With this death, the total number of death due to COVID during the second wave has gone upto 12. Media briefed on COVID-19 Ratio of high positive cases among Inter-Island movement passengers a matter of grave concern: Secretary (IP&T)

Port Blair, May 8

A total of 350 passengers arrived by flight today and during the Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) conducted on these passengers, only 3 passengers were found positive while the test conducted on 71 passengers bound for Middle & North Andaman, 8 were found positive. This shows that the number of positive cases among the passengers coming from mainland has decreased whereas the positive cases have



increased among those passengers today is said the Secretary (IP&T), Shri Sunil Kumar Singh while addressing media on COVID-19 in the conference hall of IP&T today. He said, this ratio of high positive cases in Inter-Island movement

Detection of COVID positive cases high among inter-island bound passengers

Data reveals 719 Inter-Island passengers and 233 incoming flight passengers detected positive since March 1

Port Blair, May 8

The Islands continues to witness rise in number of positive cases. It has been observed that cases detected among inter-island bound passengers outnumber the incoming flight passengers. Today's data reveals that out of the 350 flight passenger who were tested at ITF ground today (May 8), 3 were detected positive while out of the 71 inter-island bound passengers, 8 persons were found positive. This shows that we have been able to reduce the number of positive cases coming

the passengers moving between the islands are showing a rising trend which is a case of concern.

As per health data from the period of March 1, 2021 to May 8, 2021 during the second wave, the total positive cases so far detected in A&N Islands stood at 1321, out of which, 719 cases detected were of inter-island bound passengers. During the test conducted on incoming flight passengers from March 1, 2021 to May 8, 2021, the total number of positive cases detected was 233.

25th meeting of Group of Ministers on COVID-19 held Appeals to citizens to not skip 2nd dose of COVID Vaccine

New Delhi, May 8

Dr. Harsh Vardhan, Union Minister of Health & Family Welfare chaired the 25th meeting of the high-level Group of Ministers (GoM) on COVID-19 through video-

conference, here today. At the outset, Dr. Harsh Vardhan apprised other members of GOM about the steadily growing trajectory of daily recoveries. There are more than 3 lakh recoveries in the last 24

hours, he stated. He also observed that 180 districts have showed no fresh cases in the last 7 days, 18 districts in 14 days, 54 districts in 21 days and 32 districts were bereft of any fresh cases in the last 28 days.

As on date, 1.34% of the active caseload is in ICU, 0.39% of them are on ventilators and 3.70% of them are on oxygen support.

your life, your family members lives and the lives of others". He further urged the general public to report immediately, if they have any symptoms of COVID or even slight fever so that proper test can be done, if required and timely treatment can be started.

The Secretary said that since the start of the second wave of COVID-19, there is no decline in the number of COVID patients which are reported every day. With two COVID positive patients succumbing at G. B. Pant Hospital today, the number of deaths witnessed during the second wave of COVID has gone up to 12, so far in these Islands. He further stated that A&N Islands is one among the highest per capita COVID appropriate behavior violations in the country. This is a matter of great concern for the A&N Administration, the Secretary said adding that the Administration is taking stringent measures and prosecuted the violators but still the violations are going on despite repeated appeal to follow COVID appropriate behavior by every individual. Giving the data of challans made yesterday (May 7) against the violators of COVID appropriate behavior, the Secretary said, a total of 278 challans were imposed in a single day of which 183 challans were made in South Andaman, 53 in North & Middle Andaman and 38 in Nicobar District.

Expressing concern over non compliance of social distancing norms in some market places in the town area by the shop owners, the Secretary said, if such trend continues, then, the Administration will be left with no option but to go for further stricter measures in the coming days.

