 11, 2019, the A&N Police has made diversions for the smooth flow of vehicular traffic. According to a press release, all the vehicular traffic shall remain suspended in the stretches from Y-Narayan Junction, Dharamsala and Old Scout Hut to Netaji Stadium from 0500 hrs till the end of distribution of election materials from Netaji Stadium on April 10, 2019. No vehicle shall be allowed proceed towards Netaji Stadium from any side except election duty vehicles. Hockey India, on Sunday, named 60 players for the senior men's national camp, scheduled to begin on April 8 at the Sports Authority of India Centre in Bengaluru. The players have been selected based on their performance in the recent 9th Hockey India Senior Men National Championship 2019 A Division as well as their recent international performances which include the Indian junior men's team. In a big comeback, Harjeet Singh who had led the Indian team to win the 2016 Junior World Cup has been called after nearly a gap of one year. His junior compatriots Santa Singh, Vikramjit Singh, Dipsan Tirkey, Manpreet and Armaan Qureshi who were excluded from the previous national camp have been named in the list of 60 players. The list will be further pruned down to 33 core probables after a selection trial to be held on April 20. Wozniacki and Keys to meet for Charleston title

South Carolina, April 7
Former world number one Caroline Wozniacki maintained her dominance over Croatia's Petra Martic to move into the final of the Charleston Open where she will play Madison Keys. Dane Wozniacki, showing confidence after a recent illness, defeated Martic 6-3 6-4 before American Keys turned back Monica Puig 6-4 6-0 in a semi-final that was delayed for more than an hour by rain. "I'm just so thrilled to be healthy, that's the main thing," the fifth-seeded Wozniacki



said after making her first final of the year. "It's been a long time since I made this long run here," said the Dane who won the South Carolina tournament in 2011. The fifth seed broke Martic twice in the second set to claim the win and maintain her record of never having lost a set to Martic in six meetings. Wozniacki, world number 13, grabbed a 4-2 lead in the second set but the 16th-seeded Martic bounced back to level at 4-4 before the Dane broke back and closed out the match. Keys led 4-3 in the first set when rain halted her match with Puerto Rico's Puig.

Bayern demolish Dortmund 5-0 to reclaim Bundesliga top spot

Munich, April 7
Champions Bayern Munich dismantled Bundesliga title rivals Borussia Dortmund 5-0 on Saturday, scoring four goals in a flawless first half to reclaim top spot and get back on course for a record-extending seventh straight league crown. The Bavarians exploded into action and scored twice in the opening 17 minutes through Mats Hummels and Robert Lewandowski, adding two more from Javi Martinez and Serge Gnabry before the



interval. Lewandowski's strike meant the Polish forward became only the fifth player in Bundesliga history to reach the 200-goal mark and the first foreigner to do so. The hosts, who drew 1-1 at Freiburg last week, stepped off the gas after the break and controlled the game before Lewandowski scored again in the 89th minute and Bayern moved up to 64 points with six matches remaining, one point clear of Dortmund.

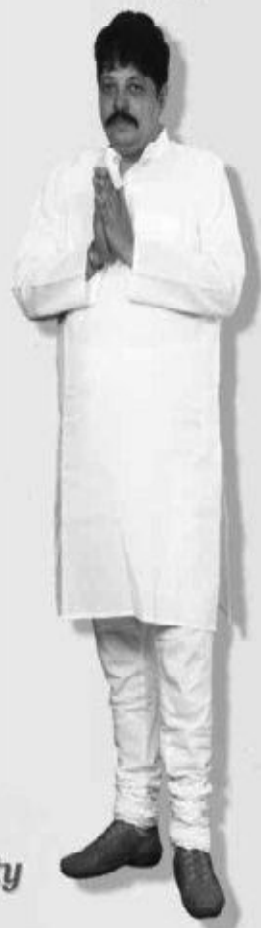

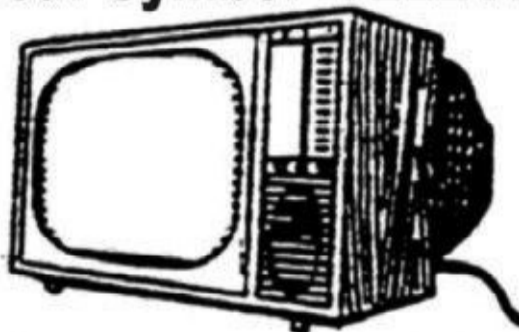

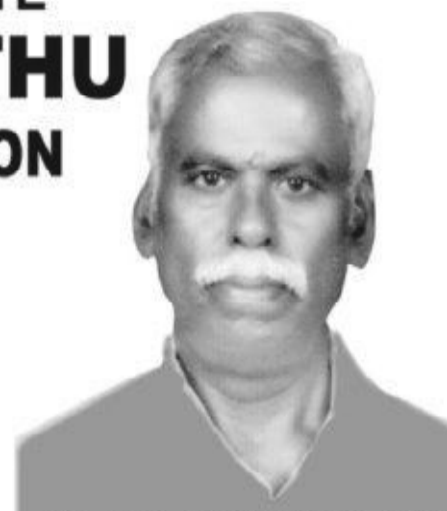