The Deputy Director, G.B. Pant Hospital, Shri Amitabha De said, a total of 12 COVID patients were discharged from G.B Pant Hospital and the number of corona positive patients at present admitted in the G. B Pant Hospital is 86. Out of the 86 patients, 43 are on oxygen support and two are on ventilator. He further said 1 patient was admitted at COVID Care Centres and 7 were discharged today and still 63 patients are remaining in the Centres. Regarding the availability of oxygen in A&N Islands, the Deputy Director said that at present, we have 250 oxygen concentrators and sufficient number of oxygen cylinders.

The Director, ANIMS, Dr. A. K. Mandal, the Director, IP&T, Shri Alok Kumar, the Deputy Director, IP, Shri R.S. Meena also attended the press conference.

Scientists of ZSI discovers new species of mammal from Narcondam Island



Port Blair, May 8

A team of Scientists and researchers from Zoological Survey of India, Andaman and Nicobar Regional Centre, Port Blair and Zoological Survey of India, Kolkata have recently discovered a new insectivorous species of mammal from India after 43 years. Dr. Chandrakasan Sivaperuman, Scientist-E & Officer-in-Charge, informed that this new species, *Crociduranarcondamica*, is reported from the Narcondam Island. The new white-toothed shrew species is named after the type locality, Narcondam Island regarded as a volcanic island situated in the Andaman and Nicobar Archipelago, India: *Narcondam Shrew Crociduranarcondamica*.

The new species, *Crociduranarcondamica* is of medium size (head and body lengths) and has a distinct external morphology (darker grey dense fur with a thick, darker tail) and craniodental characters (braincase is rounded and elevated with weak lambdaoidal ridges) in comparison to other close congeners. This is the first discovery of a shrew from this volcanic island and increases the number of White-toothed shrew (genus *Crocidura*) species in India from 11 to 12, and the first shrew species from Narcondam Island. These shrews, are small and mouse-like mammals and live in sub-leaf stratum in the forests. Insects are the primary diet of these animals. Thus, it is really important for organisms in the forest ecosystem for controlling the insects, a press release from (Scientist-E & Officer-in-Charge, ZSI)

On 5th May, a criminal case has been registered against KN Hotel, Haddo in PS Chatham for possessing and selling liquor without any authorization. 1 bottle and 6 quarters were recovered. On 6th May, 2021, PS Aberdeen recovered 30 quarters from a betel nut shop owner who wanted to take advantage of the situation and make hefty profit by selling liquor at exorbitant rates. On 7th May, 2021, 16 bottles were recovered from a bootlegger in PS Pahargaon.

that, "the cumulative number of COVID19 vaccine doses administered in the country has crossed 16.73 Cr today which includes nearly 23 lakh doses given yesterday. A total of 17,49,57,770 doses have been delivered to the States, out of which 16,65,49,583 doses have been consumed and 84,08,187 doses are still available with the States. He further added that a total of 53,25,000 doses are on the pipeline and will be supplied to the States soon.

Reiterating the importance of full protection through two COVID Vaccine doses, he again appealed to all citizens to get the second dose which boosts the immunity against COVID manifold. 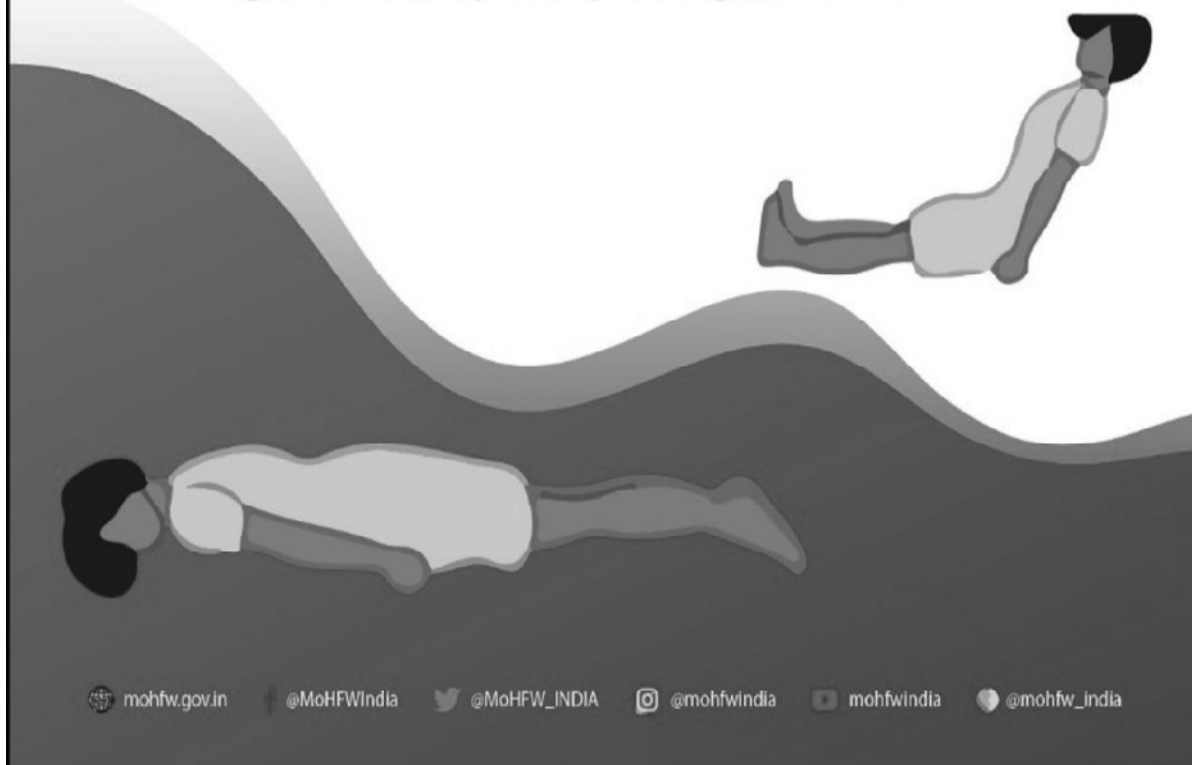

Proning for Self care

- PRONING is the process of turning a patient with precise, safe motions, from their back onto their abdomen (stomach), so the individual is lying face down.
- Proning is a medically accepted position to improve breathing comfort and oxygenation.
- It is extremely beneficial in COVID-19 patients with compromised breathing comfort, especially during home isolation.

WHEN do you prone?

Proning is required only when the patient feels difficulty breathing and SpO₂ has decreased below 94.

Positioning of the pillow during proning:

Avoid Proning in conditions like:

- Pregnancy
- Deep venous thrombosis (Treated in less than 48 hours)
- Major cardiac conditions
- Unstable spine, femur, or pelvic fractures

Non-self pronating patients (in emergency):

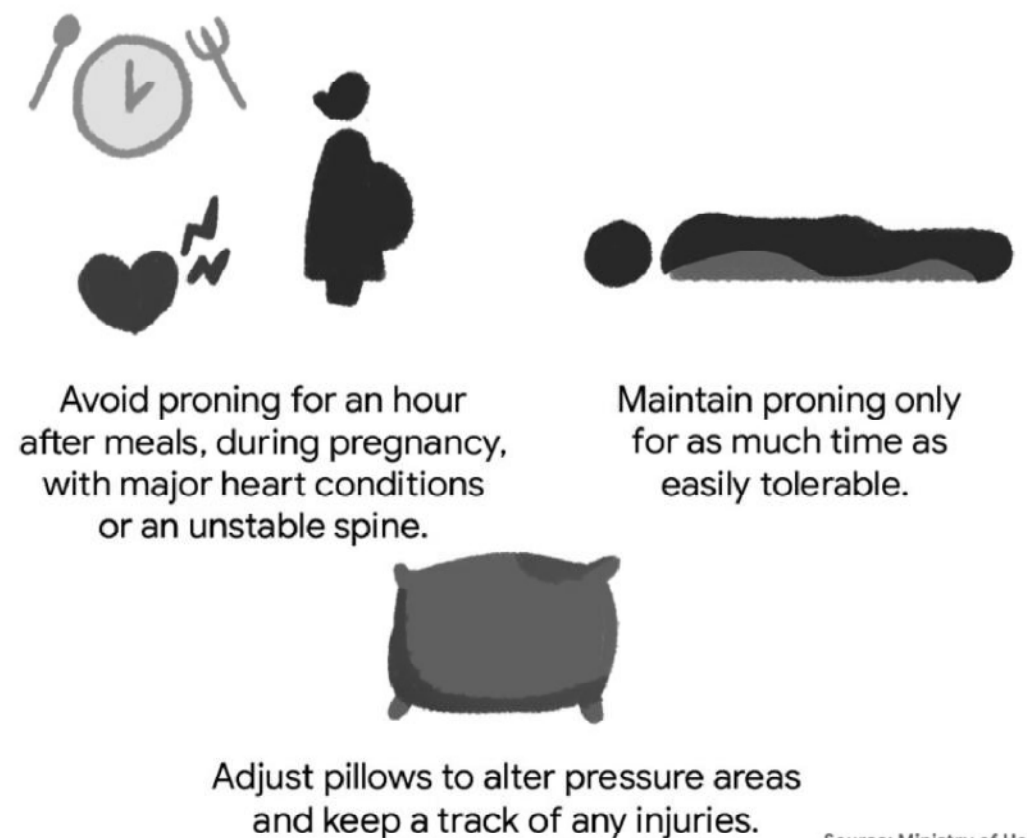
Five-step method to place a patient in the prone position using a regular bed, flat sheet, and family members

- Using a flat sheet, pull the patient to one side of the bed.
- Place the flat sheet around the arm that will pull through (the side you are turning toward).
- A second flat sheet is placed on the bed and tucked under the patient. This sheet will pull through as you are turning the patient.
- Using the sheet, turn the patient over and position the patient prone. The arm and sheet will pull across the bed.
- Pull and center the patient. Discard the sheet that was used to place the patient in the supine position. Straighten lines and tubes.

This may need modification with emerging evidence

For Self-Proning:

- You will need 4-5 Pillows.
- Regular alterations in lying position
- Best is to not spend more than 30 minutes in each position

1. 30 minutes – 2 hours: laying on your belly



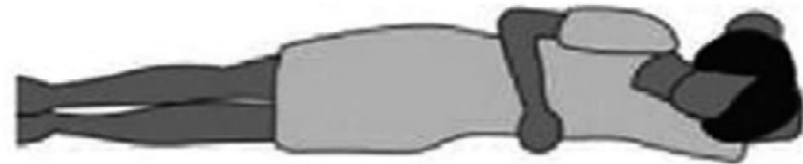
2. 30 minutes – 2 hours: laying on your right side



3. 30 minutes – 2 hours: sitting up



4. 30 minutes – 2 hours: lying on your left side



Then back to Position 1. Lying on your belly!



Self Positioning Guide

Caution:

- Avoid proning for an hour after meals
- Maintain proning for only as much times as easily tolerable
- One may prone for up to 16 hours a day, in multiple cycles, as felt comfortable
- Pillows may be adjusted slightly to alter pressure areas and for comfort
- Keep a track of any pressure sores or injuries, especially, around bony prominences

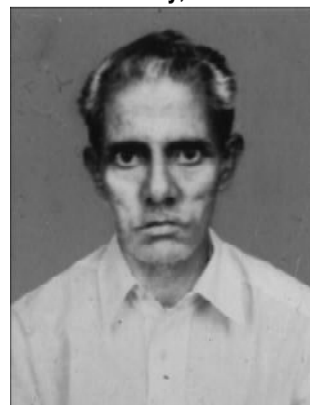
